Enclosed herewith are seven (7) copies of an Lill dated and captioned as above. One copy has been furnished to Secret Service locally!

Chicago and Atlanta indices and Identification Division files contain no information identifiable with LELLY. Neither Chicago or Atlanta have any information indicating Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING or associates have ever utilized professional chauffeurs in their travels.

The information developed indicating a possible danger to the President was furnished to Secret Service, Chicago, on 9/21/66, and they have been furnished all information developed since that time. They have advised that they will probably reinterview KELLY WILLIAMS and conduct additional inquiry on him as a possible visitor to the White House.

There does not appear to be any violation of the assaulting the President statute and WILLIAMS has not made threats to any public officials. In view of his apparent mental problems, coupled with serious doubts cast on his veracity, no further inquiry is contcaplated and this case is being closed.

About five weeks ago Villians called Hrs. Eattic Delocation. Mrs. Emptation's mather, at the Hundreter apartment and asked to apeak to Hrs. Equatadion. When informed she was not hose, he told Hrs. Solomen that he was working as a chauffeur for Dr. Kartin Luther King and drove one of his several air-consitioned Calffics. He said he had no permanent address as he tost traveling all ever the country with Dr. Hing and was cut of town nest of the time! He meaticaed he was well paid and handled large sums of money for Hing.

Sometime later Williams called again and spoke with Mrs. Kunstadter: He told her he was calling from a pay phose and it was difficult for his to talk as he was being watched constantly. This surveillance was a result of his laving learned so many things and Mrs. Kunstadter assumed he meant from Dr. King and his associates. He said terrible things were going to happen and the lives of the President, Sonator Dithoen and all of the friends one loved were being threatened. He wanted to give the information he had in detail to the President or Senator Dithuen and sabod Mrs. Supstadter to arrange for a meeting with either of them. He seich her not to notify the police and said he could not come to her home or the Senator's office because of the surveillance on his.

Williams again said he had no residence in Chicago where he could be recthed and gave Nrs. Numerotion the base, address and telephone maker of his elector and asked that messages be left there as he was in town. Mrs. Knastedter wrote the ciater's name on her phone pad as Nettic Tarrie, 9810 South Vallage, Chicago, telephone ISS-1982.

Immediately on termination of the above plone call. Wrs. Eusstadter called him Olson in Senator hirksen's Office and related the substance of the call to her. Mrs. Auestadter them called Mrs. Nurvis and caked herif Williams was having any mental problems. Mrs. Earris said the did not know of any problems in this regard.

The Iclowing day, Mrs. Minstalter recolved another call from Williams and he maid he would neet Mr. Reinville of Senator Dirkson's Office, Mrs. Mustadtor or her husband, Dr. Eunstadtor and furnish them with further details. He said he would talk to them only in his car as he drove around the city. She agreed to try to set up a meeting for Williams with Mr. Relaville.

Mr. Dainvillo was out of town at the time of the above calls and on his return a day or two later, Twn. Munatadier disconsed the calls with him. She then called Are. Harris and left with her Hr. Mainville's telephone number with the request that Williams get in touch with him.

On Soptomber 21, 1985, Edna C. Dison of Senator Dirkson's Office stated that the first phone call from Villians to Jim. Henstadter must have been about August 31, 1985, as Mrs. Olson left on vacation September 1, 1986, and was neare of the call before she left. The case date Enrold E. Rainvillo adviced that be has not heard anything from Helly Villians.

On September 20, 1866, Dr. Nalph H. Nanstadtor was contacted at his office, Suite 610, 654 Morth Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Elimois. He exid be know nothing about the phone calls from Williams other than the identation related to him by his wife. He did confirm that Williams had syphilis of the central nervous system about 10 years ago. Dr. Eunstadter acranged for Williams to get treatment for this condition from Dr. Louis D. Loshes, a specialist in this field. Dr. Kunstadter mid this disease very often affects the mind, but he did not feel as though he could give an opinion of Villiams' mental condition at the present time.

KELLY WILLIAMS

On September 20, 1986, Dr. Louis D. Boshes, Medical Doctor, with offices at 20 Worth Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Itlinois, advised he has been a physician and friend of the Ralph H. Kunstadter family for many years. Dr. Boshes stated Helly Williams, the Eunstadter chauffeur, was referred to him for a diagnosis in October, 1981, by the Eunstadter family.

Dr. Doshes advised he was not acquainted with Williams prior to this occasion. Williams' disease was diagnosed as neural syphilis. Williams was hospitalized for one week during which time the diagnosis was verified through entensive medical tests. Dr. Epshes stated neural syphilis attacks the spinal cord and central perve system. The result of the disease is a deterioration of the brain.

