



Mr. CHARLES HILTON, telephone 486-3926, an official at Haleyville Textile Mill, Haleyville, Alabama, was questioned under suitable pretext and advised as follows on 4/11/68:

A telephone call was received at his residence in the fall of 1967, about October, from Mr. HILTON's wife's brother, LOWELL WIGGINS, address unknown, Birmingham, Alabama. Mr. HILTON said he also received calls at his home from dye salesmen and one of them could have contacted him from Birmingham in the fall of 1967. HILTON was questioned about names other than and as well as the name GALT and advised he has never known of anyone named GALT. Mr. HILTON is also a reputable farmer in the Haleyville community and seemed straightforward in his answers.
