NEW YORK, NEWARK, AND PHILADELPHIA ARE REQUESTED TO FURNISH THIS OFFICE WITH ANY INFORMATION THEY HAVE WHICH WOULD PERMIT THIS OFFICE TO MAKE A DETERMINATION OF RUSSELL'S RELIABILITY AND CREDIBILITY.

Mrs. LEE MABER, Office Manager, Dale Carnegie and Associates, Inc., International Exporters, 1475 Franklin Ave., Garden City, NY, advised that above organization has 74 domestic and 20 overseas franchises. Each franchise covers a designated area and each franchise holder has agreements with as many sponsors as he desires. Sponsors are promoters who establish and promote the schools and arrange for lecturers. The sponsors submit rosters of students to the franchise holder, who in turn submits copies of student rosters to international office.

Mrs. MABER stated that students throughout the US and overseas amount to over 90,000 per year. Student rosters submitted to international office are not alphabetized and to cover pertinent period, approximately 140,000 names would have to be checked to determine if subject, under true name or aliases, had been enrolled. It is estimated that it would take approximately 15 agent days work to check aforementioned records.

She advised that his position aboard ship is and has been chief cook. She advised their records reflect his work is listed as excellent, sobriety excellent, dependability excellent.

Mrs. HALE stated that R. W. STEVENS was on a layoff status from 11/10/67 until he was recalled on 3/18/68. She advised that records reflect that he reported to the Edward S. Kendrick at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on 3/30/68. She advised that this is the town where R. W. STEVENS had received his layoff notice on 11/10/67. She stated that the Edward S. Kendrick sailed from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on Sunday, 4/7 in the p.m., and its first port of call was South Chicago, Illinois, second port of call Silver Bay, Minnesota, to pick up ore and then it returned to Cleveland.

It is noted that records of Wilson Marine failed to reflect whereabouts of ROSS WESLEY STEVENS for the early part of March as requested in above-referenced airtel and Wilson Line records contain no information as to the whereabouts or activities of STEVENS from the time of his layoff on 11/10/67 until he returned aboard ship on 3/30/68.

Sergeant ANDREW GRIMES, Fairfax, California Police Department, advised that BRUCE IRWIN GOVERN, age 23, and THOMAS RAYMOND ELLIS, age 18, were arrested on May 19, 1968, in a stolen Volkswagen. Sergeant GRIMES advised after the arrest, GOVERN was searched. GRIMES stated a hand-printed document consisting of four pages was found among GOVERN's personal effects and when it was read, noted it referred to Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. GRIMES said the letter was rambling and did not make much sense but did contain telephone numbers which might possibly relate to this case.

Sergeant GRIMES furnished this four-page document which actually consists of two sheets of paper with hand-printing on both sides. This letter will comprise the next four pages of this airtel.

BRUCE IRWIN GOVERN was interviewed at the Marin County Jail on May 20, 1968. GOVERN stated that the letter set out above was given to him by an inmate while he was confined either at the San Francisco County Jail or the San Francisco City Jail. He stated the letter was given to him about three weeks ago by a young inmate known to him only as TOM. He said he had not known TOM before, did not know why he was then in jail, and knew nothing about his background. GOVERN stated he was still in the San Francisco Jail when TOM was released on bail and that he has not seen or heard from TOM since. GOVERN stated following his release from jail he obtained certain telephone numbers listed in the letter by calling the Information Operator.

The files of the San Francisco Office indicate that GOVERN is the subject of San Francisco file 25-67044. This file indicates that GOVERN's Selective Service Number is 33-46-45-23 and that he was declared delinquent by his draft board for failure to report for induction on September 8, 1965. GOVERN was arrested by Agents of the San Francisco Office on February 23, 1968, was given a physical examination on February 28, 1968, and on that date was disqualified at the Induction Center for medical reasons, one of these reasons being that he was a user of heroin.

