On April 24, 1968, North Carolina Probation Officer AVERY ERVIN advised that POWELL had been with RONNIE CHRISTENBURG and was reported to have returned to that county. He said he has known POWELL for several years and is aware of his family and background. He said POWELL could not be identical with or involved with JAMES EARL RAY in connection with the assassination of KING.

On April 24, 1968, HUGH HUTCHINS, Valdese, North Carolina, Police Department, advised that POWELL is a native of that city, is married to a local girl, and is well known to the police, who have arrested him on numerous occasions. He said POWELL does not resemble in any respect the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY.

By communication dated April 26, 1968, the Richmond Office of the FBI furnished the following information:

Chief of Police ROBERT ELLISON, Colonial Heights, Virginia, advised on April 26, 1968, that he had received a telephone call from EARL DAVIS, Route 1, Box 265, Wilson, North Carolina, telephone number 234-5967. He said that DAVIS desired that he (ELLISON) travel to Wilson, North Carolina and take him (DAVIS) into custody for the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

Chief ELLISON described DAVIS as a white male, about 45 years of age, who is employed as a road grader operator, and who is a heavy drinker. said some time ago DAVIS was employed in the Colonial Heights, Virginia, area and was arrested several times by the Colonial Heights Police Department during that time.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JAMES E. CALLAHAN, JR., at Wilson, North Carolina:

On April 26, 1968, JOHN TEAL, Identification Officer, Wilson Police Department, made available the arrest record for EARL FREEMAN DAVIS indicating numerous arrests from 1945 to date for drunkenness. He was shown as a white male, age 25 (1945), Route 1, Wilson, North Carolina, 5 feet 11 inches tall, 150 pounds, brown hair, and blue eyes.

On April 26, 1968, BERNICE DAVIS, the brother of EARL DAVIS, advised that EARL is presently employed by the S. T. Wooten Construction Company of Stantonsburg, North Carolina. 44-1365-611

On April 26, 1968, Mrs. MCORING, Wooten Construction Company, advised that DAVIS is presently working on a road project in Nash County, North Carolina. She advised that her records show that DAVIS was employed by that company and was at work on April 3, April 4, and April 5, 1968.

EARL FREEMAN DAVIS advised that on April 24, 1968, he made a telephone call to an unknown dispatcher at the Colonial Heights, Virginia, Police Department. He explained that on that date it was raining, and for this reason he did not go to work, and as usual when he is not employed, he got drunk. He said he formerly worked for seven years for the city of Colonial Heights. He denied recollection of any mention of Virginia. the MARTIN LUTHER KING assassination and stated to the best of his knowledge he had never killed anyone in his life. He said he could not recall having made any statements regarding killing anyone and does not recall having spoken to Chief of Police ROBERT ELLISON. He advised he has no information which would assist in identifying the assassin of KING.

By teletype dated 4/26/68, the Columbia Office advised as follows:

For information of Charlotte, NICHOLAS NATHANIEL CAULDER, who resided at Camden, South Carolina, in 1966, was formerly SV 472-R (PROB), CO 48M-4, and RH 294-R. In 1965 he was described as Imperial Klexter of UKA, Inc., KKKK, and was dropped as an informant when he left the Klan. He told a Special Agent in 1965 that he hated Negroes and would gladly take part in the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which information was reported to the Bureau.

CAULDER's last known address in February, 1967, was Route 1, Laurel Hill, North Carolina. Charlotte was instructed to conduct investigation to determine if CAULDER might be indicated as a conspirator in the assassination of KING.

The following investigation was conducted at Charlotte, North Carolina:

On April 24, 1968, Lieutenant C. Y. ROSS, Charlotte Police Department, advised that NICHOLAS NATHANIEL CAULDER had been arrested by the Charlotte police earlier on that date while in the process of burglarizing Lowe's Eardware Store. He gave his address as Route 1, Laurel Hill, North Carolina, and was driving a 1966 Dodge convertible.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON at Charlotte, North Carolina:

On April 28, 1968, CAULDER was interviewed at the Mecklenburg County Jail, at which time he stated that on April 4, 1968, he was at his mother's residence in Laurel Hill, North Carolina. He said his mother, ELOISE CAULDER, can verify the fact that he was there on that date. He stated he could not recall where he was on March 29 and 30, 1968. He denied killing MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR, or being

a participant in connection with the shooting. He denied purchasing a rifle at Birmingham, Alabama. CAULDER also denied ever making a statement indicating that he would gladly take part in the killing of KING.

