On 4/23/68, Mrs. MANY LEWIS 1413 West Walnut Ave., Castonia, N. C., (Frotest Identity), advised that she learned from a reliable source that on 2/1/68 KENNETH WAYNE MELTON, 1315 Dan St., Bogalusa, Ia., departed Bogalus, allegedly to go to work on a boat at Pascagoula, Miss. She is not certain if MELTON did go to work on a boat but she knows that he never has worked on a boat in the past and has never had any gainful employment to amount to anything in recent years. He has been in trouble with law enforcement authorities in the past and less than a year ago shot and killed a white male, name unknown, at Bogalusa, Ia., and as far as she knows, has never been tried for same as of this time. She learned that he returned to Bogalusa about 10 or 12 days ago where he is presently staying. She said that her source wondered why he did not return to his employment which was allegedly fon a boat. MELTON is a relative of her husband, BUDDY IEWIS, who resides at 1311 Dan St., Bogalusa, La., with his sister, OLA MAE HAIRIE. Mrs. LEWIS and her husband are presently separated.

Mrs. LEWIS also advised that she learned from her source that MELTON always has a large sum of money in his possession, which seems very strange since he had no gainful employment to account for this. She does not know if he is a member of any hate group but that he would be capable of killing MARTIN LUTHER KING and might have done so if paid enough. She described MELTON as follows:

Mrs. LEWIS went on to say that about six years ago and she believed it to be 1961, a Negro male was murdered at Poplarville, Miss., and thrown into a small river near there. The river separates Mississippi and Louisiana at that point and is near Bogalusa, Ia. She believes there were six white males who went to a jail at Poplarville, beat and abducted the Negro prisoner from his cell. The Negro had been accused of raping a white woman in the State of Mississippi. She further advised that none of the six whites were ever arrested and she does not know if any of the six were Klansmen. She said that she knows the identity of two of the boys who were involved at the time. One was a white male by the name of TERRY MERRING. are 23. of Bogalusa, Ia. She declined to name the other male at that time since he is a fried of one of Mer daughters who is presently visiting in Bogalusa, La. She said that she would disclose this name after her daughter's return to Gastonia. N. C.

She further advised that HERRING has had psychiatric treatment as a result of being bothered by the murder in which he participated. He admitted taking part in this murder and named the other boy whomshe knew, but declined to identify at this time. She said that she learned from a very reliable source that HERRING had participated in this murder and HERRING admitted the murder to this source. She further advised that she never heard that any of these individuals were arrested for the murder or tried for same.

It should be noted that Mrs. LEWIS is obviously referring to the murder involving one MACK CHARLES PARKER which occurred 4/25/58.

About eight or nine months ago, the white male, whom she declined to identify at that time, made a statement before a group of people at a club near Bogalusa, La., that KING, referring to MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was on their list next. She declined to relate where she learned this information but stated she would give further details when her daughters return from Bogalusa, La.

Mrs. LEWIS said that her daughters, VICKIE LEWIS, age 18, and age 16, have been residing at 244 Montgomery St., Bogalusa, La., since 1/68 and VICKIE is employed at J. C. Penny & Co., and GAIL at the Acme Restaurant, both in Bogalusa. They are allegedly returning to Gastonia, N. C., about Saturday, 4/27/68, but she desired that they not be contacted directly until such time as she had an opportunity to ascertain their feelings toward divulging any information that might have come across while residing at Bogalusa, La.

Mrs. LEWIS also stated that her husband's brother-in-law, LAWRENCE MORAN, who lives near the river at Bogalusa is a member of the KKKK. MORAN's wife is BARBARA MORAN, who resides at 1025 Front St., Bogalusa, La.

BO SISK, Patrolman, Forest City, N. C., Police Department, advised on 4/22/68 that JAMES BUMGAIDNER was familiar to him and had called him at SISK's home in Forest City on 4/19/68 from Charlotte, N. C. and advised him that he had just talked to the FBI in Charlotte about the man they are looking for in the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. who is believed to be JAMES EARL RAY. SISK stated that BUMGARDNER sounded as if he was in an intoxicated state when he was talking to him.

SISK stated that BUMGARDNER asked him if he remembered the photograph of RAY that appeared in the Charlotte newspaper as being familiar to SISK.

SISK told BUMGARDNER that the photo did not look familiar to anyone he knew.

SISK stated that BUMGARDNER is originally from Sunshine, N. C., and BUMGARDNER advised him on the phone on 4/19/68 that BUMGARDNER's wife had died last month.

SISK said that BUMGARDNER lived at Miss SMITH's Boarding House, 208 Broadway Street, Forest City, N. C., for two or three months about a year ago and since that time has only been around Forest City two or three times. He said that BUMGARDNER advised him on 4/19/68 that he was now living in Charlotte, N. C. SISK stated that he did not know what BUMGARDNER was referring to when BUMGARDNER said he had on several occasions tried to get the Forest City, N. C., PD to arrest RAY unless BUMGARDNER was referring to ARTHUR WILLIAM STIELOW, FBI #3537208, who was arrested

SISK stated he did not know what BUMGARDNER was referring to when he said that SISK had taken pictures of RAY as SISK said he has never taken any pictures for the Forest City, N. C., PD and has never taken any pictures in the presence of BUMGARDNER for any purpose.

