#### OFFERSE:

It is charged that on or about Movember 28, 1962, in Birmingham, this subject did write and mail a letter in which he threatened the life of the President of the United States, and also threatened the life of the Attorney General of the United States.

### Other Information:

Subject has always been somewhat "different". In recent years, he has been regarded as being "very peculiar". Since About September, 1962, he has been very much interested and concerned in the developments at Oxford, Miss., where the University of Mississippi was being integrated. He had collected three large notebooks full of clippings from newspapers and magazines regarding developments there. He had written a number of letters to individuals regarding incidents there. He wrote General Walker, and it is reported that he had a personal reply from him. He had written to Governor Barnett of Mississippi and Sen. Bastland of Mississippi regarding developments at Oxford.

On Movember 28, 1962, he wrote a letter to the Asst. Attorney General in charge of Internal Security which contained a threat to the life of the President of the United States and a threat to the life of the Attorney General. Later he wrote another letter in which he withdrew the threat to the life of the President.

#### Defendant's Version:

Subject stated to the undersigned that at 2:15 on the morning of November 28, 1962, he wrote a letter and mailed it which threatened the life of the President of the United States and the Attorney General. He states he mailed this letter to Mr. Walter Yeagley, Asst. Attorney General, in charge of Internal Security Division, Department of Justice, Washington, D. C. Subject states, "I wrote this out of anger and mailed it because I did not have any better sense".

Helen Ruth Hubka was born and was graduated from Springville High School. SHe has worked most of her life as a practical nurse but has never worked through one of the local registries. In 1955 she took a course at Massey Business College and has since been employed in the billing department of lovemen's Department Store in Birmingham, Ala.

#### Brothers and Sisters:

Charles Michael Hubka, born resides with the parents, 2726 17th St., West, Birmingham, Ala., is not in school at present, picks up odd jobs around the community, mostly at filling stations, and is a very peculiar person. For example, during the course of about a forty-minute interview in the subject's home with the father, this brother lay stretched out on the sofa, and did not speak one word during the entire course of our visit, although he was obviously not asleep.

She resides at 8050 Division Ave., Birmingham, Ala. Reliable informants relate that she was a peculiar girl who has never known what to say nor how to conduct herself.

## BIRTH AND EARLY DEVELOPMENT:

This subject was born at Birmingham, Ala., He was of normal birth and was regarded as an average child during his early years.

#### MARITAL HISTORY:

Subject is single.

#### EDUCATION:

This subject was regarded as being an average boy in grammar school. His grades were average. When he entered high school, however, he was regarded as being a strange boy. He did not associate with the other students. Although the principal and boys adviser felt he was the cause of some trouble, they never could pin anything on him. He acquired only ten demerits; however, during the time he was at Ensley High School. He entered masley High School in September, 1956, and withdrew October, 1958. His grades were not satisfactory. He passed English I with D but failed English II three times. He passed History I with a D and History II with a D. He failed Math I twice and passed it with a B on the third attempt. He also failed Math II. He failed Science and passed it on the second try with a B. Science II was passed with a C, and Science III he failed with an F.

In four full semesters of high school he earned 8 credits and had 8 failures. He dropped out of high school. When asked why, he said he had wanted to study business law, and it was not open until he reached the fifth semester. He states after he had been in high school four semesters they still would not admit him to business law, so he became disgusted and quit.

#### religion:

The subject and his family are considered to be members of the Ensley First Presbyterian Church; however, subject said he just quit going to church about the time he dropped out of high school. Apparently the family moved out of the immediate community where the church is located, and he has not attended church services in some time. Nother have other members of the subject's family attended church. The father explained that he sometimes has to work on Sunday and he has osteomyelitis in one of his legs, and this required a dressing on Sunday morning on the days he does not work.

