

RE ERIC STARVO GALT

The following investigation was conducted by SA EDWARD G. SHERIDAN at Hickory, North Carolina:

On April 18, 1968, Trooper HARRY L. WILLIAMS, North Carolina Highway Patrol, stationed in Catawba County, North Carolina, advised that he saw the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT in the newspaper on that date and stated that he is certain that he encountered GALT while conducting a road block in Catawba County on the evening of April 9, 1968.

On the evening of April 9, 1968, WILLIAMS and Trooper MARVIN WRIGHT were participating in a road block check on U. S. Highway 321 at the intersection of North Carolina Highway 10, inside the City Limits of Newton, North Carolina. The road block was set up as a result of the general racial situation following the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. and the purpose of the road block was to locate and confiscate from motor vehicles alcoholic beverages and firearms that might have been in possession of motorists. The road block lasted from approximately 7:30 p.m. until approximately 11:00 p.m.

Sometime between 9:00 p.m. and 9:30 p.m., April 9. 1968, a white male driving a 1955 or 1956 Dodge four-door automobile was stopped by WILLIAMS. WILLIAMS described this automobile as being three-toned, that is, having an off white colored top, a dark green hood and trunk, with a strip of green around the sides, partially on the doors and again having an off white bottom. WILLIAMS did not notice the color of the interior of this automobile. This vehicle was heading north on Highway 321. WILLIAMS specifically remembers that this vehicle was bearing 1968 Florida license with the prefix '10W-." There were four or five digits after the dash but WILLIAMS did not remember these numbers. The white male driving the vehicle was alone and the vehicle was heavily loaded with luggage, having possibly five or six suitcases in the back.

Trooper WILLIAMS stated that in his own mind he has definitely identified the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT

as being identical with this individual he stopped. He stated that there is no doubt in his mind regarding the matter and stated that he would "stake his life on it."

When WILLIAMS stopped this individual, he asked him for his drivers license and registration. The individual there upon presented a valid State of Florida driver's license. WILLIAMS does not remember the name of the drivers license but remembers that it did contain a first, middle and last name. He also noted that the name was uncommon to this area of North Carolina. WILLIAMS stated that this last name was a short name and he believes there were four letters in the last name. WILLIAMS stated that the name could have been "GALT." He stated that if the name was any of the three names of GALT, LOWMYER or WILLIARD, it would have been GALT or LOWMYER.

WILLIAMS stated that he does not remember the street or city address or license number on the drivers license displayed to him. He stated, however, that he specifically remembers that the drivers license listed the driver's occupation as a pilot. WILLIAMS asked the individual what airlines he flew for and the individual gave a name of some not well known airline. WILLIAMS does not now remember the name of the airline given but remembers that the airline had two names to it. He does not remember the individual talking about any cities in Fla. or where he worked.

The individual never did display a registration for the vehicle and the matter of the registration was not pursued by WILLIAMS.

WILLIAMS observed a map folded on the front seat of the vehicle. This map included several southeastern states in the United States. WILLIAMS picked up the map and noted the driver had a route marked out from somewhere in deep central Georgia to Wytheville, Va. WILLIAMS noted that this route marked out constituted almost a straight line. The line ended at Wytheville, Va. WILLIAMS asked the individual where he was going and the individual said he was going on vacation to Wytheville, Va., to visit with some friends or relatives. The individual said he was then going to either Charleston or Bluefield, West Virginia. WILLIAMS

did not remember which of these two towns in West Va. the individual mentioned. The individual did not mention anything specific about his friends or relatives in Wytheville, Va., or Charleston or Bluefield, W. Va., and did not indicate how long he was going to stay at any of these places.

WILLIAMS then instructed this individual how to get on Highway 16 north heading out of Conover, N. C. WILLIAMS advised that the entire conversation took place in about $1\frac{1}{2}$ minutes.

In commenting on the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, WILLIAMS advised that the individual he stopped, whom he believes to be GALT, did not have cheeks as full as are GALT's cheeks in the photograph. He stated that the individual had a face considerably less fleshy than is shown is GALT's photograph. He stated that the individual he stopped had noticeable features in that he had a sharp pointed chin, a long and narrow and pointed nose, and large ears. He also noted that the individual's hair was much shorter than is depicted in GALT's photograph and his hair was brushed straight back. He advised that the individual's face was considerably narrower and longer that is depicted in GALT's photograph.

In describing the individual's composure, WILLIAMS advised that the individual was calm and not excited. He stated that the individual was reserved in his talk, answered questions precisely but did not volunteer information. WILLIAMS described the individual as well-groomed, clean shaven and immaculate in appearance. He stated that the individual gave him the impression that he would be precise in everything he did.