On May 29, 1968, GOVERN was reinterviewed at the Marin County Jail. GOVERN advised he was in the San Francisco Jail from about April 15, 1968, to April 24, 1968. He insisted that the letter referred to was given to him by a person who he knew as TOM. GOVERN stated he was confined to a cell with TOM for about seven days but did not speak to him until his last two days in jail. He advised that both he and TOM were released from City Jail on the same day. GOVERN stated he did not know JAMES EARL RAY and had never seen him. He stated he had seen pictures of RAY in the newspapers.

He advised that on the letter his hand-printing appeared on Page 1 when he wrote the telephone number 404-688-7263 regarding the Ebenezer Baptist Church and on Page 3 when he wrote the telephone numbers 527-6611, 526-8811, and 516-2141. He advised that the telephone number 404-688-7263 was the telephone number of the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia, and he obtained this number by calling Atlanta Information.

He advised he has no knowledge as to the identity of the subscriber to telephone number 221-6201 which appears on the first page of the letter. He advised that the name ROBERT LAWRENCE appearing on Page 1 is unknown to him. GOVERN stated that the rifle used to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING was the same rifle that killed President JOHN F. KENNEDY. When asked to elaborate on this

remark he stated, "You guys know that and there is no sense in me telling you anything about that."

The telephone number 415-324-1130 is a San Francisco telephone number. Inquiry at this number reflects that LARRY YOUNG resides there. YOUNG advised that he would contact the San Francisco Office this date.

ROBERT MOORE, San Francisco Police Department, Star 1648, San Francisco City Jail, on May 31, 1968, advised that BRUCE IRWIN GOVERN was arrested and confined to the San Francisco City Jail on April 16, 1968, and was bailed out on April 19, 1968. MOORE stated that a review of the records reflected that the only "TOM" that was discharged on April 19, 1968, from the City Jail was THOMAS LYNCH who was confined on April 17, 1968, and was released on April 19, 1968. He advised LYNCH was confined to cell block "L" whereas GOVERN was in Dormitory 3.

THOMAS PATRICK LYNCH, 116 Frederick Street, Apartment 29, San Francisco, California, on May 31, 1968, stated he does not know anyone by the name of BRUCE IRWIN GOVERN. He observed photographs of GOVERN and stated that he did not recognize this individual as being identical with anyone that he knows. He stated he was arrested on a narcotics charge and that he was kept separate from the rest of the prisoners in the jail. LYNCH observed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and stated he did not know RAY and that he had never seen him. LYNCH advised that he had not given GOVERN the four-page letter which GOVERN said he had obtained from "TOM."

LYNCH stated he had been shocked at the death and the manner of the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and that he had not written this note and that he would not have anything to do with any such scheme as this seems to be.

LARRY YOUNG, 974 Weeks, Palo Alto, California, on June 3, 1968, advised he was confined at the San Francisco City Jail from about April 6, 1968, to April 13, 1968. He advised that a white man by the name of LAWRENCE who was in the "tank" with him gave him a letter which was already sealed and asked him to mail it when he got out. YOUNG stated this letter was addressed to MARTIN LUTHER KING, SR. YOUNG stated he does not know the contents of the letter. YOUNG stated he did not know GOVERN.

Prior to receipt of reBuairtel, the New Orleans Division on 5/31/68 contacted Mr. NAURBON PERRY, Group Supervisor, Intelligence, Internal Revenue Service, New Orleans, exploring the feasibility of obtaining information from TCR-1 Forms.

PERRY stated that his office receives these forms through the Federal Reserve Bank and they come from banks all over the Gulf Coast, including Mobile, Alabama. He stated cooperation with regard to completing a TCR-1 Form is for the most part voluntary on the part of the banks. The regulations regarding the TCR-1's completion are handled by the Comptroller of Currency and he pointed out that most banks do not follow these regulations to the letter.

PERRY stated he was specifically prohibited by Statute from disclosing information from the TCR-1 Form, and that he would not be able to disclose this information without the specific permission of the Commissioner of IRS.

