By telephone call 2:30 p.m. this date, SAC ROBERT G. JENSEN, of the Memphis Division, advised that he had been in contact with Mr. ROBERT DWYER, of the Attorney General's Office, State of Tennessee. Mr. DWYER is the State Prosecutor handling the prosecution of JAMES EARL RAY at a trial in local court in Memphis, Tennessee, scheduled for November 12, 1968. Mr. DWYER referred to FD-302's reflecting interviews with Mr. WALTER LEON SPAIN, who, it was pointed out by DWYER, sold a hand gun to JAMES EARL RAY in October, 1967. Mr. DWYER requested that Mr. SPAIN be immediately contacted to determine his willingness to honor a subpoena to testify at the above-mentioned trial.

SAC JENSEN requested that this be handled immediately, and he was advised by the writer that WALTER LEON SPAIN would be contacted personally on October 30, 1968, and an airtel concerning his comments would be immediately submitted to the Memphis Division.

WALTER LEON SPAIN was contacted this date by SA MEIL P. SHANAHAN and was advised that the Attorney General's Office of the State of Tennessee was anxious to obtain his ecoperation in presenting testimony in the forthcoming trial of JAMES HARL RAY in Hemphis, Tenn. It was explained to Mr. SPAIN that the trial is scheduled to start on 11/11/68, but his testimony would not be required until a later date, possibly two weeks or more from the beginning of this trial. It was further explained to Mr. SPAIN that the State of Tennessee is authorized only to pay \$6.00 a day expenses and 10¢ a mile to cover the cost of transportation to and from Memphis. pointed out to Mr. SPAIN that, in all probability, he would be advised two days in advance of the day his testimony is to be given. It was also explained to Mr. SPAIN that the testimony to be requested from him concerns the circuestances under which he obtained a .38 caliber Liberty shub-nose revolver and the circumstances under which he disposed of this gun.

Pollowing this explanation, Mr. SPAIN stated he is willing to ecoperate with the Tennessee authorities to the best of his ability and would be agreeable to provide testimony in the above-mentioned trial.





Exclosed for Hemphis are five copies each of tive FD-302's reflecting interviews conducted concerning the identity of individuals bandling the transaction whorein an individual using the name ERIC STARVO GALT took a test and received an Alabama state driver's license on September 6, 1967, transferred a license tag and purchased a new license tag during the same approximate period.

On November 4, 1968, Col. FLOYD MANN, Commanding Officer of the Alabama State Troopers, was contacted esnegraing the accessity of having two or more State Troopers appear in Memphis, Tennessee, for the purpose of furnishing testimony in the forthcoming trial of JAMES RABL RAY. Col. MANN Edvised that he would pledge 100% cooperation in this matter and any Trooper needed would be made available when requested. He advised that any subpostas should be served on the Trooper at their home station. He advised that a subpoena duces tecum for the original application for a driver's license should be directed to Major BANKHEAD BATES, Alabama State Troopers Readquarters, Montgomery, Alabama.

For the information of Memphis, Mrs. MARY ANN MORSLEY stated at the time of interview that she was extremely reluctant to travel to Memphis to furnish testimony in this case. She advised that her husband would "pitch a fit" about her going and possibly would prevent her from making this trip. She stated also that she will do anything herself to avoid making this trip unless it is absolutely necessary. Wiss SUE CLICE stated that she is also reluctant to testify in this matter but it is believed that she will do so if requested.

There is some confusion on the part of personnel in the Department of Revenue, Jefferson County, concerning the identity of the employee who affixed her initials "JD" on the tag receipt dated October 2, 1967. It is believed that she is a Negro female who worked as a part-time employee and is no longer residing in the Birmingham area. Efforts will be made by Birmingham to identify and locate this individual. It is requested that Memphis furnish the enclosed and contained information to appropriate nembers of the Attorney General's Office in Memphis, Tennessee.

Sgt. TOM BARDEN, Alabama State Troopers, 715 North 18th Street, Birmingham, Alabama, was interviewed and after being explained the nature of the interview, furnished the following information:

Sgt. BARDEN reviewed the form concerning the application for a driver's license of one ERIC STARVO GALT and stated that this is a standard Form DL2 required to be prepared for every individual who applies for and receives an Alabama driver's license. He stated that this form indicates that the individual representing himself as GALT appeared at the Driver Testing Office 1715 North 18th Street, on September 5, 1967, and was furn sted the inside portion of his examination on that day by raminer Trooper CHARLIE RAYMOND THORNTON, whose initials CT appear on the front of this form. The typewritten portion of this form was filled out by one of the girls at the desk and under the date of birth section it is noted that he was the 79th person to appear on that date. The Yes-No section of this form was prepared by Trooper THORNTON and then signed by ERIC STARVO GALT. Trooper THORNTON also administered the Eyesight and Hearing Test. The road rules and road signs portion of the test were also administered at this time. GALT scored a 100 on the road signs and road rules tests as indicated by the 0 recorded for those portions of the test on the form. Trooper THORNTON then recorded in the Department Action Section of the form the 3-1 and IO notations, which indicate that he was given the road rules and road signs tests numbered 3-1 and the IO indicates that the test was incomplete inasmuch as the individual stated that he did not wish to proceed that day with the driving portion of the examination.