On May 2, 1968, Mr. DAN CAULDER and his wife ELOISE CAULDER, mailing address Route 1, Box 228, residence Springfield Mill Village, were interviewed separately and they both advised substantially the same information, which information is as follows:

Their son, NICHOLAS NATHANIEL CAULDER, whom they refer to as "Nick" and "Sonny," had been working as an electrician for the Bryant or Bryan Construction Company on the construction of the Hercules Plant at Wilmington for about one year until he was laid off during the latter part of February or the first part of March, 1968, when he returned to their home to stay and seek employment in the vicinity. He was unsuccessful in getting local employment and he then traveled to an unknown place in the State of Mississippi to get employment at an unknown company. They furnished him sufficient money for his travel to Mississippi, which he performed in his personally owned automobile. He stayed away from home about three days and returned saying that he found

CR 44-1365 CPW:jwr the company employees were on strike and he did not want to cross the picket lines. They could not furnish specific dates on which he made this trip but thought it was during the middle part of March, 1968. They advised that CAULDER was at their home the evening that MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was shot and killed because they specifically recalled that Mr. DAN CAULDER and their son were watching television the evening of April 4, 1968, and shortly after the news broadcast from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m., they saw a special bulletin flash on the screen that KING had been shot and DAN CAULDER and their son called for Mrs. CAULDER to come to watch the television. They said several minutes later they saw on television that KING had died. Mr. and Mrs. CAULDER were emphatic that their son

Mr. and Mrs. CAULDER were emphatic that their son was at their home the evening of April 4, 1968, and stated that he stayed at their home continuously for at least two weeks prior to April 4, 1968, but could not state definitely as to his specific whereabouts on March 29-30, 1968, other than the fact that he was at their home at night on these dates.

They advised their son has never been in trouble before and they are completely heartbroken to learn that he had been arrested in Charlotte for burglary.

They both advised they work at the Springfield Textile Mill near Laurel Hill. Mrs. CAULDER works on the first shift and her husband works on the third shift.

The following investigation at Durham, NC, was conducted by SA CHARLES S. MILLER:

On 4/26/68, HORACE H. HALLETT, Durham, reported that GEORGE E. MC LAMB was still employed by the telephone company but was now in the purchasing dept. Employment records reflected that he was at work at Durham, NC, 4/3-5/68 & worked 9, 10, and 9 hours respectively these dates.

On 4/29/68, HALLETT, supra, advised his records reflected GEORGE E. MCLAMB was currently a division plant supervisor of the Material & Supplies Div. He resided at 2819 Way Cross Rd., Tel #682-2881. Records reflected MC LAMB was born Sampson Co., NC. He was hired by the telephone co. 6/1/53, SSN

He stated MC LAMB was now a part of management & no longer a member of the IBW Union although he was believed to retain a close friendship with the present president of this organization, BUDDY HOLLAND.

HALLETT stated MC LAMB had an excellent work record & no info concerning financial difficulty, instability, or unusual obsessions was noted in file.

On 5/2/68, GEORGE E. MC LAMB, 2819 Way Cross Rd., was interviewed at the General Telephone Co. of Southeast Maintenance Plant. MC LAMB advised he had had no contact whatever with JACK MAYNARD RAY since the previous reported contact in March, 1965.

MC LAMB noted as previously reported he never had in fact had in significant contact with RAY.

He did recall that at that time RAY had made a false allegation that the Citizens Council had tried to hire RAY to assassinate MARTIN LUTHER KING but this had not been true.

MC LAMB stated since that time he, MC LAMB, had discontinued completely his affiliation with Durham County Citizens Council. He never had belonged to any Klan Unit. Also, he had become a part of management & given up all affiliations with the TWU.

MC LAMB stated he had no info whatever concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. As previously stated, MC LAMB stated he was opposed to acts of violence & would not uphold in any fashion the shooting of KING.

