BAKER, PETER CHERPES, WILLIAM DAVID PAISLEY, JR., and HERBERT KELLY on 4/26/68. DE SHAZO stated he thought the photo was a good likeness of subject and HANNERS said it looked "something like" subject, especially the hairline. The remaining witnesses each stated they did not believe this was the subject, and could not identify him from this photo.

These same witnesses were shown the 1966 Missouri prison photo of the subject, and all agreed this was a poor photo of the subject as they each did not remember him being that thin in the face.

Each witness to date has stated the best likeness of the subject is the 1960 Missouri prison profile photo, if hair was added.

PAUL ALVIN LAIL was informed of the identities of the interviewing agents and the nature of this interview.

LAIL advised he is presently living at 34 Barbados Drive, Palm Springs, with his wife BETTY and Tive month old baby.

LAIL stated he had been an inmate in the Missouri State Penitentiary for three years and while confined there he had met and known JAMES EARL RAY. He stated he was not very close or friendly with RAY but he did eat with him a number of times when he was in the kitchen visiting with his friend, LEWIE "WHITEY" DOWDA. He said he also watched a number of ball games and television programs with RAY.

LAIL described RAY as being a guy who knew his way around but was not one of the wheels or leaders in prison; that RAY was a sharp intelligent guy who hung around with the boys who were always up to something and were in on all of the deals. LAIL advised RAY never seemed to have a lot of money but always seemed to have enough to get whatever he wanted.

LAIL said most of the guys (he cannot recall their names) that he, RAY, was with most of the time were on dope and were peddling it.

LAIL continued by saying that RAY's big buddy was NEAL ABBEY who was a "big wheel" and the guy who ran the prison kitchen with "an iron hand." LAIL stated ABBEY was the guy who got RAY into the kitchen which was a good deal (job).

LAIL advised that LEO BARNETT handled dope and peddled it in the Missouri State Penitentiary and he believes he is now in prison somewhere in Florida. He said that BARNETT would know for certain if RAY had been on dope and where and who he got the dope sample.

LAIL further advised that FRED MILLER, "a cut and dried con," who worked in the tag plant of the prison, was one of the leaders and knew RAY well and he might be able to furnish information about him if he would talk to the FBI.

LAIL related that WHITEY DOWDA also knew RAY pretty well and would know more about him than he did since they both worked in the kitchen together for quite a while. He said WHITEY had been living in Merietta, Georgia, and he recently heard that WHITEY is now in jail in Merietta on a robbery charge.

LAIL stated there had been trouble with some of the Negro prisoners in the Missouri State Penitentiary who were Black Muslims so some of the prisoners decided, to teach them a lesson and three or four of the Negro leaders were killed. LAIL stated he did not know if RAY was in on the actual killing, but he was close with the ones that did it and therefore could have been in on the killing or at least he knew who did kill the Negroes.

LAIL would not make any further statements about the killing of the Negroes in the Missouri State Penitentiary and he stated he could not furnish any names or identities but he did say there were ten innates who were in on the killing of the Negroes.

LAIL said he could not recall RAY saying too much about Negroes and he does not believe from his conversations with RAY that he, RAY, was a racist, however, all of the immates in the Missouri State Penitentiary did not like the Negroes because of their belligerent attitude and animosity toward the white inmates.

LAIL stated RAY liked to wear his bair short in the summer months and long in the winter. He said RAY used to have a "butch" but in the summer months.

LAIL stated from his association with RAY that he felt RAY would have a .45 automatic "stashed" on his person somewhere and he would not give up or be taken without a fight. LAIL said RAY is a "killer" in his opinion and that RAY would not by easy to catch or find. LAIL said RAY is "a city boy" and he does not figure him to be hiding out in the country. However, LAIL stated he would not figure RAY would hide out in a really big city like New York, but would pick one about the size of Houston, Texas.

LAIL said he could not recall RAY telling him or mentioning any place in particular he, RAY, always wanted to go to or visit, but he felt RAY would be in a warm climate rather than a cold one.

LAIL stated he had not been contacted or heard from RAY since he got out of the Missouri State Penitentiary over two years ago and to the best of his knowledge RAY would not know where or how to contact him.

LAIL advised he had visited WHITEY DOWDA in March, 1968, in WHITEY's home in Merietta, Georgia, for a few days. He said that WHITEY is his best friend.

LAIL continued by saying he recognized the name of SCHAFFER and he thinks SCHAFFER was a captain in the prison guard force, but he did not know him and/or if SCHAFFER peddled dope in the pen.