# INTERESTS AND ACTIVITIES:

This subject has a rather restricted list of interests. He has no close friends and tells we he has only had one date in his entire life. He does not have a driver's license. He stated to me he has a morbid fear of hitting someone so he never did learn to drive an automobile. I am told he is interested in electronics and that he has also had a hobby of collecting old firearms. He has an old English made, Webley revolver which he has repaired. At one time the father had a .38 S. & W. Revolver and after he found the subject was carrying it around and taking it without permission, he got rid of this gun.

Subject came across an advertisement of an antique gun collector at Pitts-burgh, Pa., some time back and shortly after this, he published an ad in the TCI Journal in which he stated he wish to buy 1,000 antique guns for his own personal collection. Following this, when he received a telephone call, he would promptly put in a long distance telephone call to the antique gun deeler and inquiring as to the value of this particular firearm. In this menner, the subject charged \$110 worth of long distance telephone calls to his father's phone during the period of about two months. The father had the phone taken out in order to put a stop to this practice. The present phone was only installed after the subject was put in jail.

# INTERASTS AND ACTIVITIES: (Cont.)

Subject also has a considerable interest in what he describes as "law". We were told that he spent a good deal of time reading law. However, we learned on visiting his home that he had only one book on business law. This is Kerr's book on Business law, copyrighted in 1937 and published in 19hk. This was a well worm volume and subject had apparently spent some little time reading it.

We are told that the subject keeps very strange hours. He is inclined to six up all night some nights drinking coffee and smoking his pipe and is inclined to sleep during the day and stay up all night. When he does, he just sits around the house and does nothing. In fact, we are told since his release from the Marine Corps, approximately three years ago, he has made no effort to get a job, that he has just stayed around the house day and night and has done absolutely nothing. When the Probation Officer inquired as to where his spending money came from, he stated once in a while the father gave him some money, but usually he gambled for his spending money, when the parents were not there....that some boys in the neighborhood would sometimes comes by and they would have a eard game. He said the parents were "dead set against gambling". He says he does not belong to any organizations whatever.

He has one interest that is more prominent than any other, and that is firearms. He tells a fantastic story of how one night he walked to a drive-in restaurant
to get a cup of coffee, carried a .22 blank pistol to shoot in case a dog attacked
him. He said there was a group of 18 to 20 hoodlums there who took the blank pistol
gway from him. He returned home, slipped his father's .38 calibre revolver into his
pocket, returned to the restaurant, and forced them to give back his blank .22 calibre revolver.

On another occasion he states he and a friend by the name of Conald Stagg were playing at home with a .22 salibre revolver and trying to sneak up on each other. The gams were supposed to be unloaded; however, during the playing around, the subject was accidentally shot in the shoulder by Stagg. He told his parents that the gun had jammed and he was trying to release the mechanism with a long screw driver when it went off and he was accidentally shot. There were several other bisagresteries in connection with his interest in firearms which seem to be almost an obscession, but these will serve to illustrate his preoccupation with this hobby. He claims he had wanted to be a gunsmith, took a test at the Ala. Employment Service and they told him he did not have the manual dexterity which would qualify him for this type of work.

## HEALTH:

Physical: Subject is a white man, 20 years of age, is 5'9" tall and weighs 160 pounds, has black hair, brown eyes and is in good health. His teeth, however, are not in good shape.

Mental: There are numerous indications that this subjet is not normal, mentally or emotionally. There is a life-long history of emuresis and it appears he was discharged from the Marine Corps on account of this. It was further noted that he gives great attention to facts and details (for instance, his memory span

not only includes exact dates, but the hour and minute a thing occurred More recently he has been so busy explaining to his cell-mate at the Jefferson Co. Jail why he wrote/that the cell-mate has stated to the Warden at the jail that this wan is crazy and asked that he not be required to share the cell with him.