WILLIAMS furnished the following description of this individual from memory:

Trooper MARVIN WRIGHT, who also participated in the road block, advised that he did not talk to the individual stopped by WILLIAMS because he went directly to the car stopped behind the car WILLIAMS stopped. However, WRIGHT described the green in the car WILLIAMS stopped as a faded green. Also, WRIGHT advised, after the individual stopped by WILLIAMS left, WRIGHT specifically remembers WILLIAMS remarking that the license plate on the car was a 1968 Florida license with the prefix "10W-." WRIGHT also remembers WILLIAMS remarking about what a short last name the individual had.

Neither WRIGHT nor WILLIAMS has seen this individual since April 9, 1968.

By teletype dated April 19, 1968, to all offices, the Bureau advised as follows:

JAMES EARL RAY, aka. Earl James Ray, W. C. Herron, Earl James, James Mc Bride, James O'Conner, James Walton, James Walyon, Jim, was determined on April 19, 1968, to be identical with ERIC STARVO GALT. RAY escaped April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri. He was serving twenty years on a charge of armed robbery, first degree, and operating a vehicle without the owner's permission. On July 20, 1967, Federal complaint was authorized and filed charging him with violation of Title 18, Section 1073, United States Code, and a warrant was issued.

RAY has been described as a loner and one of a few close associates has been identified as WALTER TERRY RIFE, suggesting the possibility that RIFE could have been associated with RAY in the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. JR.

Bureau advised that the description of JAMES EARL RAY, as furnished by the FBI Identification Division under FBI Number 306 443 A, is as follows:

By airtel to all Continental Offices, dated April 19, 1968, the Memphis Office advised as follows:

"The FBI Laboratory advised that pillow case and bed sheet found in the trunk of the 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta, Georgia, 4/11/68, contained thermo-seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code '20R-3.' In opinion of Textile Marking Marchine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are fifteen-point type and the last two characters are eighteen-point type. The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in the above code would the lot number, the "R" may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three was for the bundle number

"All Continental Offices will recontact laundries determined to be operating thermo-seal marking machines in an effort to locate laundries using code "20R-3."

LEADS:

Will recontact all laundries using the thermo-seal marking machines to determine if these laundries use yellow tags and if so, whether they use a code identical with "20R-3." If so, it is suggested that samples of the tape with that code be obtained and submitted for comparison with the marking tapes in the Bureau's possession.

Mr. WILLIAMS operates a tire recapping firm on Sandy Porter Road next to Olympic High School. He can be reached at telephone 525-0546. He stated night before last at approximately 10:00 PM, a car parked in the vicinity of his home. Later in the evening WILLIAMS' dogs started barking and he went out to investigate the matter. He said there was a white male in a red Volkswagen parked near his home. He was not able to obtain the whole license plate number, but stated that the numerals and digits he did obtain were as follows: C F 991 He was unable to pick up the last digit. He asked the individual what he was doing there and where he lived, and he stated he worked for a gas line firm which was working in the vicinity of Charlotte on Highway 74. He told this individual to move on and later in reading about captioned matter in the paper, he believes this individual to be ERIC STARVO GALT which is an alias of JAMES EARL RAY. He said the reason he thought it was GALT was because he fitted the general description of GALT, was a neat dresser and pulled on his left ear lobe while talking to WILLIAMS.

Mrs. H. A. HARKEY, postal clerk, East Spencer, N. C., on 4/20/68, advised that TREXLER has resided in East Spencer for several months but she is not personally acquainted with him.

Mrs. M. B. WINGATE, clerk, Town Hall, East Spencer, N. C., advised on 4/20/68, that TREXLER resides at 12 Spencer Street, and has resided there since at least 12/29/67. He is not personally known to Mrs. WINGATE.

On 4/20/68, CHARLES E. HERON, Chief of Police, East Spencer, advised he is familiar with TREXLER inasmuch as he has arrested him several times for drunkenness. No records are maintained by the PD and the dates of arrest are not known.

Re ERIC STARVO GALT

On April 19, 1968, the Bureau telephonically advised that a call had been received from RAYMOND HIGGINS, 300 East Worthington Avenue, Charlotte, North Carolina. HIGGINS works at Mitchell and Becker in the 1900 Block of South Boulevard, Charlotte.

HIGGINS advised he frequents Robertson's Drive-In Restaurant on South Boulevard. He said on the night of April 18, 1968, he observed a man in the restaurant whom he is positive is ERIC STARVO GALT. There was a woman with this individual who spoke with a foreign accent.

He said he followed the couple out of the restaurant to the 1800 Block of South Boulevard where they entered an apartment, possibly at 1821 South Boulevard. He said he has seen photographs of GALT and is sure this individual is GALT. The man's left ear was larger than his right ear.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON at Charlotte, North Carolina:

MOCRE, Extradition Officer, North Carolina Department of Correction, Raleigh, advised on April 18, 1968, that ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS, FBI Number escaped July 12, 1967, from the Haywood County Prison Unit. On April 18, 1968, CAROLYN RUTH WILLIAMS, 1107 Ray Avenue, Sanford, advised she has been separated from ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS since June 14, 1965, and divorced from him since August 26, 1966. She last saw him when he was convicted and sent to prison.

