This being a mail order tag, there is no indication that GREATHOUSE has been in Selma, Ala., or Dallas County, and in the absence of such information, there is no investigation to be made by the Mobile Office in an effort to locate GREATHOUSE.

SAVANNAH. Will attempt to locate WALLACE GREATHOUSE through General Delivery, Peach Orchard Branch, Augusta, Ga., in order that he may be contacted to determine if he could possibly be identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

CLEVELAND. Will contact sources at Alliance, Ohio, to develop address of complainant BOB CONROY and interview him in person concerning the individual seen by him.

In the event this investigation at Cleveland and Savannah does not result in location of WALLACE GREATHOUSE, it is suggested that Cleveland attempt to trace him through the James H. Drews Shows by contact with "Billboard Magazine" Cincinnati, Ohio.

WILLIAM JUNE MITCHELL, ET AL

PCI was shown a photograph of HELEN JACOBS, and advised that he had never heard of this individual, nor could he recognize the photo at all. He stated he had never heard of a prostitute by the name of HELEN JACOBS working in the downtown Lima area.

MURKIN

PCI was shown the IO photograph # 4182 of JAMES EARL RAY, and advised that he had never heard of this individual and could not recognize him. He advised also that he had never heard of the name ERIC STARVO GALT. In this connection he was contacted on April 25, 1968.

RICHARD COSTELLO

PCI advised that he had no information RICHARD COSTELLO was back in the Lima, Ohio, area, and it was his understanding COSTELLO was back in Florida.

CRIMINAL CONDITIONS, CLEVELAND DIVISION

PCI advised that WHITE DOROTHY still worked for him as a night barmaid, and that it was his opinion WHITE DOROTHY was behaving herself and was not prostituting at the present time. PCI advised that prostitutes and pimps did hang out at the Waldo Hotel on the Lima Public Square, and also he understood prostitutes picked up dates at WILLIE WRIGHT's night club. He stated, however, that he did not know the names of these prostitutes, nor did he know the names of their possible pimps and further, he had no information as to any interstate transportation. He stated, as far as he knew, they were strictly local girls.

RACIAL MATTERS, LIMA, OHIO RA

PCI advised that WILLIE LEE ALEXANDER, aka., BUTCH, who had been very active in the Lima Youth Committee in the South End, had done very little recently apparently as far as the LYC was concerned. PCI said that he did not see very much of BUTCH ALEXANDER in view of the fact that BUTCH presently was a truck driver and he believed, working for Duff Truck Lines. PCI stated that WILLIE LEE ALEXANDER, in his opinion, was the person who made the most noise and more-or-less preached Black Power. He stated that he had told BUTCH in no uncertain terms, that if he talked Black Power in his bar, that he would throw him out. He stated, however, that on occasion BUTCH did come into the bar and seemed to talk about Black Power, but that he would quiet him down and treatened to have him put out if he kept talking the way he did.

PCI advised that he had no information of any contemplated violence in the Lima, Ohio area in the future. He stated he had no information as to any plan of demonstrations of any kind.

PCI added, however, that there had been poblems arising at the South Junior High School, among the Negro students, but that he claimed this was primarily a discipline problem.

Pertient information was furnished to RONALD COOK, Inspector, Lima, Chio Police Department, and ED FAIR, Sheriff, Allen County Sheriff's Office, on May 9, 1968, by SA HOMER K. MILLER.

GEORGIA ALLEN, aka Mrs. James Allen Probationary Racial Informant (Ghetto)

On May 8, 1968, JAMES ALLEN advised that his wife GEORGIA was currently in Wisconsin taking a special course in connection with her youth work out at the Lima, Ohio south end. He advised that he, however, had talked to his wife on numerous occasions and knew just as much as she did about what was going on.

