The individual who changed the ticket was well known to MC KIBBEN, and bore no resemblance to GALT. He was exhibited anwankskxfkkek identification order for JAMES EARL RAY. He advised the photograph depicted was not familiar to him. After being advised that another driver had advised an individual, white male, 35 years old, wearing a brown topcoat and yellow sport shirt had been left in Youngstown on the 18th, he advised he was at work all day on the 18th, including the time around 4:15 PM. He recalled seeing one man around the terminal without luggage, who appeared having trouble making connections, but the man bore no resemblance to the photograph.

Same date, CHARLES CLAYPOOL, RD#4, Ainsley Road, East Liverpool, Ohio, advised that he drives the only bus between Youngstown and Salem, Ohio. The bus goes through to Wheeling, West Virginia, daily. After viewing the photograph, he advised he could not recall the man ever having been on the bus to Salem. He advised he did drive the bus to Salem on April 18 and 19, 1968, and every ex day the bus is in operation.



MARY CHORTOS was personally contacted on 4/26/68 and receipt of her letter at the Bureau was acknowledged.

on 4/23/68 CHORTOS advised that she had observed a white male resembling subject RAY the previous day sitting in a 1966 blue Cadillac bearing Missouri license plates which was parked in the Fulton Shopping Center at Fulton and Memphis Roads. She stated that the license plate bore numbers PS 6 and that she could not remember the other numbers. She stated that this individual was sitting on the passenger side of the car and as the complainant looked at him he slouched in the seat. At the time of the telephone call, she stated that she was quite excited and could not remember what apartment she lived in; whether it was 231 or 213. She stated she had no other information to furnish and did not indicate that she desired to see an Agent.

On both 4/24 and 25/68, the parking lot at the Fulton Shopping Center was checked between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 12 noon, the time that she had indicated she had seen the automobile. Fulton-Memphis Shopping Center is a large shopping area and the traffic is very considerable



Mrs. CHORTOS was interviewed on 4/26/68, at which time she stated that after she had thought about this matter and visualized the car she realized from her visualization that the car had not been blue at all but was green and further that the license plate number was PS 633 or PS 655 followed by an additional four digits. According to CHORTOS, this made the plate two letters and seven digits. She stated that there was a Missouri plate and that the color was white on green.

Mrs. CHORTOS stated that her only glimpse of the subject was when she drove by the car and observed a portion of his profile from eyes down and for a moment full face when he looked in her direction. She did not see all of his face but she stated she did see his nose and that part of his face. She recalled that there was a long strand of hair hanging down by his eye. She could furnish no other description except to state that she thought he was quite handsome and could not guess his age as she "can't tell ages." She stated that her attention was drawn to this matter because of the fact that there was a Missouri license plate on the car and the next day she observed the picture of subject RAY in the Life magazine and because he slouched down in the seat. As Mrs. CHORTOS stated, she could not understand why he would slouch down in the seat when she looked at him.

Mrs. CHORTOS stated that she had written to the Bureau rather than call the Cleveland Office of the FBI because she realized that the Agents were so busy. She stated she had never met an FBI Agent before and really wanted to talk to one. She said she was very disappointed when an Agent did not come out to her house right after she had called and in fact she "cried a little."

The Agents explained to Mrs. CHORTOS that they were most appreciative of her information and had not realized that she expected to be personally contacted and that the Agents had acted in accordance with the value of the information, in immediately checking out the area indicated by her. Mrs. CHORTOS indicated that she was very pleased to have been of some assistance and was quite thrilled to have met some representatives of the FBI and indicated that if she had anything to furnish, she would immediately call the Cleveland Office of the FBI.

Mrs. CHORTOS resides with a lady companion, both of whom are about 50 years of age. Mrs. CHORTOS has very heavy masculine features and was wearing a man's black sweatshirt and black pants when contacted by the Agents. It is the impression of the Agents that Mrs. CHORTOS was undoubtedly sincere in calling the Bureau, but may be experiencing some emotional problems. In view of the vague and highly questionable accuracy of the information furnished by her, Cleveland is hereby resending the lead set out to Kansas City by re IO airtel to check the Bureau of Motor Vehicles for Cadillacs bearing PS 6 plates.