Dr. Boshes stated he continued to treat Williams for the disease and in December, 1962, Williams began to have serious eye deficiency as a result of the disease. Treatment was continued by Dr. Boshes to November 7, 1963, which was the last time Williams was seen by Dr. Boshes.

Dr. Boshes stated the progression of the disease was beginning to accelerate on the last octasion he saw Williams. Dr. Boshes related a "paramoid" complox is a very common result of the disease. Dr. Boshes stated he has not seen Williams since November of 1988, but enough time has elapsed for his status to have degenerated to that of a paramoid. When that stage is arrived at its basis symptom manifests itself by the patient having delusions which he is convinced are fact and which he will earnestly relate as factual situations.

On September 21, 1966, Mrs. Nettie Harris, Williams' sister, 9810 South Wallace, Chicago, Illinois, advised she sees Williams personally on a very irregular basis and last saw him in person about January of this year. She claimed she did not know his present location and has had only one phone call from him in the past month. On that occasion Williams said he was expecting a phone call from his former employer, Mrs. Bunstadter, and that she would leave a message for him. He has not been in contact with her since that time.

Mrs. Harris said she did not know of any employment Williams has had since leaving the Eunstadters and knew nothing of his recent travels or activities.

Williams told Mrs. Harris that he had a "stroke" about a year ago and this was the reason for his retirement. She know of no other physical or mental problems he has had.

KELLY VILLIAMO

On September 21, 1966, Elector Watkins, 3538 South Parkway, Chicago, Kilinois, advised that he has known Kelly Williams as a fellow professional obsuffeur for about 20 years. He last say him three or four months ago at which time Williams told him he was retired and that he was going to Los Angeles, California, to be a prophet. Based on the discussion he had with Williams at that time, Watkins is of the opinion that Williams is mentally disturbed. His conversation was vague and he had a "far away" look in his eyes when he discussed his plans to go to California. He had no idea of Williams' present whoreabouts.

On September 21, 1966, Mr. Mennoth W. Putnam, Personnel Manager, Formfit Corporation, 5150 West Moosevelt Road, Chicago, Illinois, advised records of the concern reflect that Kelly Williams, a Negro male, was employed from May 6, 1955 to April 2, 1965, as a "handyman" at the plant. Williams birth was listed as born in 1900 in Alabama. Williams' Social Security Number was while employed by Formfit. Williams' residence addresses, all in the City of Chicago, were listed in the following order for the years 1955 to 1965, but the exact year of residence at these addresses was not indicated:

5730 South Michigan Avenue, Apartment No. 3 5534 South Wabash Avenue, Apartment No. 2 5612 South Michigan Avenue, Apartment No. 2 9310 South Wallace Street

Mr. Putnam stated he has been personally acquainted with Kelly Williams for a number of years. He related Williams has been employed as a chauffour for the Kunstadter family for many years. The Kunstadter family founded the Fornfit Corporation.

Mr. Putnam advised Williams' employment at Formfit was actually improvised and not an employment in the true sense of the word. A job was simply made available to Williams when he was not actually engaged in driving for the Eunstadter family and during extended periods when the family members were out of the city.

Mr. Putnam related the Kunstadter family terminated Williams' chauffeur services in 1965, because Williams boalth failed to the extent it was not believed he could safely drive an automobile. Mr. Putnam stated Williams was affiliated with a neural disorder of some kind that affected his handamand legs. Mr. Putnam stated

Williams was a "Damon Hungon character". Williams had a "bep" vay of empressing himself and related wild experiences which were obviously false and exected colely in the eva mind.

Or. Putness advised during Villians' engloyment at Formit be ver credited vith little over \$1,000 in the employment profit participation plan. Williams became entitled to this messey on his being finally terminated by the company. Decruse of Williams' known intemporability with memor, he was not to be paid the fundated bim, from the profit participation plan, in a large sum. Villiams has been paid at four mosth intervals. Williams' last check, in the amount of a little over \$190.00 was maited to him on September 15, 1806, at 0210 fouth Wallace Street, Chicago, which is milegedly the address of his stater Wes. Hettle Barris.

Nr. Putnon advised that Williams phoned him on September 15, 1886, loguiring of the check. Williams stated he has been driving for a Reverend Endelworth (phonesia), who Williams identified as being involved in the Chicago Civil Rights Movement. Williams further related he and his sister Wrs. Wattle Barris were about to be evicted from his cister's beas at 8310 South Wallace Street, and they needed the noney from his check to "Noop the landlord from throwing them into the etreet". Mr. Putnam stated he assured Williams his check had already been mailed to him and he should receive it at his sister's recidence.

