Noting that one of the canceled checks on the account of BORSARI was for \$600.00 payable to Adamson Ford in Birmingham, he caused a check to be made with Adamson Ford thinking that the \$600.00 was downpayment of a car; but was informed that there was no record of a sale of a car to BORSARI.

Xerox copies of the canceled checks and signature card of BORSARI were furnished by Mr. DE BARDELEBEN and photographs of the checks were made and the film was sent to the FBI Laboratory by airtel. Teletype preceded airtel advising Bureau and Memphis of this additional information.

On 4/11/68 the artist's conceptions based on information from Memphis witnesses and the one based on information from Birmingham witnesses were exhibited to witnesses JOHN W. DE SHAZO, JOHN DENNIS HANNERS, DON WOODS, and U. L. BAKER. The following comments concerning these artists' conceptions were obtained and subsequently furnished telephonically 4/11/68 by SA ROBERT M. BARRETT to the Bureau Exhibits Section personnel at Memphis, who had prepared these drawings.

Witness JOHN DENNIS HANNERS stated the Memphis conception was unacceptable to him in every way. ted the Birmingham conception was the closest but that the hair at the crown of the head was thicker and wavier and the face was thiner, especially the jawbone area. HANNERS said the age depicted in the Birmingham conception was most accurate.

Witness DE SHAZO said that the hair portrayed in the Memphis conception was better than that in the Birmingham conception, in shade and in the way it was combed. He said, however, that the hair was too high on the head and the head was too round in the Memphis conception. Concerning the Birmingham conception, DE SHAZO said the head was too square. He stated the age portrayed in the Birmingham conception was good and that portrayed in the Memphis conception was too young. He said the complexion in the Birmingham conception should be lighter, such as that in the Memphis conception. He recalled that the tie portrayed in the Memphis conception was good in that the Unsub also had his tie askew at the time DE SHAZO observed him.

Witness DON WOODS stated the Memphis conception was entirely unacceptable to him. He said the age, the hair, eyes, and mouth on the Birmingham conception were very good, but that the face, especially the jaw area, should be narrower. He said the jaw area of the Unsub was similar to that of movie actor WARREN BEATTY. WOODS stated, however, there was something he could not pinpoint missing from the Birmingham conception.

Witness U. L. BAKER stated the Memphis conception was entirely unacceptable. He said the head in the Birmingham conception should be rounded, with a more receding hairline. He said the age in the Birmingham conception was good, but the eyes should be smaller and the face should be narrower in the lower part. BAKER then said, "I don't believe I could identify him again if he came into the store right now".







On 4/8/68, Rev. HASTY KIM YOW, JR., a Negro resident of Bessemer, Alabama, at 3326 10th Avenue, North, phone 428-0617, telephonically contacted the Birmingham Office at 8:40 A.M., and reported as follows:

A few minutes prior to his call, he had been standing in front of the Bright Star Cafe on 19th Street in Bessemer when he noticed a yellow cab from Birmingham discharge a passenger who was carrying a blue suitcase and who shook hands with several white men standing in front of the cafe. He stated that he believed the profile of that individual resembled the artist sketch which had originated from Memphis of the unknown subject depicting a rather long nose. He stated that he followed the unknown white male from the Bright Star Cafe a distance of several blocks to his apparent residence at 1903 Berkley Avenue, Bessemer, which appeared to be a residence converted into four apartments.

A short time later, interview was had with WARREN A. SIMMONS, 1903 Berkley Avenue, which is the left downstairs apartment, in the presence of his wife, CORA J. SIMMONS. The above individual was eliminated as a possible suspect from personal observation during interview and related that his father, JAMES MARION SIMMONS, had died at Miami, Oklahoma, on 3/31/68 and that he had traveled to Miami, Oklahoma, for the funeral, having left Birmingham at 6:00 P.M., 4/1/68, by Trailway Bus and had returned to the Greyhound Bus station at Birmingham at 7:30 A.M., on the date of interview, 4/8/68. He stated that he thought ROBERT M. SHELTON was in town; however, he was not positive.

On 4/5/68, BH 418-R advised that he was in West Monroe, Louisiana, attending a Klavern meeting at 7:30 P.M., on 4/4/68. He returned to Tuscaloosa, Alabama, early on 4/5/68. He stated that he thought ROBERT M. SHELTON and MELVIN SEXTON were in Tuscaloosa on 4/4/68; however, he would check and advise later.

On 4/8/68, BH 418-R advised that he had discreetly inquired and that ROBERT M. SHELTON and MELVIN SEXTON both advised that they were in Tuscaloosa all day on 4/4/68. He stated that there was no indication that the Klan knew anything about the shooting and no information available that anyone had contacted the National Office for any kind of help. He advised that SHELTON indicated that he thought the shooting was the worse thing that could have happened as far as the Klan and southeners were concerned.

On 4/8/68, BH 423-R advised that ROBERT M. SHELTON was with him working in the Klan Press Office
