At approximately 4:00 p.m. this date, Supervisor BILL NOLAN, Los Angeles, telephonically advised that investigation Los Angeles has practically proven that the laundry tags in question were produced at the laundry operated by suspect VERNON. He stated that the Bureau has not confirmed this opinion as of today. During the conversation, he advised also that he had just been in telephonic contact with Inspector SULLIVAN, Memphis and during that contact, SULLIVAN received telephonic information from our Atlanta Office that the white Mustang had been recovered abandoned in a housing project, Atlanta, Georgia. He also advised that the Los Angeles Office was in receipt of a teletype from the Bureau to all SACs instructing that APB on the Mustang and GALT be cancelled. It is not known if GALT has been located.

He advised that with regard to VERNON, they have determined that he is on probation in Los Angeles and according to the probation report, he was working at Lockheed on April 4. A check with Lockheed reveals they have never employed VERNON. It is attempting to locate the probation officer and VERNON. He also advised that he had received information that a positive identification has not been made, however, the Bureau has given indications that the handwriting of GALT and that of LOWMEYER are very similar.

APB on GALT and Mustang was not placed Chicago based on the above information.

Background information was furnished by SAC ROBERT JENSEN, Memphis on 4/11/68 in the PM. He advised that the White Mustang in question had been abandoned at a low cost housing project parking area in Atlanta on Friday, 4/5/68. He further advised that immediately after the assassination there was an anonymous radio call from a car "190" advising that the white Mustang was seen departing in a different section of Memphis. This has been checked out and verified that there was no Mustang in this section inasmuch as there were three radio cars in the vicinity where the Mustang was reported to be seen.

With regard to the plyers found in the blue suitcase reported to be abandoned by the subject, they had a sales tag for the Rummage Hardward Store, Los Angeles attached to them and this hardware store was located approximately 5 blocks from where the wearing apparel of the subject with laundry marks had been cleaned.

Supervisor EDWARD KASSINGER, Atlanta telephonically advised that preliminary inspection of the recovered Mustang revealed it had a Ford commercial radio and located in the trunk of the car were two halfs of white styrofoam packing measuring 8 x 12 x 5. He further advised that the radio dial may be a dummy, however, processing had not been completed thus far to determine such.

On 4/12/68, at 8:00 AM, Supervisor KASSINGER and SAC HITT advised that the styrofoam had been flown to the Laboratory, arriving there approximately 5:00 AM this date and that measurements of the impression in the stryofoam could be obtained from the Laboratory. He also advised that the search of the car revealed it to be very "clean". The only other articles found in the car was a camera shutter release purchased from the Electric Camera Store and the package which was a cellaphone bag contained the make name of Prinz, made in Japan. In addition was located the top of a Kleenex box with the name of two women plus phone numbers in LA. This lead is being covered by LA.

Following background information concerning this case has been obtained through conversation with the various field offices:

Supervisor BILL NOLAN telephonically advised at 9:35 AM with respect to LA teletype dated 4/12/68, time 5:21 AM, ANITA KATZWINKEL had been located in LA living common-law with THOMAS HUNTER. He advised that she was currently being interviewed, however, she denies any knowledge of or association with GALT. She further advised that GINGER referred to in referenced teletype is known as GINGER CUNNINGHAM, GINGER DAY, GINGER NANCE and Mrs. KENNETH NANCE. She advised that GINGER has been residing in Dixon, Illinois since the latter part of June. GINGER's mother is Mrs. YOHN who resides in a trailer park on the outskirts of Mendota, Illinois.

He further advised that on the piece of Kleenex box recovered from the left rear well of the Mustang there was additional writing, namely, "Oklahombe" and "at pool". He advised that ANITA has informed them that she and GINGER resided in apartment 6 (which is the same apartment occupied by GALT) for three weeks during 6/67. It is noted that GALT is reported to have rented the same room beginning 11/67. ANITA has no information as to how the recovered piece of kleenex box ended up in the Mustang.

He also advised that handwriting specimens may be obtained from GINGER and these handwriting specimens should conform to the information contained in referenced tel noting that the address 1535 Surano is misspelled as the correct spelling is Serrano. ANITA was desdribed as 5' and fat and particular note is the fact that GINGER is described as 5'6", 175 lbs., and both women reportedly make their living associating with migrant farm workers.