On 4/26/68, Det. Lt. RICHARD MORRIS, Durham PD, advised he had made a check of his dept. & none of the officers were aware of any info to indicate that JACK MAYNARD RAY had been in Durham NC over the past 2 years.

MORRIS stated he had requested all officers to contact their informants for info as to the whereabouts of RAY.

On 4/27/68, MORRIS stated officers of the Durham PD had been unable to develop any specific info as to the whereabouts of JACK MAYNARD RAY.

on 4/27/68, CE 1990-C & CE 1772-R were contacted for information as to whereabouts of RAY with negative results.

On 4/30/68, ED MARKS, 1841 Vale St., advised he understood JACK RAY had previously resided at that address with his sister, SUSIE WHITT, but that he had not seen or heard anything as to the whereabouts of RAY for well over a year.

On 4/30/68, MELVIN BARBEE, 1810 Vale St., advised he had known JACK RAY for many years as the brother of his next door neighbor, SUSIE WHITT. BARBEE stated he had last seen RAY in about 1965. He said that the FBI had talked to RAY at that time & immediately after this, RAY had left Durham without notice stating he was never going to come back.

CE 44-1365 BARBEE stated RAY's sister, SUSIE WHITT had moved to the Hocutt Rd. in Durham, NC. but she had recently indicated she did not know RAY's whereabouts. On 4/30/68, SUSIE WHITT, Hocutt Rd, Durham Tel #596-7487, advised JACK MAYNARD RAY was her brother. had not seen him since 1965 when the FBI came to see him. She stated at that time he had been continually drunk. After talking with the FBI, RAY left Durham, stating he was never coming back. He indicated an intention of visiting his wife, MAE RAY MAE HELMS in CE, NC.

Mrs WHITT advised she never knew Mrs. RAY's address but recalls she had worked at the CE Memorial Hospital.

Mrs. WHITT stated her brother would say anything when drunk. She doubted very seriously any intention on his part She noted further that he was born over 55 years to harm anyone. ago & no one would mistake him for being under 45.

On 5/3/68, CE 1990-C & CE 1772-R advised they had been unable to develop any info as to the whereabouts of RAY.

On 5/6/68, Det. R.D.RAY, Durham PD, advised he had known JACK RAY but could furnish no info as to his current whereabouts. The only relative he knew RAY to have was his sister, SUSIE WHITT & she denied any knowledge as to his whereabouts. noted that when JACK RAY had previously been in Durham in 1965 he had been suspected of getting his nephew, the son of SUSIE WHITT, in trouble. JACK RAY himself was regarded as a drunk.

RAY stated the Durham PD records reflected RAY, Durham PD #9865, had FBI 864 684, & was born in Franklin Co., N.C.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EDWARD J. BRENNAN and SA EMANVEL R. JOHNSON in an effort to locate JACK MAYNARD RAY:

AT CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA

Records of the Charlotte Police Department were reviewed and numerous references to RAY were located. Lead information from these records were obtained. The records reflected residences of 1915 Thomas Avenue and 1919 Thomas Avenue, and employment at Renfrow Distributing Company. SA CRAWFORD F. WILLIAMS advised that his wife was MAE RAY, thee Helms, and had been employed at Charlotte Memorial Hospital.

Neighborhood investigations reflected that Mr. RAY had last been seen in the Charlotte area some four years prior to 1968.

Mrs. SUZIE HUFFMAN, Secretary to the Personnel Director of Charlotte Memorial Hospital, advised that she could locate no record for MAY RAY, nee Helms as an employee of the Hospital.

Mrs. ANNE HOWELL. Medical Records Librarian, advised the only record of a patient named MAE HELMS which might in any way be connected with one MAE HELMS in this matter, expired in April of 1963. She had a former address of 1619 Parsons Street, Charlotte. Neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of that location revealed that this particular MAE HELMS had never been married to JACK MAYNARD RAY.

Police Records reflected that JACK MAYNARD RAY had been confined at Wilmuth Hospital; therefore Mrs. BONNIE KNOWLES, Superintendent of Nursing, was contacted at Wilmuth Hospital, an Alcoholics Anonymous institution. No record of RAY was located; however, Mrs. KNOWLES reported he could have

entered the hospital under any name he might choose to give; therefore, his photograph was circulated among members of the staff and patients, most of whom are repeaters. They related his face was familiar; however, they could not identify him.