LAIL stated he felt that there was a possibility RAY's escape was engineered by and assisted by outside help but he did not have any knowledge about it. Also he stated just about anything is possible with outside help and money, however, escape from the Missouri State Penitentiary is something else and is just about impossible in his opinion.

LAIL stated he did not feel badly about MARTIN LUTHER KING getting killed, but he was sorry it happened in Memphis, Tennessee, and he would have rather seen KING killed in some Northern city. LAIL said he is a Southerner and his feelings are Southern.

LAIL stated that he is of course interested in the reward money and he could certainly use it. However, he said he really does not know if he would turn RAY in or not for the reward money if he had the opportunity. LAIL stated he was certain RAY did the killing of KING himself and not involved with anyone else. LAIL stated that he wanted to be honest with the FBI and he would have to think about this a couple of days as to whether or not he would or would not turn RAY in if he knew his possible or current whereabouts.

LAIL stated he really does not know where RAY is and he said that RAY had not contacted him and he had not seen RAY for over two years.

LAIL continued by saying he was a little surprised when he learned from the newspaper and tele-vision that RAY had been identified as KING's killer because he always figured RAY as being a guy that would be too smart to leave any clues or widence around so that the police or the FBI would be able to trace and/or identify him.

LAIL examined the photographs of RAY and said he would never recognize him with the tuxedo and bow tie outfit on and further he said he never saw RAY with his hair long as it is either. However, he said the guy with the bow tie and tuxedo on is RAY.

LAIL said after thinking it over that he is very interested in the money and if he thinks of anything or comes up with anything concerning RAY, he will contact either Special Agent PATRICK A. PHILBIN or ROBERT W. WISEMAN.

LAIL is a white male, born Marion, North Carolina, 175 pounds, blue eyes, red hair, medium: slender build, 6' 3", wife BETTY, and resides 34 Barbados Drive, Palm Springs, Florida.

WEST, a native of Birmingham, Alabama, owns a home there at 3514 7th Avenue South, which he rents to R. T. CAMERON. This property has been managed for him by a cousin, GENEVA HARDEMON, 219 67th Street, who also operates a beauty school under her own name.

After visiting his son at Forrest Park, Georgia, Mr. WEST arrived in Brimingham and checked into the Bama Motel, 6712 First Avenue North, shortly after noon on 4/4/68. He remained there until 4/9/68 or 4/10/68 when he left to return to Dayton, Ohio where he is employed as a photo engraver by the McCall Corporation.

WEST had traveled to Birmingham to remove certain personal property from the home he owns there and through attorney J. CARTER MC FERRIN to initiate eviction proceedings against his tenant.

WEST who made the trip alone took with him in his automobile a .44 caliber Marlin carbine which he inadvertently left in his room at the Bama Motel. On the day he checked out of the Motel he discovered after traveling some distance that he had left the carbine in his motel room, and he stopped at a pay phone from which he contacted a man at the motel who informed him that they had the rifle. WEST told him to give the rifle to his cousin, GENEVA HARDEMON, above, who would ship it to him. 

CHARLES R. MASHEURN, Route 1, Owens Cross Roads, was located on 4/30/68, and interviewed by the writer. MASHBURN advised he was sentenced from Portageville, Mo., to the best of his recollection, in 1961. He received two four-year sentences to run consecutively. He was released in July of 1965, on parole to Alabama.

MASHBURN advised that the name JAMES EARL RAY sounds vaguely familiar to him and he believes that he had heard that name while in prison at Jefferson City, but he does not know him. After being shown a photograph of RAY, MASHBURN advised that the photograph also looks vaguely familiar, but he could not definitely say that he recalls it from his prison time. He said a good possibility exists that the familiarity of the picture and the name could be caused by the recent publicity which RAY has been given.

MASHBURN advised that in 1963, he was sent to the prison farm known as Renze Farm and remained at the farm until hewas paroled. He is positive that RAY was not at the farm. MASHBURN also stated he is positive that RAY was not in his particular cell block at the main prison because he knew the prisoners in his own cell block. He said there were three different cell blocks and that the only time the prisoners from the three cell blocks were together was on Sunday when they were all in the yard at the same time.

Concerning dope at the prison, MASHBURN said that he personally did not use any, even while he was in prison, and has no personal knowledge of any traffic in dope; however, he does know dope and narcotics were available and he knows that one guard whose nickname was "PADDLE FOOT" was fired, prior to 1963 when MASHBURN was sent to the prison farm, for "fooling with dope." 


