

C., phone 334-6431, telephonically advised that he has information he wanted to furnish to the FBI on a strict confidential basis. was assured that any information he furnished would be beld in confidence. HUDSON stated that two of his interviewers today interviewed a man by the name of EUGENE WATSON who said he was from Winston-Salem, N. C., and had come to Charlotte on 4-7-68 and now residing at the YMCA, Charlotte. He stated that the interviewers commented to him that EUGENE WATSON strongly resembles the photo of the individual who shot MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated they both commented that WATSON had a "silly smile" mentioned in newspaper accounts of the killer. HUDSON was asked the identity of the two interviewers. He was reluctant to furnish the identity of the employees, stating that all information obtained by his agency was strictly confidential and he did not want any publicity of information concerning this matter coming from his office. He was assured that the identity of his employees would be held in strict confidence. He then advised that the employees names are JERRY COLLIE, female, and CHARLES TAYLOR.

Mr. HUDSON was thanked for his information.

The following investigation was conducted by SA HOWARD C: BURGIN at Whiteville, N. C.:

On 4/9/68, Patrolman RALPH SPAULDING, Whiteville, N. C.. Police Department, advised that at 7:30 p.m., on 4/9/68, he arrested FREDERICK DUNSTON and charged him with possession of non-tax paid whiskey and public drunk and placed DUNSTON in the Columbus County Jail, Whiteville, N. C.

SPAULDING advised that he has arrested DUNSTON on numerous occasions for public drunk and disorderly conduct. SPAULDING advised that DUNSTON has a reputation for being drunk and stated that he is doubtful that any information DUNSTON should furnish would be reliable.

On 4/10/68, FREDERICK LEON DUNSTON, Columbus County Jail, advised that at about 7:00 p.m., on 4/9/68, he again observed the unknown white male who had admitted killing Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., riding in a 1962 Ford Galaxie, beige in color, occupied by two other persons, near Smith Restaurant, on 701 By-Pass, Whiteville, N. C., travelling south.

DUNSTON advised that HENRY BENNETT was with him at the time he observed this car, and he advised BENNETT that a friend of his was in the car.

DUNSTON advised that shortly thereafter, he was apprehended by the Whiteville, N. C., Police Department and placed in the Columbus County Jail. DUNSTON advised that he attempted to call the Attorney General in Washington, D. C., and advise him of the above information; however, he was unable to complete the call.

DUNSTON viewed the artist's sketch of KING's assasin and advised that this photograph appeared similar to the unknown person who admitted killing KING; however, he would be unable to recognize this man from the sketch.

On 4/10/68, DENNIS WILLIAMS, Jailer, Columbus County Jail, advised that DUNSTON was placed in the Columbus County Jail at about 7:30 p.m., on 4/9/68, and attempted to make a telephone call to the Attorney General in Washington, D. C., and attempted to make a telephone call to Raleigh, N. C. However, he was in such a drunken state, he was unable to complete the telephone calls.

On 4/10/68, SARAH MOORE, Route 5, Box 150, Whiteville, N. C., advised that FREDDY DUNSTON, his wife and two children rent a room in her house. She stated that FREDDY DUNSTON has been in and out of the house for the past four or five months and has a reputation for drinking and being arrested for public drunk.

Mrs. MOORE advised that she was at her residence on 4/8/68, when DUNSTON allegedly was contacted by the unknown white male and stated that she was not aware of anyone being at her residence and does not believe that there was anyone there as she would have known. She further advised that she does not have any out buildings behind her house where DUNSTON could have hidden the unknown white male.

Mrs. MOORE advised that DUNSTON is unreliable and does not believe that any statement obtained from DUNSTON would be of value or reliable.

On 4/10/68, JOHN W. BENNETT, Funeral Director, Peoples Funeral Home, 405 South Memory Street, Whiteville, N. C., advised that FREDERICK DUNSTON and his brother, HENRY BENNETT, are both alcoholics and have been drinking heavily for the past four or five days.

BENNETT advised that any information received from DUNSTON or from his brother, HENRY BENNETT, would not be truthful as both have been drinking and both are unreliable.

Members of the Whiteville Police Department who were alerted concerning the unknown white male have not observed anyone fitting his description in the vicinity of Whiteville. The officers are not familiar with a 1962 Ford Galaxie, beige in color, and have not seen any car fitting this description in the area.