BARDEN advised that the form was then placed in the file and was retrieved the following day, September 6, 1967, when the individual named GALT reappeared at this office to take the driving portion. He was then given this form and directed to the driving test area on 6th Avenue, North, between 16th and 17th Street, adjacent to Kelly Ingram Park, approximately three blocks from the testing office.

BARDEN stated that this form further indicates that the driving portion of the test was administered by Trooper JIMMY HOLDER, whose signature appears at the bottom of the form. Before giving the test, HOLDER would have checked the automobile, which is recorded on the form as being a 1966 Mustang. He would have checked the lights, brakes and general safety conditions of the automobile and recorded the driver's license number of the accompanying driver. HOLDER would have then administered the driving portion of the test and requested the individual to sign his name in the block marked Applicant's Signature. Upon passing the test, the individual would have been directed to the Jefferson County Courthouse where he would have paid the required fee of \$4.50 after presenting this completed signed form to the clerk, who would then issue him a temporary driver's license. The clerk who handled this portion of the transaction, according to BARDEN, appears to be M. A. HORSLEY. This clerk would then forward this entire application to the Driver's License Record Department in Montgomery, Alabama.

BARDEN further stated that his comments concerning this transaction are based entirely upon his knowledge of the usual procedures engaged in by the Troopers employed at the office in giving drivers tests, and that he has no personal knowledge of the presence of an individual using the name ERIC STARVO GALT on September 5 and 6, 1967.

Trooper CHARLIE RAYMOND THORNTON was interviewed and after being advised of the nature of the interview, furnished the following information:

Trooper THORNTON stated that in the courses of his business, he signs his name as C. R. THORNTON and when he uses his initials, he writes CRT. Trooper THORNTON advised that he has been a Trooper with the Alabama State Troopers for 21 years and currently resides at 4845 Avenue B, Ensley, Birmingham, Alabama, in trailer lot #35. He stated he can be reached at the Driver's License Testing Office, 715 North 18th Street, Birmingham, Alabama, telephone number 324-3165.

After viewing a Xerox copy of Alabama State Form DL-2, he stated that his initials appear on the first page of this form indicating that he administered the inside portion of a driver's license test to a man using the name ERIC STARVO GALT on September 5, 1967. Trooper THORNTON advised that this form indicates that the outside portion of the test was given by Trooper JIMMY HOLDER, who is currently working in a Gadsden, Alabama, office of the State Troopers.

THORNTON advised that he does not know whether or not he would be able to identify anyone as being the individual who took the driver's test using the name ERIC STARVO GALT.

Mr. JAMES HEALEY, Director of Revenue, Jefferson County, Birmingham, Alabama, was interviewed and after viewing a Xerox copy of his standard State of Alabama Form DL-2, Application for Driver's License, stated that the individual signing this form as M. A. HORSLEY is in fact Mrs. MARY ANN HORSLEY, 2405 17th Avenue, North, telephone 251-7731. He stated that Mrs. HORSLEY is a temporary employee of Jefferson County who has worked in a temporary capacity for the past five years during the period of the automobile tag sales rush, usually from the first week in September until the first week in December.

Mr. HEALEY stated that the initials SC appearing on motor vehicle license transfer form are the initials of Miss SUE CLICK, Route 2, Box 327, Adamsville, Alabama, telephone 674-9024. He advised that Miss CLICK is a full-time employee of the Jefferson County Department of Revenue and has been so employed for approximately two years.

After viewing a Xerox copy of a receipt for a new license tag prepared in the name of ERIC S. GALT, Mr. HEALEY stated that the initials appearing on this form appear to be J. D., and after reviewing his records, could state only that he believes they belong to a temporary employee who was employed during the auto tag sales rush in 1967 and whose mame he believes to be WILLIE JEAN DAVIS, 2820 21st Paue, North, Birmingham, Alabama. Mr. HEALEY advised that WILLIE JEAN DAVIS is not employed at the present time and unsuccessful attempts were made to contact her in September of 1968 to determine whether she would again work during the rush period.

Each division will obtain a list of the guests registered at the respective motels and hotel for a period of three days before, during, and three days after the listed period. This list should include, but not be restricted to, name, address, and identification of any vehicle used by the guests. The possibility exists that a common denominator will appear at the above in order that the identity of "Raoul" will be established.

