



Nation May Face Trial in King's Death

ATLANTA — (VP) — The Southern Christian Leadership Conference this week is expected to approve plans for a mock trial in Memphis, Tean., convicting the nation for the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The mock trial was proposed to the SCLC Board of Directors in February. "The organization is sympathetic to the idea, and we're going to discuss it next week in idetail," said Rev. Bernard Lafayette, SCLC program director.

Other SCLC sources said the general plans have already met with approval but details must still be discussed by the civil rights group's cop staff.

The trial would be held during the state trial of the late Negro leader's alleged assassin, James Earl Ray. It is scheduled to begin Apr. 7.

Chief prosecutor would be the Rev. James Bevel, an SCLC official in Philadelphia who believes Ray is "innocent" of the Apr. 4 slaying of King.

Site of the trial would be Mason Temple, a large church on the south side of Memphis where King made his last speech the night before his murder.

The 'Other Issue' in the Ray Trial

By NORMAN PEARLSTINE

MEMPHIS — James Earl Ray's plea of guilty to the murder of Martin Lither King Jr. has left the world wondering whether the negro leader was the victim of a conspiracy. But the sudden sentencing of Ray also leaves an esolved another, little-noticed, controversy over the Memphis court's tough pretrial restraints on the press.

Presiding Judge W. Preston Battle, a somber, moon-faced, 60-year-old former prosecutor, declared after Ray's arrest that he was determined to guarantee a fair trial. He promptly held in contempt two Memphismewspaper reporters, a private investigator and Ray's former attorney for their alleged role in newspaper stories about Ray. Judge Battle also cited author William Bradford Huie and an F.B.I. fingerprint expert, ordering them to show cause why they shouldn't be held in contempt.

Legal Wrangling

The contempt convictions and the judge's extensive bans on publicity appear headed now for a U.S. Supreme Court test and may create more legal wrangling than the murder trial itself.

Armistead Clay, attorney for Scripps-Howerd's Memphis Publishing Co., which employs the two reporters, says that he "will take with steps as may be necessary for a full re-

euch steps as may be necessary for a full review of Judge Bather decree holding the reporters in contempt, including application to the U.S. Supreme Court, if required."

Ronald Diana, an attorney for Cowles Communications Inc., the publishers of Look Magazine, which printed Mr. Huie's articles, says that Cowles "feels an obligation" to help Mr. Huie fight a contempt citation in "any way required." Mr. Diana adds that "we feel there is a very important issue at stake here—the right of responsible journalists to provide investigative reporting that aids law enforcement officials" and enlightens the public.

Judge Battle agrees that Supreme Court review of his contempt orders is likely. "We're on a frontier of the law," the judge says. "The First Amendment guarantee of a free press and the Sixth Amendment guarantee of a free trial are in confrontation. I have every confidence that the parties will go all the way to the top to resolve the conflict."

Last July Judge Battle issued orders governing pretrial publicity. The orders relied heavily on two sources: Guidelines laid down by the Supreme Court in its 1966 reversal of Dr. Sam Shepherd's murder conviction for adverse pretrial publicity, and on the controversal proposals on free press and fair trial adopted by the American Bar Association (the "Reardon Report") in February 1968.

Judge Battle's orders restricted lawyers participating in the case and their employed as well as courthouse and police officials, from making prejudicial statements out of court. Several types of disclosure were listed as prejudicial, including statements on the "treatment, acts and attitude of the defendant" and on trial techniques or theories of guilt or innocence.

Reporters weren't included in the order. But Judge Battle relied on an 1860 Tennessee supreme court decision to hold the two Memphis reporters, Charles Edmundson and Roy Hamilton, in contempt. On the basis of that ancient state court decision, in a case not involving the First Amendment guarantee of a free press, Judge Battle ruled generally that a person not named in a court order can be held in contempt if he helps someone else disobey the injunction, knowing that that person is covered by it.

Judge Battle found here that the two reporters were in contempt because they interviewed Arthur J. Hanes Sr., Ray's former attorney, and his investigator, Renfro Hayes, on Ray's treatment in jail, knowing that the attorney and investigator were bound by the order.

On the advice of a prestigious panel of seven Memphis lawyers appointed by Judge Battle to act as "friends of the court" throughout the case, the judge ordered Mr. Huie to show cause why he shouldn't be held in contempt for writing two articles for Look in which a conspiracy to kill Rev. King was hinted. The F.B.I. expert, George Bonebrake, was similarly cited for allegedly making statements to a law enforcement clinic about Ray's fingerprints.