A review of Charlotte file 137-509 on JACK MAYNARD RAY revealed that he had advised that he had a wife named FRANCES PREDDY, a nurse, employed at Memorial Hospital. Recontact with Mrs. SUZIE HUFFMAN, Personnel Office, Charlotte Memorial Hospital, revealed no record for FRANCES PREDDY. Mrs. HUFFMAN noted, however, that personnel records are maintained only for five years.

Company failed to reveal anyone who knew the current whereabouts of RAY. Mr. JACK RENFROW advised that RAY remarried one MAE HELMS, who worked as a practical nurse. Canvass of all local hospitals revealed that MAE HELMS worked as a private duty nurse at the Wesley Nursing Center; however, her current whereabouts were not known inasmuch as her mother had recently suffered a heart attack and confined to another local hospital. A review of the records of the United States Probation Office at Charlotte revealed RAY listed his in-laws as Mrs. CORA HELMS, 1409 Pecan Street. Inquiry in the vicinity of 1409 Pecan Street revealed that Mrs. CORA HELMS was critically ill in a local hospital having suffered a heart attack. MAE HELMS, her daughter, resides at 1401 Pecan Street, and MAE HELMS was contacted.

She advised that she divorced JACK MAYNARD RAY approximately two years ago and the last contact she had with him was through his sister in Durham, North Carolina, who contacted her in January, 1967, stating that JACK MAYNARD EAY was confined to a hospital in Daytona Beach, Florida, suffering from convulsions. She related he was an alcoholic and she believed he was possibly dead.

RE: JACK MAYMARD RAY

The following investigation was conducted by SA JAMES M. UNDERHILL:

About 11:35 A.M., March 24, 1955, an individual identifying himself only as JACK RAY telephonically contacted the Durham, North Carolina, Resident Agency of the FBI and asked whether information concerning killing of MARTIN MUTHER KING would be of interest. The caller inferred he himself had just finished serving a long prison centence. He declined to furnish his whereabouts or any more details but agreed to come immediately to the Durham Resident Agency, which he failed to do.

About 2:35 P. M., March 24, 1965, an individual identifying himself as GEORGE NC IAMB, telephone repairmen for General Telephone Company of the Southeast, President of the Durham County Citizens Council, and the local Telephone Workers Union, all Durham, North Carolina, contacted the Durham Resident Agency. MC IAMB stated that at about 7:15 P. M. on March 23, 1965, he received a telephone call at his residence from an individual identifying himself as JACK RAY. RAY had said that a former member of the Citizens Council, whose name was not given, gave him MC IAMB's name. RAY, according to MC IAMB, stated he was on his way to Alabama and was wanting the help of the Citizens Council. RAY further said he was calling about MARTIN LUTHER KING and his associates. RAY asked whether the Citizens Council would help him if he were caught after doing what he was going to do.

MC LAMB stated he informed RAY the Citizens Council would not enter into any conspiracy and asked RAY what he intended to do. RAY replied he was going to "bust KING wide open." MC LAMB said he then advised RAY they had nothing to talk about and terminated the conversation.

MC LAMB said he had made some inquiries among members of this Citizens Council at Durham but failed to develop anyone knowing RAY. MC LAMB said he would immediately notify the FBI in the event he was contacted by RAY or received any further information about him.

Efforts through the Durham Police Department and the Durham Credit Bureau to identify RAY were unsuccessful on March 24, 1965.

On March 25, 1965, JACK MAYNARD RAY of 1814 Vale Street, Durham, North Carolina, was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI at Durham. RAY related as follows:

On Tuesday, March 23, 1965, he was at the "Country Kitchen" at Durham, North Carolina, operated by a Mr. GREEN. RAY got in conversation with GREEN and then GREEN introduced RAY to GEORGE MC LAMB, President of the Durham County Citizens Council and the local Telephone Workers Union. MC LAMB took RAY to a car believed to have been a Ford Station Wagon. There MC LAMB expressed hatred of Negroes and asked RAY if RAY would shoot JAMES FARMER, Executive Director of Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) and/or MARTIN LUTHER KING. RAY said he would do so if the price were right and the money was "on the line." RAY claimed MC LAMB asked whether RAY would try to get a shot at KING or FARMER in Selma, Alabama, for \$5000 and said that MC LAMB exhibited a photograph of FARMER.

