AS OF EVENING APRIL TWENTY THREE STEIN, WHO HAS BEEN INTERVIEWED BY LOMAX DURING PAST SEVERAL DAYS, HAD NOT HAD AN OFFER OF RETRACING THE TRIP TO NEW ORLEANS. STEIN THE MORNING OF APRIL TWENTY FOUR ADVISES HE HAD A DEAL COOKING WITH LOMAX AND MET WITH LOMAX AT NOON TODAY. STEIN ADVISES AS A RESULT OF THIS MEETING, LOMAX DESIRES HIM TO BEGIN A TRIP TO HOUSTON TONIGHT END PAGE TWO

NOW WHETHER OR NOT CLOTHER HAD ACTUALLY BEEN DELIVERED. STEIN
A DVISED HE ALSO TOOK PACKAGE OF CLOTHES WITH HIM IN DECEMBER
SIXTY SEVEN WHEN HE MADE THE TRIP TO NEW ORLEANS WITH RAY. THESE
CLOTHES WERE ALSO FOR MARIE MARTIN'S DAUGHTER MARION.

IT WAS ASCERTAINED FROM MARIE MARTIN THAT AT ABOUT THE TIME SHE TRADED TV SETS WITH RAY, SHE HAD GIVEN HIM A BOX OF RECORDS AND WEARING APPAREL TO BE DELIVERED TO HER DAUGHTER, CARE OF HER MOTHER, LORRAINE CALLAWAY, SIX ZERO NINE BARTHOLOMEW, NEW ORLEANS. SHE ADVISED SHE DID NOT RECALL THIS UNTIL LAST NIGHT WHEN TALKING END PAGE FIVE

PERSONNEL OF THE RABBIT'S FOOT BAR ADVISED JERI ENTIRELY UNKNOWN TO THEM, AND THAT LOMAX WAS IN BAR EVENING APRIL TWENTY THREE ATTEMPTING TO FIND SOMEONE WHO KNEW SOMETHING ABOUT GIRL NAMED JERI. THEY ADVISED HE WAS APPARENTLY UNSUCCESSFUL. PERSONNEL OF SULTAN ROOM CLAIM NO ONE NAMED JERI IS KNOWN TO THEM, BUT THAT THEY HAVE HEARD LOMAX MAKING INQUIRIES CONCERNING GIRL OF THAT NAME. 





Dear Sir:

I hate to be thought a quack, but I cannot get a very disturbing similarity of events which might relate to the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. out of my mind, and so, at whatever risk, I am impelled to write you.

I publish the above-maned Poll monthly and the Tribune, a little' magazine when I can; but I covered the funeral of Dr. King for a newspaper, The Post, published at 2973 Sacramento st., Berkeley, Calif. 94705, a Negro weekly. I also serve The Post at present as a consultant, or contributing editor, in its efforts to build up its editorial content.

I just returned last night from Berkeley and after being away almost all week, what with the funeral, have just caught up on the daily papers; and I was struck by the similarity of reported activities of the suspected killer and a fictional killer I created in an umpublished book, "The Ten Most Wanted White Mon". As the title would suggest, this man, who is sort of deranged by frustration over the continued humiliation of Negroes by the nonviolent movement and the continued violation of them by Deep South racists, picks out the ten racists from whose deaths he thinks the Negro would most benefit and goes out and kills them.

I published the first five chapters in the Tribune. I am a former weekly newspaper publisher for 19 years of the Los Angeles Tribune, and I began the Tribune out of frustration while living in Tuskegee, Ala. in 1964-65. I started the Tribune, as a 'little magazine', as the Tuskegee Tribune, a mimeographed newspaper, and a large number of whites of the town, who were described by knowledgable Negroes of the town as "members of the White Citizens Council" and Kluxer-types, subscribed.

I have as many subscribers among Alabamians whom I know or suppose to be white, as I do among Negroes — not that there are many of either.

and I left Tuskegee in February of 1965 and returned to Los Angeles.

I have continued to send the Tribune to my southern subscribers, including the whites, whenever I have brought it out.

Beginning with the 14th number in March of 1965, I serialized "The Ten Most Wanted White Men", and continued into the fifth chapter before I got a contract for the book from Houghton-Mifflin Co. Other than in the first chapter where my here, or anti-here, conceived his plan as a way out of his frustration and lists his intended victims, I didn't in the serialization give away his plans or modus operandi. However, the idea was there.

Also, the entire book of 36 years has been read by Hougton Mifflin, which eventually decided not to publish it, on the grounds that the anti-hero was not believable, and by Globe Press, which rejected it, too. The first ten chapters were read, and rejected, last Summer by Harper & Row and have since been at Random House, along with the book's summary.