Supervisor EDWARD KASSINGER telephonically advised that inspection of the car revealed it contained a Mexico Tourista sticker #H294486 dated 10/67, Laredo, Texas. This indicates GALT entered Mexico latter part of October through Laredo, Texas. This is based on the fact that GALT departed his room in Birmingham on 10/7/67 and reportedly entered Laredo 10/30/67, going to Mexico. He thereafter appears in Los Angeles on approximately 11/18/67. In addition, on the trunk 1id of the Mustang is a metal nameplate "Marion Ford" no city given.

SAC JOE GAMBLE, Birmingham telephonically advised that he interviewed the landlord of the rooming house, 2608 Highland Avenue South, Birmingham and advised additional description of the package received by GALT is that it was 18 x 12 x 8, wrapped in brown paper with paste stickers attached (not marked fragile) and it may have had a cord binding to lift it as it weighed between 20 and 25 pounds. The package was reportedly delivered by the Post Office Parcel Post during the middle part of 9/67. The landlord advised that he usually signed receipts for his roomers when they obtained packages, however, he is not certain that he did in this instance.

SAC GAMBLE also advised that the scope and rifle were purchased at the same time from the same establishment in Birmingham.

SAC GAMBLE subsequently advised that the postal inspectors had located the insured receipt in Birmingham, signed by the landlord dated 10/4/67. It is partially mulitated and is being examined to determine which postal exchange in Chicago handled the package.

Supervisor MARION WILLIAMS, Laboratory, Washington, D.C. advised that the white styrofoam recovered in the back of the Mustang was a white box designated as specimen Q 105. When the two pieces of the box are together it measures 7" x 8 7/8" x 4 1/16". He advised there are no labels on the box and that the binoculars will not fit the box. He noted that a small transistor radio had been recovered from the suitcase which contained the rifle and plyers and the Laboratory is checking to determine if this styrofoam box could have been for the radio

DANCING SCHOOL AND BARTENDER SCHOOL CONTACTS

Investigation develops that ERIC STARVO GALT attended dancing schools in Birmingham, New Orleans, and California. Bureau has instructed that all dancing schools in each Division be contacted. GALT reportedly signed up for a one-year dancing course in New Orleans in 1964, however, this has not been verified. He did take dancing lessons for several weeks in Birmingham, Alabama, beginning in September, 1967, and reportedly quit to attend bartending school. GALT also took a \$499 dance course from December 19, 1967, to February, 19, 1968, at Long Beach, California.

One dance instructor has stated that GALT is "crazy" about dancing but a poor dancer and difficult to teach because he did not remember instructions. He was described as an introvert who volunteers no information and replies with yes or no answers when asked. He did not mingle with other students and made no efforts to make friends or converse with anyone.

Another dance instructor stated GALT is a good dancer, displayed slight Southern accent, rural characteristics of language and diction, teeth straight and clean, fingernails clean and neatly trimmed; wore gold ring with dark stone; always neatly dressed with suit and shiny slip on type black alligator shoes with thin soles, black hose and wore tie tack and cuff links. He smoked filter cigarettes and had a nervous habit of occasionally pulling at ear lobe. Owner of studio states GALT spoke of Alabama, said he was a merchant seaman; spoke of being in Mexico but did not speak Spanish and spoke English badly; was socially inept, an introvert and a poor dancer because he would not loosen up. Smiled rarely and when he did it was a nervous crooked smile; paid cash for lessons taking a wad of bills from pocket.

ERIC STARVO GALT described as 5'11", 175 pounds, blue eyes, brown hair, born place not given.

GALT may have used the name HARVEY LOWMYER or JOHN WILLARD or any variation of these two names or any other name.

The problem exists that the dance instructors contacted may or may not have been talking about the same individual, but the dance instructor, National Dance Studio, Long Beach, California, who stated that she frequently gave dancing lessons to a Mr. ERIC GALT, describes him as withdrawn, very little background

detail, and was often evasive. Her description of GALT is as follows and is more than likely the better description of the ones furnished above.

She described GALT as Caucasian, male, age about crew cut hair, ears protruded slightly, nose narrow with straight bridge line, eyes blue, had slight Southern accent, rural characteristics, to language and diction, language did not suggest high degree of education, normal pitch and not loud volume, eyebrows normal, medium slight tan complexion, 5'll", 165-170 pounds, teeth were straight and clean, indicated he was single, fingernails clean and neatly trimmed, wore gold ring with dark colored stone, neatly dressed always wore suit coat, shirt and tie, shiny black alligator shoes with thin soles and slip-on type, black hose, and tie tack and cuff links.