It seems strange, too, that this subject has made no effort to get a job, or to return to school in the three years since his release from the military service. We are told he stays in the apartment day and night and has become more or less a feeluse. We are further told that he earnot stand authority, that he has to be the top man in any undertaking, andhe absolutely cannot live with authority. We are also told that he has a volatile temper and when mad does not appear to be rational. We were told that some time when he is asked by his mother to do some simple chore, he will blow up and become extremely profuse. He will then turn to his father and ask his father to get his mother "off his back."

Another illustration of his temper was eited in that when working on a radio, and he attempts to put a screw in or solder a wire, if it does not work immediately, he is inclined to throw the screw driver or soldering iron against the wall and burst out swearing in a most profane manner, regardless of who may be present. Psople who know the family state he is not rational. It is known that he has a very small span of interest and has some very peculiar personal habits, especially about sleeping all day and sitting up all night.

# EMPLOYMENT:

This subject has never had a job. The only work he has ever done was to sell soft drinks at "ickwood Field once or twice. Insofar as we know, he has no Secial Security number.

#### HOME AND MEIGHBORHOOD:

The subject has made his home with his father and mother and younger brother at 2726 17th St., West, Birmingham, Ala., Apt. A. This is a four-room spartment located in a brick apartment building, containing four units. There are in all four people occupying this apartment consisting of the parents, subject himself and younger brother. The family has lived here fifteen or sixteen months, and the rent is \$57.50 per month.

Prior to this the family lived at 2720 Avenue P, Ensley, for 15 months. Prior to that, they lived at 2628 Pike Road, Birmingham, for about six years.

# EVALUATION:

This subject appears to be a rather mixed up young man, immature, and with a life-long history of bedwetting. It is strongly suspected that he is mentally unsound, or unbalanced. There appear to be sound reasons for this conclusion. The whole family, in fact, is a little abnormal. People who have known this family for many years and who are believed to be reliable relate that the father is the only level-headed member of the family. The mother describes herself as been extremely nervous. Other informants state that she and the subject are much slike.

Our observation of the subject's brother indicates that he is not quite normal. He has been described by the informants as being "an odd wad". We have been told that the brother also suffers with enuresis, and there have been some remarks which would indicate that subject's only sister is a little unusual.

#### MILITARY SERVICE:

Subject enlisted in the Marine Corps at Birmingham, Als., September 11, 1959, and was discharged December, 1959, after appearing before aptitude board at Parris Island, S. C. The Board among other things reported that on initial screening the examiner noted evidence of some unstable and obstructive traits in his past adjustment, but that he was cleared because he was well motivated for duty. One week later he was referred to the Psychistric Unit by the Company Commander for bedwetting while on duty. The examiner noted a life-long history of bedwetting which had been originally concealed but referred him for further period of trial duty.

After approximately seven weeks on Parris Island, he was admitted to the Psychiatric Unit Ward, since the bedwetting had increased in its frequency. While at the Psychiatric Unit, he was observed to be an immature youth, and he made a strong plea to be permitted to remain in the Marine Corps. It was noted that he had performed adequately in training, and in this he was supported by the Company Commander's report. His language was mility pretentious at times and he considerably misused words. He was permitted to return to duty.

After a period of observation during which he was able to control his bedwetting, he was returned for a further period of trial duty. He was free from sourcess for a period of about four weeks. However, after failing to qualify on the rifle range and during mess duty, he began to wet the bed nightly. This earned him considerable ill-will from his platoon mates, and resulted in his re-referral and second admission to the Psychiatric Unit Ward. Marked immaturity of thinking in some areas was noted. For example, despite his poor school record, especially insmathematics, he expressed an ambition to go to college and study engineering. He also described to the psychiatrist an experiment in which he conducted a project which verges on the bisarre. He experimented with mosquito-attracting properties of human excreta (his own).

Clinical psychologists reported average intelligence. He made 97 on the General Test which was administered. He was discharged after the Board found him unsuitable for service in the Marine Corps. They stated his general qualifications did not warrant his retention in the service, and he was discharged by reason of unsuitability.
