

Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery.

Possessing an arrest record dating back to 1949, Ray has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders.

A 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on Ray is approximately 5'10" tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes noticeably.

In September, 1966, while serving the sentence, he was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri. He was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary since April 23, 1967.

Ray, who has an arrest record dating back to 1949 and has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders, has also been confined in the Los Angeles County Jail, the Joliet and Pontiac, Illinois, State Prisons and the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas.

He served in the Army between February, 1946, and December, 1948, received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest and was given a General Discharge due to ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service.

Ray is a 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on He is approximately 5'10" inches tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair which he has worn cut short. He has a small scar on the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand. He has been described as having a straight, narrow nose and straight and even teeth and to have a nervous habit of occasionally tugging at an ear lobe. His left ear protrudes noticeably.

Acquaintances describe him as a "loner" and "drifter" whose language and diction reflect a "rural" quality and indicate he has had limited education.

He is reportedly a fan of western and country music, drinks vodka and beer, dresses neatly and claims past employment as a merchant seaman and cook on Mississippi River vessels. He is known to have worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

He is known as an avid dancer who has taken dancing lessons.

He also completed a course at a school of bartending in the Los Angeles area early in 1968.

Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous.

He said he would not divulge this information to the agents since he desired to let this fellow have a good night's sleep.

At this point, in view of his drunken condition, the individual who identified himself as ROBERT ALLEN WESTER, JR., was instructed to contact the agents the following morning when he would be in a sober condition and in a position to discuss this matter thoroughly.

WEBSTER claimed to have been a salesman, and stated he was presently employed as a taxi cab driver for the Yellow Cab Company and presently residing in Room 214, Arden Hotel, Birmingham.

On the following day, agents contacted ROBERT ALLEN WEBSTER, JR., in Room 214, Arden Hotel, Birmingham, at which time he apologized to the agents for having caused the inconvenience the prior evening, and stated he could furnish no





The following investigation was conducted by SA's NEIL G. MARTIN and RICHARD D. SCHWEIN:

On 4/20/68, Dr. DAVID R. ARROWSMITH, Veterans Administration Hospital, advised that CALVIN WATSON is a patient under his care in Room 89, 5th Floor North, who has been confined for ten days due to a slight heart attack. Dr. ARROWSMITH stated that it would be possible for Agents to interview Mr. WATSON without fear of any physical damage or injury resulting from an interview.

On 4/20/68, CALVIN W. WATSON, 101 North 10th Court, Birmingham, Alabama, advised that he feels that he has information concerning the assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR, because he believes he was employed in approximately 1954 with an individual who resembles the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY. Mr. WATSON stated he was employed as a nurses aid for the Veterans Administration Hospital in Birmingham, Alabama, in the Spring of 1954, and at that time was in a new employee's orientation class with a white male, age 20-27, name unknown, who resembled RAY. He advised that this person stated he had been previously employed as an embalmer for the National Funeral Home on Peabody Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee, and that he was from Mississippi. WATSON advised that through his discussions with this individual, he ascertained that this man had been in the U. S. Army, and had expressed a sincere and vehement dislike for members of the Negro race. Mr. WATSON related that he was employed as a nurses aid at the Veterans Administration Hospital for approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ years, but believes that this individual remained for a much shorter period.

SALEM RICHEY, 5117 8th Terrace South, Birmingham, Alabama, advised on 4/22/68, that he is the manager of Kelly's Jet Hamburgers on 1st Avenue North, and that he employed one ROBERT EARL RAY as a cook for approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 years until the Summer of 1967, when he released him for failing to report to work. Mr. RICHEY, upon viewing a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, advised that this does not resemble ROBERT EARL RAY or his brother, JAMES RAY.

This draft clearedd through Bank of Greece and was paid 9/27/67 by the New York City Bank.

He also reported that Gen. MATTHEWS, who is Manager of the Bessemer Branch of First National Bank, while not finding anything for ERIC S. GALT, did point out that two New York drafts were purchased on 8/24/67 by an unknown individual, that is, not known to banking officials, having the name J. V. WATKINS, had purchased two \$400 drafts that date, and thought this might be of some significance since the man was a stranger to them.

MISCELLA NEOUS

In an effort to identify source of funds that would account for \$20 bills being spent by him which might have come from Workmen's Compensation or some other source, Mr. STERLING B. WILLIAMS, Regional Director, Wages and Hours and Public Contracts Division, Birmingham, was contacted on 4/10/68. He caused a check to be made in all of his field offices in the four-state area of Arkansas, Louisiana, Alabama, and Mississippi, without finding any record of ERIC S. GALT.

Mr. NORMAN WINSTON, Solicitor's Office, Wage and Hours and Public Contracts Division, U. S. Labor Department, was unable to furnish any positive information when contacted on 4/10/68.

Mr. FLOYD E. ROBERTSON, Fraud Investigation Supervisor, Unemployment Compensation Agency, State of Alabama, 8th Avenue North, Birmingham, on 4/10/68 caused a check to be made of his records in the different categories under Stevedores, Longshoremen, Warehousemen, and related industries connected with shipping and found nothing on ERIC S. GALT. He stated such a check should be made through state office and particularly the Mobile Office since the latter would have more contact with the shipping industries.

BH 410-PC was contacted on 4/9/68. He could not suggest anyone the artist's sketch looked like, except he might be the person who had caused trouble to HELEN PEARSON in the past, a girl that he knows, as this person fits the description.

HELEN PEARSON was contacted at her place of employment, Domino Lounge, Homewood, on 4/9/68. She said the artist's sketch is not that of the person who roughed her up in her apartment sometime ago. Her home address is 915 South 16th Street, and the person who had caused her trouble is named BUBBY YANCEY.
