He has previously resided at 54 West Brooks Street, Memphis, Tenn. as well as at 633 Gillis, Memphis. Mr. SULLIVAN stated WILLARD left on a vacation on 4/8/68, and is not scheduled to return to work until 4/22/68. He stated WILLARD's Lorain address is 4718 Stevens Street.

JOSEPH HERING, Landlord, 4718 Stevens Street, Lorain, Ohio, advised on 4/9/68, JOHN WILLARD and his wife, BESSIE, left Lorain at approximately 6:30 P.M. on April 5, 1968, to return to Tennessee for a vacation. He stated he did not have their address in Tennessee. Mr. HERING stated JOHN WILLARD has been in Lorain constantly and has not missed a day's work until he left on his vacation. He also advised WILLARD has a son who works at a concrete plant in Elyria, Ohio.

On 4/9/68, Miss ARLENE SYKORA, Payroll Records, Concrete Masonry Corp. Elyria, Ohio, advised JOHN W. WILLARD. JR. has been employed as a raborer by that company since 2/13/68. She stated records indicate he was born no city listed. HENRY ALBERS, owner and manager, Prince's Sandwich and Coffee Shop, 12 South Park Street, advised that at approximately 1:30 P.M. this date a white male, approximately 40 years of age, weighing approximately 145 pounds, and being approximately 5'9" tall, entered his establishment and presented Salvation Army meal ticket #4734, in the amount of 75 cents, dated April 8, 1968, to be remitted at Prince's Lunch by ALFRED KAMINSKI.

ALBERS stated that this individual did very little talking and was furnished a bowl of chili, hamburger, and two cups of coffee as his meal. He recalled that he only answered yes when asked if he had completed his first cup of coffee.


ALBERS stated that the individual had a very dark tan and seemed very nervous. He appeared to be ill but there was no indication that he had been using intexicating beverages.

ALBERS stated that this individual was wearing a tan topcoat and was carrying a cloth AWOL type duffel bag. He said he was wearing black shoes, grey pants, and that he was not wearing a hat. He said the individual had dark blond hair that was combed straight back and was receding in the front. He does not recall whether this individual was wearing a necktie.

ALBERS advised that after this individual left his lunch room, another customer, whose name he does not recall, mentioned that this man resembled the artist's conception of the suspect in the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. that had appeared in the Mansfield News Journal. He stated that he himself thought that this man bore a certain resemblance to the artist's drawing of the assassination suspect.

Mrs. MARTHA BOSH, Receptionist, the Salvation Army, 47 South Main Street, advised that at approximately 1:00 P.M. on April 8, 1968, a white male came to the entrance of the Salvation Army Headquarters at 47 South Main Street, and lingered at the door for a brief period. She stated that she asked him to come in and then asked what he wanted. He replied by asking, "Could you give me a meal ticket?".

Mrs. BOSH stated that she did not recognize this individual and that when he responded affirmatively to her question as to whether he had ever been there before by giving his name as ALFRED J. KAMINSKI, she checked her registration records and found that he had previously been registered at the Mansfield Salvation Army and that she then furnished him with a Salvation Army meal ticket in the amount of 75 cents, redeemable at Prince's Lunch, located on South Park Street, Mansfield, Ohio.

Mrs. BOSH stated that it is not the practice of the Salvation Army to ask for identification when it has determined that an individual has previously been registered with the local branch of the Salvation Army. In addition, she stated that it was not necessary for an individual who has previously registered to sign any form when requesting a meal ticket.

Mrs. BOSH stated that this individual, who identified himself as ALFRED J. KAMINSKI acted very unusual, as if he may have been sick or possibly an alcoholic. She noted that his eyes looked very odd and that he was soft-spoken and exceptionally polite. She stated that after obtaining his meal ticket, he immediately left the premises and she does not recall him making any statements other than his request for the meal ticket.

Mrs. BOSH stated that this individual was wearing a light tan topcoat and gray trousers and was carrying a zipper-type duffel bag that was similar in color to the topcoat which he was wearing. She stated that she did not recall the shirt that this

individual was wearing and was unable to observe his shoes.

Mrs. BOSH was shown a photograph of a suspect in the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., prepared by Mathis Commercial Appeal staff artist BILL HERRINGTON. She stated that the individual who identified himself as ALFRED KAMINSKI and was given a meal ticket at approximately 1:00 P.M. this date had a striking resemblance to the artist's conception of the assassin.

The following investigation was conducted by SA A. JAMES ANDERSON, JR. on April 8, 1968:

Captain ALBERT D. O'NEIL, Mansfield Police Department, related that THOMAS TUCKER, owner of Tucker Furniture, Park Avenue West, telephonically advised that approximately 1:30 P.M. or shortly thereafter, he observed an individual at Prince's Lunch, who strongly resembled a commercial artist sketch of the suspect in the killing of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which sketch appeared in the "News Journal", Mansfield local newspaper, April 6, 1968. Lunch was purchased with a salvation army meal ticket.

It was immediately determined the only Salvation Army meal ticket presented at this establishment was Salvation Army ticket #4734, having the name ALFRED KAMINSKI written thereon. It was also verified through the Salvation Army that such a meal ticket had been issued to one ALFRED KAMINSKI.

The Salvation Army, Mission Houses, Volunteers of America, cheap bars and cheap hotels were checked for ALFRED JOSEPH KAMINSKI with the assistance of the Mansfield Police Department. KAMINSKI was found on the streets by Captain O'NEIL and SA ANDERSON after which he was interviewed.

At a later hour, THOMAS TUCKER, identified above, examined Polaroid colored photographs of KAMINSKI as displayed to him by Captain O'NEIL. O'NEIL commented TUCKER immediately identified the photograph of KAMINSKI as being identical to the individual he observed in Prince's Lunch as mentioned above.

On the evening of April 8, 1968, the Springfield and Indianapolis Divisions telephonically advised the Cleveland Division that investigation verified that one ALFRED JOSEPH KAMINSKI had stayed at the Salvation Army, March 29, 1968 in Springfield, Illinois; at the Mission House, Muncie, Indiana, April 4, 1968.


