Goodrich Company, Akron, Ohio for the past several months moving heavy equipment. He advised this is a small crew operation and on 5/29/68, according to payroll records the only individuals who were at Goodrich on that date were RI CHARD SCHOONOVER, Foreman, Employed for the last three years., WILLYAM GARN, Employed for the past 15 years and STEVE KOMAR, employed off and on for the past 4 years. He advised Superintendant RALPH BENTON, might have also been off and on the property of Goodrich on that date. He advised the only individual he has never personally observed is STEVE ROMAR who is employed out of Local 17, Bridge Structural and Ornamental Iron Workers Union, Akron, Ohio. A photo of subject JAMES EARL RAY, IO # 4182 was displayed to MR. SELINSKY and he advised this individual does not look familiar to him as any employee the company has ever had. Employee WILLIAM GARN, was observed by SA BISHOP on this date and interviewed and he does not resemble subject at all and he was eliminated by comparison of fingerprints.



Sirs:

I refer to the encircled paragraph in today's (June 10) Press. I do not know it what I say will be helpful, but I thought I should let you know.

I enclose a flight ticket receipt which as you can see was for my son stationed in Ft. Gordon, Ga.

When he arrived in Cleveland, Ohio, I met him at the Hopkins Airport and he told me at that time there was a man aboard that that flight who very much resembled the composite drawing being shown on T.V. of the fugitive who was wanted. We discussed the possibility of this being the man and then dismissed it from our minds for two reasons: one, being that surely he would not have been in the Atlanta vicinity so shortly after the assassination, and secondly because Pvt. Harry did not want to appear a publicity seeker.

When it was discovered he was in Toronto, I assumed his method of arriving there was probably already known. When I last spoke with my son, Pvt. Harry, it was yesterday, Sunday, June 9. Again he stated that Cleveland would have been a possible route to Toronto. But he still was uncertain what to do, assuming also, it was water over the bridge and the man's method of travel was already ascertained.

Today, after reading the press article, I have concluded this might, just possibly, be a lead; whether of value or not, for you people to determine.

I definitely do not want any publicity for having submitted this information, and neither would my son. I enclose the receipt for his flight ticket which will give you the flight information and airline. Perhaps a questioning of personnel aboard that flight, or a check of other passengers, would bring additional information to light.

Please remember, Pvt. Harry made his observation on the strength of a composite picture. However, prior to entering the service, he worked as a journeyman compositor on a newspaper and is automatically trained to observe details.

I am deeply sorry now that we did not bring this information to you, but there are always so many false leads, that we tho't perhaps we would look foolish.

We truly do not want any publicity of any kind for having reported this, and I trust you will keep my letter confidential. If it proves of value, we are only doing what any citizen should.



Prior to receipt of discontinuance of lead contained in retel, the following investigation was conducted in an effort to locate and interview PAUL OSBORN BRIDGEMAN, aka Paul James Bridgeman:

The lead was to identify the suscriber of Akron telephone number 836-7989 and interview this person regarding the whereabouts of JACQUELINE KLINE, aka., who called this number sometime between 4/19 - 5/19/68 from Kansas, and who reportedly would be in the company of PAUL BRIDGEMAN.

On 6/6/68 a review of various city directories, etc. for the Akron, Ohio area, revealed phone number 836-7989 is issued to THE GORDON MEMORIAL HOME, INC., 1260 Collier Road, Akron, with an apparent extension in the home of ROBERT L. GORDON, 666 Nome Ave., Akron, the President of Gordon Memorial Home, Inc.

On 6/7/68, a review of arrest files of the Akron Police Dept. and Summit County Sheriff's Office reflected no record of GORDON, or of KLINE.

On 6/7/68, ROBERT L. GORDON, 666 Nome Ave. was interviewed concerning the call placed by KLINE from Kansas. He said he recalled receiving a phone call from JACKIE KLINE about a month ago. She told him he had buried her father about 12 years ago and that she had lost all contact with her family since leaving Akron, and could he please give her the current address and phone number of her uncle PAUL KLINE, so she could get in touch with him.

GORDON said he remembered burying HYMAN KLINE about 12 years ago and that at that time HYMAN's wife, name unrecalled, lived on Wiltshire Ave., Akron. He also remembers HYMAN's brother was PAUL KYNY KLINE, who is the manager of Tire Industries, Inc., 1779 Marvo Drive, Akron, business phone 773-7891, home address 615 Ridgecrest Road, Akron, phone number unknown.

Private WILLIAM DENNIS HARRY, ASN US assigned to Company G, Third Battalion, Student Brigade, U. S. Army Southeastern Signal School, (USASSS), Fort Gordon, Georgia, advised he has been assigned to this unit at Fort Gordon since February 8, 1968, and his home address is 3498 Bosworth Road, Cleveland, Ohio.

HARRY related that on April 6, 1968, he boarded a United Airlines flight #396Y from Atlanta, Georgia, to Cleveland, Ohio, leaving Atlanta at approximately 6:30 PM, as well as he could recall, and arriving Cleveland around 9:00 PM. He pointed out he has made several trips since then to Cleveland, and for that reason his mind is confused as to the exact departure and arrival time on this flight on April 6, 1968.

HARRY continued that after boarding the plane at Atlanta, he observed a man to take a seat about six or seven rows ahead of him, sitting on the right side of the plane, HARRY was seated on the left side, and noticed that this man bore a resemblance to the composite sketch being shown at the time on television of the fugitive who later turned out to be JAMES EARL RAY. He said that he does not recall that this man was carrying a briefcase or any other article and after taking his seat, the man did not appear to pay any attention to anyone else around the plane. However, he noticed that as the man came aboard, he seemed to look around at the various passengers already seated before taking his own seat.

HARRY said he did not pay much attention to this man en route to Cleveland, does not recall if he talked to anyone who may have been seated beside him, and did not observe any further activity by this man until he left the plane at Cleveland. HARRY said that he had to get a couple of dress uniforms before leaving the plane at Cleveland, and this man left before he did. Consequently, HARRY did not see where he went after leaving the plane.

According to HARRY, this man was about 35 - 37 years old, his weight and height he would not estimate because he paid more attention to the man after he was seated than before, was dressed in a gray sport coat with white shirt and dark tie, with dark trousers. He did not wear a hat and his hair appeared to be of medium length, and was probably brown. He said the man did not appear nervous to his recollection.

HARRY further stated he did not pay any attention to this man's left ear to detect any difference between the left and right ears.

HARRY related that after he reached Cleveland, he discussed this matter with his mother, but he reached the conclusion that this would not have been the fugitive because he did not believe the fugitive would have gone back to Atlanta so soon after the murder of Dr. KING. Consequently, he forgot the matter, thinking that it would not be important, and would not have reported it had not his mother contacted the FBI at Cleveland.

HARRY continued that he had made connections with the United Airlines flight #296Y from Augusta, Georgia, by Delta flight #423 to Atlanta on the same date.

HARRY said that he, prior to entering military service, was a compositor and Linotype operator for the Mansfield News Journal Company, Mansfield, Ohio, for about ten years and for about seven or eight weeks immediately prior to entering military service with the "Toledo Blade", Toledo, Ohio.

HARRY concluded by saying that he could not make a positive statement as to whether this individual was JAMES EARL RAY, but could only say that it might have been.