She advised she never detected the odor of alcohol on GALT's breath. He smoked filter cigarettes, brand unknown. He had a nervous habit and occasionally pulled one of his ear lobes. She did not know if GALT right or left handed. She had no social contact with GALT outside dance studio.

In addition, several other persons have described GALT smiling rarely and when he did, it was a "nervous crooked smile".

The leads to contact the various dancing schools, Chicago Division, are set forth on 3 X 5 cards. When the lead is covered, the identity of the person contacted, the date, and the name of the Agent contacting should be marked thereon and returned to SA RAMON W. STRATTON. He stated that approximately a week ago he hired a Mexican woman, name unrealled, who resides on a delapidated farm on 159th St. about 2 blocks east of Harlem Ave., in Tinley Park.

BOERSMA stated this woman related to him that early this morning, 4/11/68, before breakfast an itinerant came up to the farm asking for a drink of water. The woman became concerned when instead of going to the well for a drink, he browsed through the barns as if looking for a place to stay. According to BOERSMA, several weeks ago a transient was found in one of the barns and had apparently been there for several weeks unbeknowing to the occupants of the farm.

For this reason and also due to the recent news concerning the hunt for the slayer of Dr. KING, the woman became worried and took her children from the farm and brought them into town. According to BOERSMA the woman thought the intinerant resembled a recreated photo she had seen of the assasin of Dr. KING.

BOERSMA stated the itinerant has not been seen since and the only description he has of the itinerant is that he is a white male.

SAS JON W. HOUSLEY and DANTEL J. HURLEY interviewed MIKE HIGGINS at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Clark and Randolph Street at 11:30 A.M., 4/14/68. HIGGINS furnished the following information:

HIGGINS was en route from Jackson, Mississippi to Chicago via Greyhound Bus. He said a man who resembled the sketch of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING's assassin boarded the bus at Memphis, Tennessee, 5:30 P.M., 4/13/68. He described this person as a white male, age 35, 150-165 pounds, 5'10", medium build, brown hair, small face and narrow nose. HIGGINS further stated that this person wore a sports outfit which consisted of a dark brown jacket and lighter pants. He said the man's hair was neatly trimmed and on the back of his right hand he had a fresh cut. This individual carried an old suitcase. HIGGINS stated that this man sat by himself on the bus and did not talk to anyone. He said when they made a few stops he still stayed by himself and ate by himself. When the bus arrived at the Chicago Terminal, this indivi-MA dual made two telephone calls. He was later picked up by an individual described as a white male, early 30's, 5'5", 135 pounds, who wore a plain shirt and jeans. Sergeant DRANTZ advised that two detectives from the Chicago Police Department interviewed WATSON, whose date of birth is since she reported that she had information concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Sergeant DRANTZ advised that WATSON, who is employed on the 4:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight shift at the U.S. Thermo Plastics Company, 9515 West Winona, Schiller Park, Illinois, was interviewed at which time she related that an employee had a composite picture in his possession who made the comment to her that it resembled a new employee hired on April 8, 1968.

According to DRANTZ, Mrs. WATSON knew the individual only as "WIRT" but that this individual was known to the foreman AL REYNOLDS, who showed the composite photograph to WIRT. WIRT thereupon became nervous and aggitated and on April 12, 1968, after appearing at work for a short period of time he left not to return.

According to the police interview of WATSON, the individual was described as follows:

The various names which have been developed in the MURKIN case were furnished to DAMBRAUSKAS who checked them against the correspondence files of his corporation and also against the parts and complaints correspondence files with negative results.

DAMBRAUSKAS said that the largest electronic suppliers in the Chicago area would be the Allied Radio Corporation, Newark Radio, and Trigger Electronics.

From the size of the box referred to in this investigation DAMBRAUSKAS speculated that same could have been used to ship several of the current shortwave receivers or transmitters produced by the Hallicrafters Corporation.

SCHNEIDER advised the writer that she was a Bell Telephone Company operator and in this capacity She had overheard a conversation of a Caucasian male, talking to a person in Memphis, asking for BILL. The caller stated that he was BILL's driver, but would not leave a name, and instructed the other party to advise BILL that he would be in Toledo, Ohio and for BILL not to divulge his location should he be contacted by anyone looking for him.

The Memphis telephone number called was 683-0840, while no Chicago number was obtained.

The writer has had no previous contact with SCHNE IDER and SCHNE IDER advised that she had obtained the writer's name from a person contacted previously by the writer.

SCHNEIDER requested that her identity not be divulged to anyone, as her employment depended on it.

