He stated on April 4, 1968, he was at his mother's residence in Laurel Hill, North Carolina. He identified his mother as ELOISE CAULDER and his mother can verify the fact that on April 4, 1968, he was with his mother at her residens. Further, on April 4, 1968, he was drinking in McCall, South Carolina. He stated he was at Fonzo Goins Grill in McCall, South Carolina, and this can be verified by bartender BUDDY CLARK.

Mr. SIMMONS advised that McNEILL works the 7:30 A. M. to 4:30 P. M. shift, and reviewed the time sheets for early April, 1968, and advised that on the dates indicated, McNEILL worked the following hours:

April 5 - five hours.

Hr. SILMONS advised that his company works only one-half day on Friday in order to give their employees a long weekend off and pointed out that a good number of their employees live a good distance from Wilmington, North Carolina.



JAMES EARL RAY, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee, sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives." FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Top Ten" list to insure widespread dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to speed his location.

Ray has been intensively sought since the murder of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices were posted, determined that College and Page are identical.

determined that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias of Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful flight to avoid confinement for robbery. His long criminal record also includes convictions for burglary and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders.

A white American, born in Alton, Illinois, on Ray is 5'10" tall, weighs 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes notleeably. Known as a "loner" and "drifter," Ray has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher. He has taken dancing lessons and completed a course at a school of bartending.

Consider Ray armed and extremely dangerous. Report any information concerning him to the nearest FBI office.

CAULDER to come from the kitchen to watch the TV. Phey said several minutes later they saw on TV that KING had died.

MR. and MRS. On April 22, 1968, a Mrs. WILLIAMS telephonically advised that approximately one and one half weeks previously a male cousin of a neighbor and another male individual named JIMMY RAY BUNDY visited a neighbor of hers. The cousin was driving a car bearing North Carolina license. Mrs. WILLIAMS stated that she and her husband thought that BUNDY bore a striking resemblance to ERIC STARVO GALT and that his actions while at the neighbor's home were most circumspect.