On April 24, 1968, HOWARD and MYRTLE PORTER were contacted at their residence, 1329 North Route #7, Pierpont, Ohio.

They advised that on April 19, 1968, between 2:30 p.m., and 3:30 p.m., they observed a person hitchhiking on Route#7 in front of their home. On April 18, 1968, DAVID H. FOSTER, Funeral Director, Spikers Funeral Home, 710 West Tuscarawas Street, Canton, Ohio, advised that on the previous evening he had met with his stock club at Dick Logan's Restaurant in Canton and at about 9:45 p.m., he and another member, Attorney DON STEINER, had proceeded to the Cabaret Bar located across the street from Logan's Restaurant. As they were sitting at the bar, another patron, whom he described as 36 to 38 years of age, white male, brown wavy hair, good looking, well dressed, wearing cuff links and a black onyx ring on his right hand and a wedding band on his left hand with neat appearing nails and hands, who was approximately 5 feet 10 inches 160 pounds, struck up a conversation with them and stated that he was a psychologist teaching at Kent State University (KSU), and further stated that he was from the Akron, Ohio, area and subsequently stated the Alliance, Ohio, area. Mr. FOSTER stated that the man introduced himself as Dr. ORDIN T. PILT or TILT (ph). He stated he noted the man was drinking VO and water and further commented that he had received his B.S. degree from Toledo University and his Doctor's degree from the University of Michigan.

FOSTER stated that the following morning he had observed a photograph in the newspaper of ERIE STARVO GALT and thought there was some similarity in the appearance of the photograph and the man he had seen in the bar.

Mr. FOSTER was questioned as to whether he noted any special peculiarity and he stated he did not, that the man's conversation indicated that he was probably a midwesterner or a native of that vicinity. He added that the barmaid, LINDA, had served this patron and also suggested that Mr. STEINER may have made some observation regarding this individual.

LINDA FARKAS, 1220 Wertz Avenue, SW, Canton, Ohio, was contacted at the Cabaret Bar and stated that she had had a telephone call from Mr. FOSTER regarding the patron who had been in the bar the previous night. She stated that she did not feel that he resembled the photograph she had seen of ERIC STARVO GALT which appeared on TV the previous night. She stated that she recalls the man had said his name was ORDWAY T. PELT (ph) and had insisted that he be called DOC. She said that he had asked her to dance; however, she had refused and he had also asked her for a date to go bowling, but she again refused. He inquired as to where "the action was in Canton", indicating that he was not familiar with the area, however, he also mentioned that he was from the Alliance and Akron. Ohio. areas. She said that she recalled that he drank VO and water and left after a short time in the bar. She described him as approximately 30 years of age, white male, light brown hair, blue eyes, 5 feet 8 inches, slight build, wearing a shirt open at the neck and a suit, wearing a wedding band, and she did not think that he appeared identical to the photograph of GALT.

On April 18, 1968, DONALD STEINER, Attorney, was contacted at his office in the Harter Bank Building and stated that he had been in telephonic contact with DAVID FOSTER, a member of his stock club, and they had discussed the individual they had seen at the Cabaret Bar the previous evening, and what resemblance he may have had to ERIC STARVO GALT. Mr. STEINER stated that he was embarrassed to have had Mr. FOSTER suggest that possibly the patron was identical with GALT inasmuch as he did not feel that the person was identical although there was some similarity in his appearance. He stated that during the conversation that this patron had introduced himself as Dr. PEEL (ph) and that he was a psychiatrist and teaching psychology at KSU. He stated he was in the presence of this man approximately 1/2 hour and described him as a white male, 40, dark hair, medium to slight build, 5 feet 10-11 inches, 170-175 pounds, and no noticeable rural accent to his speech. This patron indicated that he was familiar with the writings on psychiatry and Mr. STEINER questioned him about special writings and he acknowledged that he was familiar with them. He also