Mr. GUNNAR RING BURKE, 318 South Harvey Avenue, Oak Park, Allinois, Manager, Superior Bulk Film Company, 442-450 North Wells, Chicago, furnished the following information concerning a mail order received from ERIC S. GALT, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama, for camera equipment on October 3, 1967:

Superior Bulk Film Company, advertises their products in the following magazines:

> Popular Mechanics Popular Science Science and Mechanics U. S. Camera Popular Photography Modern Photography Field and Stream Hunting and Fishing Mechanix Illustrated

The Company does not record the name of anyone requesting a manual or catalogue until an order blank form is submitted by a customer.

On October 3, 1967, the Company received an official order blank which is included as an insert in the order manual from ERIC S. GALT, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama, in which one Kodak Dual Projector M95Z, one Kodak Super 8 Camera, Model M8, one HPI Combination Splicer and one 20 foot remote control cable, totaling \$337.24. A money order cashier's check or draft for \$337.24 was received with the order because records reflect the above equipment was sentout on October 3, 1967, via Parcel Post under invoice number 179530, which is the date the order blank was received. The Company does not, as a Company policy, mail merchandise on an order accompanied by a personal check, unless the person making the order is known to the Company.

The Company substituted, on a loan basis, a Crestline Super 8 Camera for the Kodak Model M8 because the latter was not in stock. The Crestline Camera was received by the Company on October 12, 1967, as a rejected item. GALT also sent a typewritten note dated October 5, 1967, signed ERIC S. GALT in which GALT acknowledged receipt of items ordered adding he was returning the camera sent to him because he ordered a four-speed camera while the substituted camera was a one-film speed camera. GALT also wrote he was to leave for Mexico on Saturday which would have been October 7, 1967, and he would send his Mexican address to the Company.

On October 18, 1967, the Company mailed, via Parcel Post, the Kodak Super 8 D38 camera, under invoice order number 179530, to the Birmingham, Alabama, address. By typewritten letter, signed ERIC S. GALT, the Company was advised GALT returned the substituted Crestline Camera adding he could not wait for the originally ordered Kodak camera. He requested his refund be mailed to Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico, Hotel Rio, Apartado Postal #23. The Kodak Camera was received by the Company on November 2, 1967.

By typewritten letter dated November 20, 1967, signed ERIC S. GALT, the company was requested to mail GALT's refund for the rejected camer to 1535 North Serrano, Los Angeles, California 90027, because GALT did not receive his refund while in Mexico. The letter indicated GALT would be at the Los Angeles address for five months.

The Company by letter dated November 30, 1967, mailed to the Los Angeles address, advised the refund check for \$142.89, #32338, was re-mailed to GALT's Mexican address. The canceled refund check has not, as of March 29, 1968, been received by the company.

The original check in the amount \$337.24 received in payment for the original order from ERIC S. GALT was deposited on October 2, 1967, at the Merchandise National Bank, Chicago, under Superior Bulk Film Account Number 1-54310.

Mr. BURKE had no further information concerning the check.

Mr. BURKE advised the model M-8 camera ordered by GALT has a forty millimeter zoom lens included and added it is a very fine piece of equipment as is the other equipment ordered.

Mr. BURKE stated that the fact that inquiry was made concerning an automatic printer would indicate the person buying this equipment probably has raw stock-film and has means to process same. The fact that sound strip apparatus was also a point of inquiry on the reverse side of GALT's initial order indicates sound would also be employed.

The Crestline Camera for which the refund check was mailed to GALT is the only portion of the initial order which has been returned to the company.

Mr. BURKE asserted that he received a telephone call on October 4, 1967 or October 5, 1967, between the hours of 8:00a.m. and 9:00 a.m., from a man identifying himself as ERIC GALT. GALT advised he could not wait for the Kodak camera and that he is returning the one sent to him, referring to the Crestline Camera. GALT added he would purchase another camera locally. BURKE felt that GALT specifically wanted a Kodak Camera inasmuch as he returned a very fine camera, namely the Crestline. BURKE added he recalled the voice was from the South, meaning the person calling had a Southern accent.

Mr. BURKE made available a remote control PRINZ Air Shutter Release with a 20 foot cable, which is similar to the remote control cable sent to GALT. Mr. BURKE also made available a blank Superior Bulk Film Company check drawn on the Merchandise National Bank, Chicago, which is similar to the refund check sent to GALT. The check would be signed either ARTHUR FLANK or GUNNAR R. BURKE