RAY stated MC LAMB had pointed out it was unlikely that a person shooting either FARMER or KING in Alabama, Louisiana, or Mississippi, would be convicted of any serious crime.

RAY continued that MC LAMB again met him in the station wagon near the "Country Kitchen" on the evening of

March 24, 1965. He mentioned sending RAY to Jackson, Mississippi, to contact an undisclosed person there. MC LAMB also indicated he would arrange to secure a rifle for RAY, since all RAY had was a long barrel .38 caliber Smith and Wesson pistol. RAY said MC LAMB gave him \$20.

RAY acknowledged he was the individual who had telephoned the Durham Resident Agency of the FEI on March 24, 1965, and said he had not kept the appointment because of rain.

RAY stated that he has no intention of harming FARMER or KING and will notify the FBI if he receives any further request along this line.

RAY stated he himself had served approximately 25 years for a robbery in 1942 of a bank in Hyattsville, Maryland. He stated since he was released he has been making liquor in the vicinity of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, and that he recently paid a fine at Charlotte, North Carolina, for public drunk and carrying a concealed weapon, a pistol. During this interview RAY was in possession of a quart bottle of wine with the larger portion of it gone.

The following investigation was conducted at Durham, North Carolina, by SA CHARLES S. MILLER:

On April 25, 1968, HOPACE H. HALLETT, Durham, reported that GEORGE E. MC IAMS was still employed by the telephone company but was now in the purchasing department. Employment records reflected that he was at work at Durham, North Carolina, April 3-5, 1968 and worked nine, ten, and nine hours respectively these dates.

On April 29, 1968, HALLETT, supra, advised his records reflected GECAGE E. MC IAMB was currently a division plant supervisor of the Marerial and Supplies Division. He resided at 2819 Way Cross Road, telephone number 682-2881. Records reflected MC IAMB was born at Sampson County, North Carolina. He was hired by the telephone company June 1, 1953, under Social Security number

He stated MC LAIB was now a part of management and no longer a member of the IBV Union although he was believed to retain a close friendship with the present president of this organization, HUDDY HOLLAND.

HALLETT stated MC LAMB had an excellent work record and no information concerning financial difficulty, instability, or unusual obsessions was noted in the file.

On May 2, 1968, GEORGE E. MC TANB, 2819 Way Cross Road, was interviewed at the Ceneral Telephone Company of Southeast Maintenance Plant. MC TAMB advised he had had no contact whatever with JACK MAYMARD RAY since the previously reported contact in March, 1965.

MC IAMB noted he never had in fact had any significant contact with RAY.

He did recall that at that time RAY had made a false allegation that the Citizens Council had tried to hire RAY to assassinate MARTIN LUTHER KING but this had not been true.

MC IAMB stated since that time he, MC IAMB, had discontinued completely his affiliation with Durham County Citizens Council. He never had belonged to any Klan unit. Also, he had become a part of management and given up all affiliations with the Teamsters Workers Union.

MC IAMS stated he had no information whatever concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. As previously stated, MC IAMB stated he was opposed to acts of violence and would not uphold in any fashion the shooting of KING.

On April 26, 1968, Detective Lieutenant RICHARD MORRIS, Durham Police Department, advised he had made a check of his department, and none of the officers were aware of any information to indicate that JACK MAXMARD PAY had been in Durham, North Carolina, over the past two years.

. MCRRIS stated he had requested all officers to contact their informants for information as to the whereabouts of RAY.

On April 27, 1968, MORRIS stated officers of the Durham Police Department had been unable to develop any specific information as to the whereabouts of JACK MAYMARD RAY.

On April 30, 1968, ED MARKS, 1841 Vale Street, advised he understood JACK RAY had previously resided at that address with his sister, SUSIE WHITT, but that he had not seen or heard anything as to the whereabouts of RAY for well over a year.

On April 30, 1968, MELVIN PARREE, 1810 Vale Street, advised he had known JACK RAY for many years as the brother of his next door neighbor, SUSIE WHITT. EARBEE stated he had last seen RAY in about 1965. He said that the FBI had talked to RAY at that time and immediately after this, RAY had left Durham without notice, stating he was never going to come back.