In view of this, leads to contact all banks in the New Orleans area were held in abeyance pending further word from Mr. PERRY.

On 6/3/68, Mr. PERRY was recontacted and advised that he had heard nothing yet giving him authorization to disclose the desired information.

As of 6/4/68, no word had been received from PERRY therefore, leads concerning contact with individual banks previously assigned will be covered in accordance with instructions in Buairtel dated 5/21/68.

JAMES W. BROWN, Route 1, Box 176-B, Reform, Alabama, advised that he was sentenced to the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, in April of 1960 and was released on June 15, 1965. He stated that he knew JAMES EARL RAY while he was in prison and first met him sometime in 1963. He stated that he had been in groups where RAY was talking on several occasions and had talked to him personally a few times.

BROWN stated that RAY made the statement that he was glad when JOHN F. KENNEDY was killed, and had made some statements at this time to the effect "That is one 'Nigger'-loving S.O.B. that got shot." He stated that RAY did not like Negroes and that during the time MARTIN LUTHER KING was leading some of his demonstrations and this information was being published in the newspapers, RAY used to curse KING and the Negroes. The news of the demonstrations and marches used to aggravate him considerably. He stated that RAY made the statement that KENNEDY was running the country and especially in the racial field, and that MARTIN LUTHER KING could get the Federal Government to do anything he wanted them to. BROWN further advised that he had heard some prison rumors that RAY was supposed to have killed three Negroes while he was in the Missouri State Penitentiary.

BROWN advised that sometime in the Fall of 1963, RAY made the statement that he was going to get MARTIN LUTHER KING when he got out. He stated that he heard him say something about COOLEY (phonetic) or COOLEY'S organization would pay \$10,000.00 to have KING dead. He stated that he could furnish no further information concerning this and RAY did not mention it again in his presence.

BROWN further advised that RAY seemed to have a sufficient supply of money and that he gambled with the other convicts continuously in the prison yard. The convicts used chips made from bottle caps or gambled for cigarettes and they would settle their gambling losses at the end of the month. He stated that RAY indicated at one time that he got

a check or money regularly from some source on the outside. He stated that RAY did drink some and he had detected alcohol on his breath on different occasions. The convicts made whiskey in the prison and some of the guards sold whiskey to the convicts also. He stated there was a lot of narcotics passed around in the prison and the guards would bring some of it in and some of it was being brought in by visitors. He never had any personal knowledge that RAY used narcotics. He was unable to name any specific guard that sold contraband to the convicts; however, he did say that one guard was caught selling contraband to the convicts in 1962 or 1963 and was fired. He stated that RAY did talk to one particular guard a lot; however, he does not remember the guard's name.

BROWN stated that he has not seen RAY since he left prison and has no idea where he might have gone. He stated that RAY had talked about tunnelling out of prison and going to Virginia and hiding in a cave. He heard RAY say that he had a large supply of guns before he was in prison and heard him mention a submachine gun. The only foreign country he ever heard RAY mention was Liberia, Africa, and RAY stated that he had a brother-in-law working there and that he was making a lot of money.

BROWN advised that RAY was not too friendly; however, he would talk in groups. RAY told BROWN once that he had been in Birmingham, Alabama, and that RAY had stated that Birmingham was a good town to steal in. He never discussed his past life in BROWN'S presence and BROWN has no idea where RAY is from or anything about his family.

His close associates in prison were:

JOHNNY VALENTI (phonetic)

VALENTI is believed to be from Baton Rouge, Louisiana and BROWN believes he is still in prison. VALENTI talked about Mexico a lot and could speak Spanish. RAY stated one time that he was going to visit a friend of his and VALENTI'S (this friend's name unknown) who was released from prison and got married and it is believed that he is running a cafe near Moberly, Missouri.

"TICK" WILSON, who was killed while in Missouri State Prison.

JOHNNY JOHNSON, who is from the Kansas City area and is believed to be still in prison as he was serving a twenty-year sentence.