In addition, the article sets forth that Ray stayed at an unnamed motel in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, 10-7-67. Since it is not known how many motels are located in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, the San Antonio Office should conduct the desired investigation only if feasible. Advise the Bureau and Memphis accordingly.

The Memphis Division, upon receipt of this information from the other listed divisions, will completely evaluate this information for possible identification of "Raoul." The name "Raoul" is Spanish for Ralph and it should be considered that this could be either a given name of a surname.

This is to be handled immediately and results furnished to the Bureau promptly.

On 11/9/68, a telephone call was received from the Bureau from SA DICK LONG, Division 6, who advised that the Bureau was in receipt of an advanced copy of "Look" magazine, which was to be made published on November 12, 1968, and contained an article regarding the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. He advised that this article contained information that JAMES EARL RAY, on October 25, 1967, had stayed in Birmingham at the Granada Hotel, 2234 Fourth Avenue, North, using the alias of JOHN L. RAYNES.

He advised that this information was previously unknown and he requested that investigation be conducted to verify this information and that the Bureau be advised by teletype on November 9, 1968.

ROBERT LEF SAUNDERS Private, United States Army, Serial No. US advised he was in military custody while being transported to Ft. Campbell, Kentucky, following his apprehension at Cleveland, Mississippi, for being absent without leave. SAUNDERS provided the following information to Special Agent LARRY K. SYLVESTER, who identified himself as a Special Agent with the FBI. Also present during this interview of SAUNDERS was Lt. Col. DALE HAMILTON, Provost Marshal, Ft. McClellan, Alabama.

SAUNDERS advised that he went AWOL from Ft. Campbell, Kentucky, around March 29, 1968. He then traveled to Cleveland, Ohio, where he stayed for a period of approximately two days and then obtained a ride from Cleveland, Ohio, to Memphis, Tennessee, with an individual SAUNDERS knew only as "Stoop" who drove a pink Cadillac and was from Memphis, "Legnessee. SAUNDERS stated that he was broke when he arrived in Memphis, Tennessee, and located a place to sleep in a condemned building at 1408 Beal Street in Memphis. SAUNDERS slept there one night and was walking down an alley to return to this building at approximately 3:30 A.M., the second night when he observed four Negro males standing news the alley just ahead of him. SAUNDERS stated that he stopped and stood in the shadows as he was afraid these individuals would try to harm him. As SAUNDERS stood there he overheard these individuals arguing. One individual said "Let me get him." The other individuals were arguing they should be the one to "get him." One of the individuals who SAUNDERS described as a large Negro male, approximately 6'6" to 6'7" tall approximately 30 years of age, and wearing a thin beat which encompassed his entire face, stated something to the effect that he should be the one to "get KING." Also, this individual stated that he would get the gun.

SAUNDERS described the others with the big man as follows:

No. Two Man was described as a Negro male, young, approximately 20 years old, 5'4", wearing khaki pants.

No. Three Man was described as a Negro male, 5'11", medium-heavy build, balding hair and worn natural with two parts. This individual also wore metal rim glasses with very small lens.

No. Four Man was described as a Negro male, approximately 5'10", approximately 25 years of age, and wore a black tam with blue decorations.

SAUNDERS stated that upon hearing these individuals talk, he became afraid and ran in the opposite direction so that he would not have to pass in front of them. SAUNDERS stated that he then went to the Greyhound Bus Station where he sat the rest of the night.

At approximately 10:30 A.M., the following day, SAUNDERS stated he returned to Beal Street where he went to a bar called the Bucket of Blood and purchased approximately two beers. SAUNDERS stated that he observed these four individuals in the tavern at that time. He then got up and left this tavern after having been inside approximately 15 minutes and upon coming out observed two of the four individuals he had seen the previous night standing on the curb on Beal Street near the tavern. SAUNDERS stated as he began to walk down Beal Street, he observed a 1954 blue Ford convertible with white top drive up and the individuals who were standing on the curb then got inside. SAUNDERS stated that he observed this vehical was driven by the large Negro male with the beard who had seen the previous night. SAUNDERS stated that he also observed that a rifle sight approximately 8" in length was laying in the rear deck of the automobile. SAUNDERS stated that he did not see any gun and that it was obvious the sight was not attached to a gun.

SAUNDERS stated that he returned to the bus station where he later learned of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated that up until this time he was unaware that KING was in Memphis and had not

associated any of the statements he had overheard with MARTIN LUTHER KING.

SAUNDERS advised he felt he could identify the large Negro male who wore the beard but would be unable to identify any of the other individuals. reiterated that his entire basis for believing that these individuals may have been responsible for the murder of KING was the single mention of the word "KING" by one of the individuals in the alley the previous night.