Wr. Rituan concluded he has not heard from Williams where their phone conversation and accure Williams received his chack.

Eally Villians was contacted on September 22, 1886, in the third floor rear apertment at 8834 South Webmah Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. He stated he rests a room from Jorry Villians (no relation) who is the estual resident of this apertment. He has remided at this location for about two years. He has use of the apertment tolephose, 493-1444, and has an extension of the phone on his benefice table.

It was appreximately 2:00 Pir when Williams was contacted and at that time he was attired in pajaros and bothsche. We waiked with a shuffle and was colloably stooped. He said although he had difficulty walking he could operate an automobile estimaterily. We attributed his trouble to a "stroke" which he had about a year ago. He was not hespitalized at that time, but was in bed in the apartment for several days. He was treated for this "stroke" by Dr. T. H. Lavless.

No related that several mouths upp he was approached by another Chauffeur, whole mane he dues not know, and schod if he vanted a job driving some esonie out of town. He said he was interested and who later called at his residence to deet some men at the directly after which he drave thou exound in a reated our. Thereafter, he received calls occasionally telling him to report at specified locations for chariforning fold. He draws them around Chicago and to various other cities in the United Littes. He drove different men, both white and colored, none of whom he can identify. They told him they were connected with the civil rights movement, but lused on their convergations, overheard by him, be did not believe they were sincepe supporters of this movement. Bather they appeared to be trying to further their wen sine and offered him large come of metry to organizestreet gange and otart trouble. No declined to do this and as a result is closely watched by these people. He declined to furnish any more details regarding the information he overheard when chauffuoring these corbons and said he would talk only to the President of the United States. It was explained to Williams that the President is an outrepely busy man and relies on others, in this case the interviewing agents, to obtain information for him. He remained adminst in his refused to further discuss the information and said that if "They" found out he was talking to the FMI his life would be in denger. He said "Millers are on my trail" and reitorated that he is being constantly vatched. He told the agents if they would arrange for the Prostdont to see him the President in turn would consend the agents and make then "Dis Mon".

Villians was asked why he did not give Mrs. Eunstadier his true residence address and phone number and he said he was out of town so often that he could not be reached at his apartment very often. He claimed he was gone for about two weeks after his discussion with her.

Villags infrued the agents that he is a "Prophet" and in this capacity he tries to help young people with their problems. He exhibited a business card which he carries which states at the top "no fees". The center portion states, "Prophet Relly Williams "When your Problems are Heavy and Your Troubles are Heap' - - See 'The Prophet' " The bottom of the card had the telephone number DOrchester 3-9212 and the address 5730 South Michigan, Brd sportment, printed thereon. This latter printing was crossed out and the phone number 453-3444 with the address 5534 South Wabsh Avenue, had been written in.

RYLLAY WILLIAMS

A delayed cortificate of birth filed July 21, 1944, was exhibited by Williams, blooking his date of birth as March 7, 1940, in Montgowery, Alabama. We do showed correspondence giving his possion as \$103.00 per posts. He even a 1863 Chevrolet with 1966 Illinois license AFIV48.

The following wo attended Mr. BARR's party were contacted on April 26, 1968:

BRIAN DUFF stated he had no recollection of any conversation concerning a chauffeur of KING. DUFF gave the following seating arrangements for the persons at this party and this listing goes from left to right:

Senator BENNETT, Mrs. VIRGINIA MC DONALD, Mr. ALLEN MC DONALD, BETH GUYER, BRIAN DUFF, MARA LATSON, CHARLES HOOD, FRANK WOOLLEY, CHARLES BARR and PATRICIA HUTAR.

FRANK WOOLLEY stated he attended the dinner party April 3, 1968, for Senator BENNETT, sat with HOOD on his left and BARR on his right; however, he recalled no conversation concerning Doctor KING's chauffeur.

Mrs. PATRICIA HUTAR advised no person ever worked for her or her husband who subsequently worked for KING and she recalled no conversation at the dinner party for Senator BENNETT concerning KING's chauffeur.

Mrs. PATRICIA HUTAR stated she heard no conversation concerning KING's chauffeur at the dinner party for Senator BENNETT; however, at the reception preceding this dinner party she recalls hearing such a conversation as related by HAROLD RAINVILLE, Administrative Assistant to Senator EVERETT DIRKSEN. It was her recollection that this story was related by RAINVILLE concerning KING's driver and morey maintained by the driver in a bag.