In view of the above information, it is believed the information furnished by DUNSTON regarding the unknown white male who admitted killing KING is unreliable, and no importance should be placed on this information.

JAMES RODNEY EDWARDS, inmate, Charlotte City Jail, Charlotte, North Carolina, Velephonically contacted the Charlotte Office on April 9, 1968, stating he wished to speak to a special agent regarding the murder of Dr. KING. He furnished the following information:

He had been a member of the Ku Klux Klan for a period of approximately six months. When he first joined, he was brought in by I. R. MISENHEIMER and by BOB WILLIAMS. Subsequently, he left the Charlotte Unit of the UKA and joined what he referred to as the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan in Charlotte. The last meeting he attended was on March 27, 1968, at the residence of (FIRST NAME UNKNOWN) SHERRILL. He stated that SHERRILL was employed by the City Chevrolet in Charlotte, North Carolina.

On Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Monday, of instant week he had received anonymous threatening telephone calls. The telephone calls in substance stated, "Since you are not attending meetings, if you discuss anything that was discussed at the meeting you will be killed and your wife will be killed, and your whole family will be hurt." The unknown caller in each instance, had stated that they had received word that he had been talking.

With reference to the White Knights, EDWARDS stated that he is not familiar with the names of all members; however, SHERRILL is the Exalted Cyclops, MISENHEIMER the Vice President, and FARRELL OSTWALT is the "Clergyman." Meetings are held on Wednesday nights between the hours of 7 P. M. and 10:30 P. M. and are usually held at the SHERRILL residence. He has attended meetings in the past at the rate of approximately two per month.

On March 27, 1968, JERRY LYNCH, whom he also knows as W. W. LYNCH, led this meeting and LYNCH led the discussion pertaining to a march to be held in Memphis, Tennessee by Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. LYNCH spoke of how KING was getting "the Niggers" stirred up and that something was going to be done about it. Arrangements were in the process of being made

to kill KING. From the discussion, EDWARDS learned that the killing was going to take place in Memphis, Tennessee and that the person picked to do the killing was "going to blow that black Nigger's head off." No conversation was had as to what type of weapon would be employed.

At one point during the above meeting on the 27th of March, LYNCH excused himself, left the room, and returned in approximately ten minutes. About two hours later, a man came in dressed in a red robe wearing a white hood which completely covered his head. The only thing that he could remember about this individual when dressed in the robe was the fact that the first two joints of his ring finger were missing; however, he could not remember what hand. The meeting in this instance lasted longer than usual and broke up about 2 A. M. Prior to leaving to go home, he saw this individual with the hood off and stated that he believed he could recognize him if he saw him again in person but was uncertain as to whether he could make him out from a photograph. He described this individual as in his late thirties, dark hair, about five feet ten inches to six feet tall, well built, approximately one hundred eighty pounds, wearing eye glasses.

He recalled that the following individuals were in attendance at the meeting described above:

SHERRILL MISENHEIMER WILLIAMS OSTWALT

An individual who was referred to as FRANK ROSSI (ROSSESS) and ROSSI's brother-in-law whose name is unknown plus an individual identified only as GENE VIBBERT, who lives off the 5100 block of Wilkinson Boulevard, Charlotte, North Carolina.

The brother-in-law of ROSSI was not in the same room where the meeting was held but was in another room in the house. When questioned as to the possibility of the brother-in-law being the individual in the red robe, he said it is possible. EDWARDS appeared to be confused as to the possibility of the unknown subject and ROSSESS's brother-in-law being one in the same although he claimed he had met ROSSESS's brother-in-law in the past and he, therefore, should remember him and be well acquainted with his appearance, particularly facially.

Detective A. J. EUROPA, Charlotte, North Carolina, Police Department, stated it is his recollection that ROSSESS's brother-in-law has part of his little finger missing but does not recall on what hand.

JAMES RODNEY EDWARDS is identical with Charlotte file 25-26588. entitled, "JAMES RODNEY EDWARDS, aka. Jimmy, SSN SSA, 1958." This file reflects that subject was classified 4-F since he had been found to be mentally, morally, and physically unfit for the Armed Forces.