SISK further stated that BUMGARDNER has in the past called the Forest City, N. C., PD asking them to check out different individuals whom he thought were mixed up in crimes of all sorts.



Re Dallas teletype to Memphis and Charlotte dated 4/8/68; Charlotte teletype to Dallas, Memphis and Jacksonville dated 4/10/68 and Jacksonville teletype to Bureau, Memphis, Dallas and Charlotte dated 4/12/68.

Investigation has failed to locate CHARLES NELSON GIBSON. GIBSON has numerous drunk and disorderly arrests by the Dallas PD from 11/67 to the last arrest on 3/22/68. GIBSON was last released from Dallas City Jail 3/27/68. Dallas PD arrests for drunk are not fingerprinted or photographed. Elimination by this means was impossible. Photographs of JAMES EARL RAYE were exhibited to witnesses of the GIRSON arrests and the hotel manager where GIBSON stayed during March, 1968, and GIBSON was eliminated as being identical to RAYE.

On 4/22/68, Mr. JOHN H. WHEELER, President, Mechanics and Farmers Bank, Durham, N.C., advised that morning he had received information from two reputable white male businessmen, whose identities he declined to divulge, to the effect that on Saturday, 4/20/68, sometime between 10:00 a.m. and noon these two men had gone to Henderson, N.C. to consult an attorney. It had been necessary for them to wait and they had gone to a poolroom across the street from the Roses Five and Ten Cent Store for a soft drink. In the back of the poolroom they observed a man wearing a yellow sweater shooting pool by himself who closely fit the published description of JAMES EARL RAY. One of the two businessmen left the poolroom, and when he did so the man in the yellow sweater who had something in his pocket which the remaining man believed was a pistol, rushed up to the remaining man in an excited manner and asked if he knew the man who departed. He asked if he was with the FBI. He left only when he was assured that the man was not a law enforcement official.

This information was furnished the Raleigh RA by radio.

On 4/23/68, FRANK W. SATTERFIELD, JR., N. C. SBI, advised while in court at Hillsborough, N.C., that date, he had talked with C. H. HURLEY, Superintendent of the Orange County, N.C. prison camp. HURLEY related that the prison camp had received a man closely fitting the description of RAY who furnished the name of JAMES YANCEY but otherwise failed to furnish any logical explanation as to his whereabouts for the past month. YANCEY reportedly had not been fingerprinted and had only been in jail for the past four days. He claimed to be from Texas.

CE 44-1365 On 4/23/68, Captain C. H. HURLEY, Orange County Prison Camp, Hillsborough, N.C., advised he had received JAMES CLAYTON YANCEY that morning from Caswell County, where had been convicted 4/22/68 in the county Recorder's Court for Breaking, Entering and Larceny of the church. HURLEY stated he understood there were two auto larcenies pending against YANCEY along with an additional commitment from Guilford County, N.C., for 30 days for no operator's license, which sentence was imposed 4/19/68. HURLEY furnished fingerprints taken of YANCEY that date which were compared with fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY on Identification Order. These fingerprints were found to be not identical. On 4/23/68, JAMES CLAYTON YANCEY was interviewed at the Orange County Prison Camp. He stated he had served in the Army in 1949 for approximately two months, Army Serial Number He then received an undesirable discharge. Thereafter, he served a sentence for ITSMV in the Federal Penitentiary at Atlanta, Ga., which sentence was imposed in USDC, Wilson, N.C. Upon his release from there he had been confined from about 1956 to 1960 in St. Elizabeth Hospital in Washington, D.C. Since that time he had been treated in state hospitals of Md., and Tenn., for spells. In 3/68, he was released from the N.C. State Hospital at Goldsboro, N.C. Upon his release he had gone to Conley, Ga. in an effort to find a sister, Mrs. CLAUDE(RUTH) COOGLER. When he was unable to find her, he had returned to the vicinity of Greensboro, N.C., where he had been sleeping in a station wagon with an unknown individual. He denied having been anywhere in the vicinity of Memphis, Tenn., for many years. Charlotte file 137-3413 entitled "JOHN DENNIS COWELL, aka Jon," reflects that COWELL was opened as a PCI following an interview on 1/25/68 at which time he was employed as a laundry truck driver for the ABC Lauddry and Dry Cleaning Co. at Jacksonville, N. C. At that time he was interviewed concerning any weapons being offered for sale aboard Camp Lejeune Marine Corps Base and he was very cooperative and agreed to furnish the FBI any information that came to his attention re the theft of Government property. At this time COWELL was residing at Route 3, Box 253, in a trailer park in the Southwest Community near Jacksonville, N. C. He was a former United States Marine who had been given a bad conduct discharge for continuous AWOL charges and had remained in the Jacksonville area to work. The last contact with COWELL was on March 29, 1968, at which time he telephonically contacted SA WILLIAM PEARSON at Jacksonville, N. C., and related he had been in Florida, and was attempting to effect a reconciliation with his wife and the fact that the laundry business was very poor in the Jacksonville area due to the increase in prices as a result of the laundry owners having to pay a minimum wage scale to employees.