HAROLD E. RAINVILLE, Administrative Assistant to Senator EVERETT DIRKSEN, 219 South Dearborn, Chicago, Illinois, advised as follows:

RALPH KUNSTADTER, Pediatrician, home 900 North Michigan, office 664 North Michigan, office telephone DE 7-4545, Chicago, Illinois, sometime in the past had advised that he at one time employed a man as a chauffeur who subsequently worked for KING as a chauffeur. This man had been required to carry large sums of money in a bag for KING and this man was scared that someone would rob him of this money. This man had been advised by Doctor KUNSTADTER to contact RAINVILLE but this man failed to so contact RAINVILLE.

Doctor RALPH KUNSTADTER, 664 North Michigan, Chicago, Illinois, advised that for several years his family had employed an elderly colored male, KELLY WILLIAMS, as a chauffeur. Approximately 18 months ago this man had been released from his service by KUNSTADTER because of his physical condition which Doctor KUNSTADTER recalled as being syphillis of the brain. Doctor KUNSTADTER stated this person was probably deceased by now as he was over 65 and on Social Security.

Doctor KUNSTADTER stated he later heard this man went to work for KING but he had no recollection of hearing anything to the effect that this man was required to carry over \$200,000 in cash in a black bag at all times for KING.

KUNSTADTER stated that approximately one year or so ago this man had contacted his family and allegedly had some knowledge of threats which had been made against Senator DIRKSEN. Doctor KUNSTADTER accordingly attempted to have WILLIAMS contact Senator DIRKSEN's office concerning this matter.

It is to be noted that in September, 1966, the Chicago Office conducted extensive investigation concerning a similar story concerning a person who allegedly worked for Doctor KING as a chauffeur and who formerly worked for Doctor RALPH KUNSTADTER. This investigation is

set forth in Chicago file 175-4 and letterhead memorandum reporting results of this investigation was directed to the Bureau by airtel captioned, "KELLY WILLIAMS. INFORMATION CONCERNING," on September 27, 1966. No further investigation was conducted at that time concerning WILLIAMS in view of his apparent mental problems coupled with the serious doubts which were cast on his veracity. The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent GERALD E. DWYER:

On April 20, 1968, Chief of Police TED LINICH, Crest Hill, Illinois, telephonically advised SA GERALD E. DWYER of the Joliet, Illinois, Resident Agency, that a Miss PAT ASHWAY, 900 North Center, Joliet, Illinois, home telephone number 727-4285, employed by Joliet Awning Company, 103½ Elsie, Crest Hill, Illinois, had reported seeing an individual resembling ERIC STARVO GALT.

ASHWAY told LINICH that on April 10, 1968, and again on April 18, 1968, she had observed a man employed by the Edmon Brothers General Hauling, 550 North Eastern, Joliet, Illinois, carry away trash from the place of her employment, Joliet Awning Company, 103½ Elsie, Joliet, Illinois. ASHWAY stated that this unidentified white male resembled the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT which she had seen recently in the local Joliet, Illinois, newspaper.

Chief of Police LINICH advised that he had furnished the above information to Detective LEE EVERSON, Joliet, Illinois, Police Department.

On April 20, 1968, Miss PAT ASHWAY, 900 North Center, Joliet, Illinois, was interviewed and advised that on April 10, 1968, and again on April 18, 1968, she observed a white male picking up trash at her place of employment. She stated that this unidentified white male was picking up trash for the Edmon Brothers General Hauling, 550 North Eastern, Joliet, Illinois, and that this unidentified white male resembled the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, which photograph she had seen in the local Joliet, Illinois, newspaper.

Miss ASHWAY stated that she had been relatively close to the unidentified white male and described him as being approximately 30 to 32 years of age, 5'7" to 5'8", 145 to 150 lbs., full, bushy brown hair, and was wearing dark colored sunglasses. She stated that the unidentified subject had no scars or marks and she could recall no further identifying data.

On April 21, 1968, Detective LEE EVERSON, Joliet, Illinois, Police Department, advised SA GERALD E. DWYER that he had personally interviewed JOHN L. EDMON, Jr., 550 North Eastern Avenue, Joliet, Illinois, owner of Edmon Brothers General Hauling, 550 North Eastern Avenue, Joliet, Illinois.

