Referenced Bureau telephone call indicated that an article appeared in a recent Los Angeles newspaper inferring that the FBI in Birmingham had instructed individuals contacted in connection with captioned investigation not to furnish information to any other individuals.

No such instructions were given to persons contacted by Agents of this office; however, ROBERT WOOD, owner of Aeromarine Supply Company, from which company the subject purchased the rifle used in shooting Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, when first contacted stated that he was extremely concerned that if it became known that the subject purchased the gun used in the KING killing from his company, certain elements of the Negro population might burn his place of business. He requested the Bureau not divulge the fact that RAY purchased the gun from his company. When given such assurance, he furnished all available information to this office and has been extremely cooperative in the entire investigation. He was advised that any information he gave this office would be held in confidence with the understanding, of course, that in the event the matter came to trial it would become public knowledge. He said he understood this perfectly. He was also advised that any leak would have to come from him or his employees and if he desired that this information be kept secret, he should not divulge this information. He said he had instructed his employees not to furnish any information regarding the sale of this gun.

Indicative of the fact that he was not bound by any instructions from this office, he subsequently furnished information to the press when a direct inquiry was made of him; however, this was only after continual prodding from members of the local press. To the best of our knowledge, he did not furnish any juformation to out-of-town reporters.

For the information of the Bureau, witnesses in this investigation, namely, CHERPES, owner of the boarding house, and Mr. PAISLEY, from whom RAY purchased a car, both gave information to the press at the inception of this investigation. However, inquiries were so numerous and made at all hours of the day and night that Mr. PAISLEY found it necessary to move his family from his home to the home of relatives and Mr. CHERPES changed his residence to another rooming house which he owned.

JAMES W. BROWN, residence 305 East S voluntarily furnished the following, in addition to that information voluntarily furnished by BROWN to the FBI. 5/9/68:

BROWN was shown numerous photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, alongwith one photograph of JOHNNY VELANTI, taken 2/10/59. BROWN was unable to identify the photograph of VELANTI, but when advised this was able a photograph of JOHNNY VELANTI, BROWN Then said he could then ddentify this as the same person who introduced BROWN to JAMES EARL RAY, while all three were incarcerated in the Missouri state penitentiary. Concerning the photographs of RAY, BROWN could not identify the photographs of RAY taken by the Missouri state penxitentiary in 1960 or 1966. He did identify the photograph taken of RAY in California at a bartending school. He could not identify the other photograph of RAY taken in California in January or February 1968.

BROWN said that in June 1967, while he was working as a service at Reform. Alabama. station attendant for L. D. VAILS, at a Rebel Gas Station, BROWN was contacted by an ex-convict from the Missouri state penitentiary FNU ALLEN. At the time ALLEN was driving a late model 19 M red Mustang. ALEEN said he was going to Tuscaloosa, Ala., from Columbus,

Georgia, BROWN said that ALLEN was with two persons, who BROWN did not recognize, however, the photo of JAMES EARL RAY, taken in California, in January or February 1968, did resemble the man driving the Mustang. BROWN added that ALLEN did not introduce this driver, and BROWN did not recognize him as JAMES EARL RAY.

BROWN said that ALLEN was in the Missouri pentitentiary in 1963, having been convicted in Kennett, Missouri for robbery. According to BROWN, he had seen ALLEN on several occassions in conversations with JAMES EARL RAY, and was positive they knew each other. In 1963 ALLEN lived in the same hall, M/F Hall, with RAY.

BROWN claimed that all the information he was furnishing, was about JAMES EARL RAY, and he, BROWN, did not have RAY confused with any other prisoner with a same or similar name. Concerning JOHNNY VELANTI, BROWN claimed he has had not contact whatsoever, with VELANTI, since his release from the penitentiary. BROWN said that at the time VELANTI introduced BROWN to RAY, BROWN was then living in G Hall, VELENTI was in G Hall, and RAY was F Hall. BROWN also recalled overhearing a conversation between RAY and VELENTI, in which VELENTI talked about getting out of prison and going to a small town, located past Mexico City, where he, VELENTI, would stay and where he could get along with the natives. VELENTI named the town, but BROWN could not recall the name.

BROWN said he recalled seeing RAY play basketball in the prison yard on a few occassions, and he saw RAY bet on basketball, football and baseball games, as well as play in a poker game operated by

JOHNNIE JOHNSON and JOHNSON's half-brother, BOBBY ASHE. Both were from Kan sas City, and BROWN was positive JOHNSON was an associate of RAY, as BROWN had seen them talking together on several occassions, as well as playing poker together.

As best he could recall, BROWN said RAY told BROWN that he, RAY, had been in Birmingham about 1956, and had gone there on several occassions to steal, as "it was a good town to steal in".

RAY never furnished any additional information about any contacts or activities in Birmingham. BROWN believed he told RAY that BROWN had a brother named AL BROWN who lived at 609 So. 54th St., Birmingham. RAY mentioned a hotel he stayed if at, in Birmingham but RAY also mentioned a couple of night clubs, but did not recall the BROWN could not recall the name of this hotel ABROWN did recall telling RAY that BROWN had worked on river barges and tugboats, on the Warrior River, drom 1953 until 1956.

RAY did mention a couple of night clubs in Birmingham, he, RAY, had been to and liked, but BROWN siad he could not recall the names of these places, as he, BROWN, had never been in them.

BROWN claimed VELANTI told BROWN about VELANTI running off from an orphan's home at the age of 14, and being "raided" by a Louisiana Sheriff, who took VELANTI into his home. Later VELANTI got involved in the excape of several prisoners being held by that Sheriff. BROWN was of the opinion that because of their close relationship in the penitentiary, RAY and VELANTI would get together, on the outside.