She said about three weeks ago Mrs. FRANK (MARGARET) WIMBERLY, Dunn, North Carolina, WILLIAMS' sister, told her that shortly before Christmas he telephoned another sister, Mrs. EUNICE (Last Name Unknown) who lives in Indiana, and asked her to send him some money. He called from Atlanta, Georgia.

Mrs. WILLIAMS said her former husband is not a member of the Ku Klux Klan but did attend several Klan rallies in Sanford. When he was drunk he often talked about Dr. KING and several times stated he would like to "kill the SOB." She said he is emotionally unstable, has a violent temper, is always fighting and on one occasion threatened a highway patrolman who stopped him for speeding.

The following investigation was conducted by SA VICTOR P. HOLDREN at Sanford, North Carolina:

On the night of April 18, 1968, Mrs. WILLIAMS was shown a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, at which time she stated the photograph was similar but not identical with her ex-husband.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT H. CAVERLY at Dunn, North Carolina:

Mrs. MARGARET WIMBERLY, 605 North General Lee Avenue, Dunn, advised on April 19, 1968, that she is the sister of ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS. She was shown a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT and she stated this photograph, in no way,

resembles her brother. She stated that in October or November, 1967, her brother called a sister, Mrs. GEORGE (EUNICE) SMITH in Princeton, Indiana, asking for money and stated he was calling from Atlanta, Georgia.

Mr. EUGENE HINSON, Starr Route 1, Shallotte, North Carolina, advised that he was owner and operator of South 17 Truck Stop and Restaurant which was located on U.S. Highway 17 south of Shallotte, North Carolina.

Mr. HINSON advised that approximately 8:00 P.M. on April 3, 1968, an unknown white individual whom he described as age about 30, 5'7" to 5'8", 175 pounds, black hair, dark yellowish complexion (possibly Cuban, decent) stocky build, and who wore no glasses, appeared at his restaurant.

Mr. HINSON stated that this unknown white individual was driving an old model Pontiac two-tone white and some other unknown color bearing 1968 Florida license 2W14071.

Mr. HINSON advised that this unknown white individual parked the old model Pontiac in a position to make it hard to observe the license number on this car. HINSON pointed out that this individual went out of his way to back the car in a position where the license plates could not be observed.

Mr. HINSON advised that this individual was wearing green khaki colored pants and shirt and had a couple of suits hanging in the automobile.

According to Mr. HINSON, this individual ordered four orders of french fries, four drinks and four cheeseburgers with lettuce and tomato as well as cigarettes and coffee. He recalled that the bill amounted to approximately \$4.60 and with all of the food ordered, he pointed out that the unknown white individual was the only person that occupied the old model Pontiac.

Mr. HINSON advised that this unknown white individual was at his business establishment for about 45 minutes and stated during this entire time he was talking long distance to some party in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Mr. HINSON stated that the call was made by this individual collect in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and in the conversation unknown individual remarked over the telephone to the unknown party in Philadelphia that he had plenty of ammunition as well as a sawed off shotgun and remarked that he would be careful.

Mr. HINSON advised that this individual remarked to him that he was a Marine stationed at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, but in his conversations, asked how far it was to Wilmington and Jacksonville and Mr. HINSON was of the opinion that this individual should know the distance from Wilmington if he was in the Marine Corps stationed at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, which is near Jacksonville, North Carolina.

Mr. HINSON pointed out that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was shot in Memphis on the night of April 4, 1968, but that he was originally scheduled to speak in Wilmington, North Carolina, on the night of April 4, 1968, but that Dr. KING's plans were changed due to racial disturbances in Memphis, Tennessee.

Mr. HINSON stated that he was of the opinion that if this individual had planned to shoot Dr. KING, he would in all probability had planned to do so at Wilmington, North Carolina, and thought if Dr. KING's plans were changed that then this individual might possibly drive to Memphis, Tennesse, knowing that Dr. KING was there.

Mr. HINSON stated that this is the only time he has ever seen this individual and that he could furnish no additional information about this person. HINSON stated that he tried to overhear more of this individual's conversation with the unknown party in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, but every time he got near this person talking on the phone, the male unknown individual would then order another cup of coffee or a pack of cigarettes which would require Mr. HINSON leaving that immediate vicinity in order to get these items.

It was determined over the facilities of the North Carolina Highway Patrol on April 15, 1968, that 1968 Florida license 2W14071 was issued for a 1956 Pontiac Coupe in the name of WILLIAM D. WILLIS, 902 9th Street South, Jacksonville Beach, Florida.