EVERSON advised that EDMON is a Negro male and EDMON told EVERSON that he had only one white male employee working for him. EDMON told EVERSON that the individual's name was TIM KEANE, Tinley Park, Illinois, and has been employed by him for approximately six months. EDMON also advised that he, EDMON, has another job and is employed. at the Caterpillar Tractor Company, Joliet, Illinois. EDMON stated that TIM KEANE, Tinkey Park, Illinois, is also employed by the Caterpillar Tractor Company, Joliet, Illinois, and has been employed there for six months. EDMON stated that he works with KEANE at the Caterpillar Tractor Company, Joliet, Illinois, and it was through this association that he was able to have KEANE work for him as a laborer for the Edmon Brothers General Hauling, Joliet, Illinois. EDMON stated that TIM KEANE was with a driver from the Edmon Brothers General Hauling, Joliet, Illinois, when trash was picked up in Crest Hill, Illinois, on April 10 and again on April 18, 1968.

EVERSON advised that he had verified KEANE's employment at the Caterpillar Tractor Company, Joliet, Illinois, through Mr. JOHN FORBIN, Security Department, Caterpillar Tractor Company, Joliet, Illinois. EVERSON stated that FORBIN told him that he, FORBIN, had personally viewed KEANE's time card at the Caterpillar Tractor Company, Joliet, Illinois, and determined that KEANE had worked 40 hours for each of the three week periods from March 25, 1968, through April 15, 1968.

In view of the above investigation and information, the individual reported by Miss PAT ASHWAY as resembling ERIC STARVO GALT as a possible suspect or subject in instant matter is thereby eliminated.

Burglary of United States Post Office Kellerville, Illinois March 7, 1955

The following investigation was conducted by SA JOHN L. HOGAN at Chicago, Illinois, on April 30, 1968:

Mr. E. F. WANDEL, Section Chief, Postal Inspector's Office, made available their file number 35437-MD which reflects the following information:

The Kellerville, Illinois, Post Office, Fourth Class, was forcibly entered between 1:00 and 2:00 a.m. on March 7, 1955. The loss consisted of 66 blank postal money orders numbers 742239535 through 600, a postmarking stamp and a money order stamp.

On March 8, 1955, a money order in the amount of \$45 was passed at Alton, Illinois. The payee was listed as JAMES WALTON and the purchaser was W. C. HERRIN. On March 21, 1955, two money orders in the amount of \$75 were passed at Kansas City, Missouri. The payee was WILLARD J. MC BRIDE and the purchaser was VERNON MC BRIDE. Investigation developed that the person passing these postal money orders drove a 1949 Lincoln two-door sedan, bearing 1955 Florida license 1W25183. The Motor Vehicle Bureau determined that this plate and car were sold on March 12, 1955, at Miami, Florida, to WALTER P. or T. BERRY. Shamrock Tavern, c/o EARL MILLER, Quincy, Illinois.

As a result of the alert on this automobile, WALTER T. RIFE and JAMES EARL RAY were arrested by the Missouri State Police at Hannibal, Missouri, on March 23, 1955. Thirty-four money orders were recovered in the 1949 Lincoln sedan. RIFE and RAY readily admitted cashing 32 postal money orders but denied involvment in the burglary of the United States Post Office. In a signed statement, RIFE stated that the name WILLARD J. MC BRIDE and VERNON MC BRIDE were the only names used with the exception of one money order which contained the name JAMES WALTON and W. C. HERRIN. He further stated that after passing a money order at Alton, Illinois, he and RAY drove to Miami, Florida, in his Nash automobile and under the alas WALTER T. BERRY traded this automobile for a 1949 Linco Branched

RAY talked freely to the postal inspectors concerning his association with RIFE, their travels together and the passing of instant money orders. He refused to furnish a written statement. At this time, he had known RIFE for a period of approximately one week.

On April 1, 1955, both subjects entered guilty pleas in the United States District Court, Kansas City, Missouri, concerning the forging and cashing of stolen postal money orders and possession of stolen money orders. On July 1, 1955, RIFE was sentenced to three yearsin prison and RAY was sentenced to 3 3/4 years.

A review of this file reflects that the 32 money orders cashed by RIFE and RAY were cashed at St. Louis, Missouri; Alton, Illinois; Hot Springs, Arkansas; Memphis, Tennessee; Hot Springs, Louisiana; Kansas City, Missouri; St. Petersburg, Miami, Miami Beach, Daytona Beach, Jacksonville, Tallahassee, and Tampa, Florida.

Instant burglary was never solved and the Post Office Department closed their case in this matter. Their file does not contain any background information or descriptive data concerning either RIFE or RAY.