BARBEE stated RAY's sister, SUSIE WHITT had moved to the Hocutt Road, Durham, North Carolina, but she had recently indicated she did not know RAY's whereabouts.

On April 30, 1968, SUSTE WHITT, Hocutt Road, Durham telephone number 596-7487, advised JACK MAYMARD RAY was her brother. She stated she had not seen him since 1965 when the FBI came to see him. She stated at that time he had been continually drunk. After talking with the FBI, RAY left Durham, stating he was never coming back. He indicated an intention of visiting his wife, MAE RAY, nee MAE MEMBS in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Mrs. WHITT advised she never knew Mrs. RAY's address but recalls she had worked at the Charlotte Memorial Hospital.

Mrs. WHITT stated her brother would say anything when drunk. She doubted very seriously any intention on his part to harm anyone. She noted further that he was born over 55 years ago, and no one would mistake him for being under 45.

On May 6, 1968, Detective R. D. RAY, Durham Police Department, advised he had known JACK RAY, but could furnish no information as to his current whereabouts. The only relative he knew RAY to have was his sister, SUSTE WHIRT, and she denied any knowledge as to his whereabouts. RAY noted that when JACK RAY had previously been in Durham in 1955, he had been suspected of getting his nephew, the son of SUSTE WHITT, in trouble. JACK RAY himself was regarded as a drunk.

RAY stated the Durham Police Department records reflected RAY, Durham Police Department number 9865, had FBI number 864 684, and was born in Franklin County, North Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EDWARD J. BRETHAM and SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON in an effort to locate JACK MAYMARD RAY:

AT CHARLOTTE, HORTH CAROLINA

Records of the Charlotte Police Department were reviewed and numerous references to RAY were located. The records reflected residences of 1915 Thomas Avenue and 1919 Thomas Avenue, and employment at Renfrow Distributing Company.

Neighborhood investigations reflected that Mr. RAY had last been seen in the Charlotte area some four years prior to 1968.

Mrs. SUZIE HUFFMAN, Secretary to the Personnel Director of Charlotte Memorial Hospital, advised that she could locate no record for MAE RAY, nee Helms as an employee of the hospital.

Mrs. ANTE HOWELL, Medical Records Librarian, advised the only record of a patient named MAE HEIMS which might in any way be connected with one MAE HEIMS in this matter, expired in April of 1963. She had a former address of 1619 Parsons Street, Charlotte. Neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of that location revealed that this particular MAE HEIMS had never been married to JACK MAYMARD RAY.

Police records reflected that JACK MAYNARD RAY had been confined at Wilmuth Hospital; therefore, Mrs. BCHNIE KNOWLES, Superintendent of Nursing, was contacted at Wilmuth Hospital, an Alcoholics Anonymous institution. No record of RAY was located; however, Mrs. KNOWLES reported he could have entered the hospital under any name he might choose to give; therefore, his photograph was circulated among members of the staff and patients, most of whom are repeaters. They related his face was familiar; however, they could not identify him.

Contact with personnel of Renfrow Distributing Company failed to reveal anyone who knew the current whereabouts of RAY. Mr. JACK REMPROW advised that RAY remarked one MAE HEMMS, who worked as a practical nurse. Canvass of all local hospitals revealed that MAE HEMMS worked as a private duty nurse at the Wesley Mursing Center; however, her current whereabouts were not known inasmuch as her mother had recently suffered a heart attack and confined to another local hospital.

A review of the records of the United States Probation Office at Charlotte revealed RAY listed his inlaws as Mrs. CORA HERMS, 1409 Pecan Street.

Inquiry in the vicinity of 1409 Pecan Street revealed that Hrs. CORA HEMIS was critically ill in a local hospital having suffered a heart attack. HAE HELMS, her daughter, resides at 1401 Pecan Street, and MAE HELMS was contacted.

She advised that she divorced JACK MAYMARD RAY approximately two years ago and the last contact she had with him was through his sister in Durhan, North Carolina, who contacted her in January, 1967, stating that JACK MAYMARD RAY was confined to a hospital in Daytona Beach, Florida, suffering from convulsions. She related he was an alcoholic and she believed he is possibly dead.