Reporters Immune?

Many legal scholars and some sources close to the lawyers that drafted the Reardon Report say that both the Shepherd case and the report imply that reporters should be immune from contempt orders because they are protected by the First Amendment guarantee of a free press. They say that both sources clearly suggest that the judge is limited preventing are indicial trials by contral lawyers and courtnouse and police official

"Judge Battle's order restricting lawyers and law enforcement officials may have been all right," says one attorney close to the case, "but I question his going beyond the order to nab the reporters." The Supreme Court has never written an opinion upholding a reporter's conviction for contempt.

Although Judge Battle found the two Memphis reporters in contempt, he refused to sentence them, or Mr. Hanes and his investigator, until after Ray's trial. He thus frustrated their efforts to appeal his decisions, while holding out the possibility of little or no sentence for the offense if the men said nothing else that would offend the judge before the trial. On Monday Judge Battle said he would dispose of all the contempt proceedings on April 11.

Mr. Clay says that, after Judge Battle found the two Memphis reporters in contempt, he tried to appeal the judge's decision to the Tennessee state courts, but the courts refused to hear the case on grounds that the judge's decision wasn't final until he imposed sentence. Mr. Clay notes that he has filed a petition with the U.S. Supreme Court "seeking a review and reversal of the action of all the Tennessee courts."

Mr. Huie says he may be content to take a contempt conviction "as inherent in the nature of the business." He says that he doesn't think he acted in contempt of the judge's order but says that "it just takes too long for me to fight the thing up to the Supreme Court personally." Mr. Huie adds, however, that if Cowles Communications, whose lawyers advised him that his articles didn't violate the judge's orders, wants to fight a citation through the courts, he will go along with them.

Judge Battle was also criticized before the trial for restricting discussion of the defendant's condition in prison and for being extremely concerned that the state, as well as the defendant, receive a fair trial.

"The Constitution guarantees the accused, who is presumed innocent until proven guilty, a trial by an impartial jury," says one Memphis defense attorney who has followed the case closely. "It'says nothing about a similar right for the state, who, after all, isn't on trial. The defendant should be allowed to proclaim his innocence as loudly and to as much of the public as he can," he adds.

t "Other Side of the Coin"

In an interview given before the trial, Judge Battle said he agreed that the Constitution says nothing about a fair trial for the state, "but that is necessarily the other side of the coin," he says. "A jury must be indifferent as between the parties if it is to be impartial. Too often people fail to realize that this is a serious trial and not entertainment. The responsibility for dealing with pretrial publicity has been placed on me and if I fail to perform my duty, the case may be reversed."

Judge Battle's fear of such a reversal may have been well founded. But it has led to a deeper conflict between the courts and the press—a conflict that neither can afford and one that may take years to settle.

William Dradford Huie has written a third article for "Lock" magazine. The article appears in the issue dated April 15, 1969, but this issue was circulated on April 1, 1969. A review of the article reveals that James Earl Pay allegedly registered at the Travelodge Motel, Five Points, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29, 1968; at a motel near Florence, Alabama, on April 1, 1968; and at a motel near Corinth, Massissippl, on April 2, 1968. It is to be noted that Ray, using the name Sarvey Lowmyer, negotiated the purchase of a rifle at the Aeromarine Supply Company, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29 and 30, 1969. On April 3, 1968, he was registered at the Rebel Motel in Momphis, Tennessee.

In an effort to establish whether or not Ray was in contact with any individuals immediately prior to the assassination, appropriate investigation should be conducted by the Birmingham and Jackson Offices. It should be understood that there is to be no indication made whatsoever that the following investigation has any connection whatsoever with the case involving James Earl Hay.

Elimingham and Jackson Offices should make inquiries of the motels in or near the cities indicated above to determine the identities of individuals registered during the period hiarch 29 to April 3, 1988.

Efforts should be made to identify all individuals listed, as well as

obtaining descriptions and registrations for the automobiles of such persons. A review of such records might indicate whether any one individual might have accompanied Ray or been in contact with him during this period. Pertinent or questionable registration records should be obtained if possible for examination by the FEI Laboratory.

Momphis should insure that the Bureau is kept currently advised of pertinent developments in this case, particularly all aspects of court action since the death of Judge Battle on March 31, 1989.