I hope you will not feel that I am suggesting that any of the readers of this book would be so insane as to assassinate Dr. King. However, the coincidence of your suspect apparently having abandoned a car in Atlanta, just walked away from it; belonging to the seaman's union in Mobile; renting the room in the rundown rooming house, and the actions of my anti-hero, or killer, is so striking that I hope it excuses this long and detailed letter. Perhaps it is my imagination, but the personality, the stride, etc., suggested by the newspaper stories suggest my Josiah Herron, who likes to think of himself as "the Bronze Bomber", a sort of avenger of Negroes.

There is further the fact that while I was in Atlanta, I heard many people in the crowd cutside the church and along the march say they feared, or had heard, that Rev. Abernathy, Stokely Carmichael, Congressman Adam Powell, and other Negro leaders were going to be "gotten". Some few people said they thought the killer might be standing on the sidewalk along the line of march.

I also heard that Negro extremists in Atlanta were planning to burn and blow up businesses, specifically Sears and others along Gordon Road, which is just above the Capitol Hemes Housing Project where the car was parked in Atlanta. I lived from September 1 to Oct. 29, of 1965 in Atlanta and have a son in college there, though he is not an extremist or racist, and so have many leads there. I thought it notable that there was no mention of harming the housing project, even though many of the whites living there are openly hostile to Negroes passing there en route to shop on Gordon Road.

None of this may be of any value. However, I felt I had to relay it. Now that Mrs. King and Rev. Abernathy have resolved to continue the march to Washington, the same person or persons who were sufficiently exercised by distress as to kill Dr. King may attempt to harm them; and I felt that if I knew anything which might remotely help solve the murder, I should relay it.

I do not keep the world's best records; but if you should like to look at my Alabama mailing list, I could type the names and addresses off the cards and send them to you. I think there are a couple in Birmingham.

My book is pretty much in disarray; one gets discouraged after three years. But if looking at it would shed any light, I thingk I could shuffle the chapters together. However, as you can see, I am wordy. It's about 400,000 words.

I will be at The Post Thursday and Friday, I think; but the address and phone number on the latterhead are my residence, where I do my other work.

I wish you the vory best of luck in your investigation.





On 4/23/68:
The Tollowing investigation was conducted by SA FLOYD I, CLARKE in efforts to determine the whereabouts of EDWARD UHLAN HILL during period of assassination.

Patrolman JIM WORD, Piedmont Police Department, Piedmont, Alabama, advised his records indicated that EDWARD UHIAN WILL was booked into the Piedmont City Jail in the early morning hours of 1/8/68 for the charge of Assault with the Intent to Murder with a shotgun. WORD stated that he believed HILL had previously been employed at Marvel Quilting Company, Piedmont, Alabama.

MARTIN OLTSIK, New York Representative, Marvel Quilting Company, Piedmont, Alabama, advised that EDWARD HILL was previously employed by that firm, but his employment was short lived due to a knifing incident wherein, HILL was wounded and he has not been back to work since. OLTSIK stated he did not know the exact times or dates of HILL's employment and that the company records are maintained in their main office in New York, but he would obtain this information from his main office and furnish it to this Agent.

EDWARD UHLAN HILL was located at the residence of JEANETTE SMITH, Piedmont, Alabama, where he stated he had been living while in the Piedmont area. HILL advised he had been in Piedmont approximately six weeks. HILL stated he came to Piedmont after being released from jail in Birmingham, and prior to that he was in jail in Atlanta. While in Piedmont HILL said he worked for Marvel Quilting Company until he was cut in a fight in Piedmont on 4/8/68, and he had been living with JEANETTE and JAMES MARION SMITH.

HILL stated he has never belonged to the Ku Klux Klan, but that he had been approached by Klan members to join but he has always turned the offers down. He said he received training in the handling of explosives while in the Army and while serving on a chain gang he handled explosives in blasting rock.

HILL also advised that he had not been approached by anyone to handle any kind of a job involving explosives, but if he ever was he would work by himself and he would not join an organization such as the Klan.

HILL stated he did not have any knowledge concerning the assassination of KING. He did state however, that he used to be an informant for the ATU and he feels that might have been the reason he was knifed. He said he would be willing to work with the FBI but he was not sure how long he would be in the area.

JAMES MARION SMITH advised that ED HILL had been living with him in Piedmont approximately six weeks to two months and that he has been in the Piedmont area during this time. SMITH stated HILL worked for Marvel Quilting Company prior to the knifing incident which occurred about two weeks ago, and since then has been at his house in Piedmont.