Mr. ALLEN advised that this Lima Youth Committee which has held meeting at the Community Center where his wife was employed located at 1624 South Reese Street, did continue to have some meetings, but that interest had slacked off. He stated that COOPER SMITH, JR. and BUTCH ALEXANDER, aka WILLIE LEE ALEXANDER were still active as well as MIKE MEYER, a white teacher. He stated that WILLIE IEE ALEXANDER presently had a job driving a truck and consequently he had very little time for the Lima Youth Committee. He stated that no information had come to his attention relative to any planaed violence or demonstrations in the Lima, Ohio area, although there had been quite a few rumors and quite a bit of tension among the Negro people. He stated that on May 8, 1968, there had been a disturbance at the South Junior High School and that some students had been suspended. He stated, however, that it was his belief that this was a disipline problem which concarned some teacher and that the achool authorities had requested that all of the parents of the students involved come to the school to iron out any of the problems.

Mr. ALLEN advised further that there had been a small distrubance at the roller rink on South Fetchey Highway a few weeks ago and that the word was that MIKE MEYER of the Lima Youth Committee had taken out some Negro boys to this roller rink. He stied that he had no additional information relative to this and apparantly very little trouble had ensued.

CI advised that she understood RICHARD COSTELLO was living in Florida and that she had no indication he was presently in the Lima. Ohio area.

CRIMINAL CONDITIONS, CLEVELAND DIVISION

CI advised that prostitutes and pimps do continue to hang around the Waldo Hotel, Lima public square and also WILLIE WRIGHT's Night Club. The stated that as far as she knew these were local people and she had no information as to any interstate transportation by these pimps of any prostitutes.

RACIAL MATTERS, LIMA RA

CI advised that she understood there was a Lima Youth Committee in the south end of Lima, Ohio, but that she did not know the individuals personally and had very little information about them. She advised that she had received information from a GEORGE SELBY of the Equity Dairy which place is located across from the corner cafe that some places which possibly could have trouble were those which were not considered fair to the Negro element. She stated some of these places were mentioned as Lee's at Fourth and Main, Charles' place at Second and Main, Christof's Grocery at Second and Central, a carry out with two initials and panels grocery store. She stated that she had no information as to any immediate violence in the Lima, Ohio area and said that there were quite a few rumors but there was nothing at all tangible.

Pertinent information above was furnished to RONALD COOK, Inspector, Lima, Ohio Police Department and ED FAIR, Sheriff, Allen County on May 9, 1968 by SA HOMER K. MILLER.

On 5/8/68, VIOLA GRIFFIN, who resides at 2934 East 82nd Street, Cleveland, telephone MI 1-1146, advised that she resides at this address along with a couple of her grandchildren. She stated that prior to January, her daughter, GERTRUDE GRIFFIN, also resided at this address. Mrs. VIOLA GRIFFIN stated that she could not recall ever either receiving or making any phone calls to or from the state of Texas. She stated that there would be no other individuals at her residence who would have access to the phone other than her daughters GERTRUDE and ELIZABETH. Mrs. GRIFFIN advised that her daughter GERTRUDE was presently residing at 3410 East 132nd Street.

On 5/8/68, GERTRUDE GRIFFIN was contacted at 3410 East 132nd Street, at the residence of her sister, telephone 751-7452. Miss GRIFFIN is described as a Negro female in her mid-30's. She stated that she recalls that some time ago an individual, a Negro male, in his early 40's, 5'11", 200 lbs., who resided on East 81st Street, Cleveland, Ohio, whose name was EDWARD SMALL, became acquainted with herself and her sister ELIZABETH. GERTRUDE GRIFFIN stated that EDWARD SMALL had told her that he belonged to the New Hope Baptist Church, Cleveland, Ohio, and that he was a deacon at this church. GERTRUDE GRIFFIN stated that EDWARD SMALL was in her mind an habitual liar. She stated, however, that she had not seen him since he left Cleveland approximately 2 years ago but that he had called her on two occasions. She stated that on one occasion he told her he was in California and on the other occasion she stated he told her he was calling from Texas. She stated that she believed that the call from Texas was prior to Christmas, 1967. She advised that at the time she did not believe EDWARD SMALL when he made his statement where the calls were originating from but that as she recalls it he did mention Texas.

In view of the above, no further investigation is being conducted in connection with the phone calls originating from pay phones outside of Houston, Texas.
