On 4/11/68, JACK W. HAMILTON, 1532 Drury Drive, in interview, advised that DEWAYNE DALLAS came to Dallas, Texas in either 1958 or 1959 from Mississippi and was employed in the business of selling envelopes. He stated that he was not known to have had an office in Memphis, Tennessee, however, he was believed to have secured his supplies from Memphis or Chattanooga, Tennessee. He stated that he has had occasional contact with DALLAS and knew him as a strict segregationist and based on the description furnished as the subject in the MURKIN case, felt that it was worth notifying the FBI that DALLAS should be considered a suspect. He described DALLAS as a white male, 38-40, 5'11", 165#, hair light brown, complexion ruddy, a long pointed nose.

Mr. HAMILTON stated that DALLAS had caused some handbills to be printed and distributed primarily to people involved in the purchase and sale of envelope-type supplies which contained his thoughts with regards to segregation. He stated that his suspicion of DALLAS was based on his contacts with DALLAS and his resollection of some of the material distributed by DALLAS.

On 4/15/68, Operator 53, Credit Bureau Services, advised that her file showed a record of DEWAYNE DALIAS, 6266 St. Albana Drive, wife BARBARA. This record was made in September, 1856 and was last checked in August, 1958. Records showed that DALLAS was employed by the 5 D Envelope Company, 109 South Haskel Street, and his wife, BARBARA, was employed as a clerk, Red Ball Motor Freight. The file showed that a divorce was pending from BARBARA in 1959. Credit information was shown as satisfactory.

On 4/15/68, A. C. BUCHANAN, JR., 6260 St. Albans, employed - Data Processing Department, Mobil Oil Company, Room 208E, Mobil Building, Dallas, advised that he has lived as a nextdoor unighbor to DEWAYNE DALLAS for 11 years. He stated that he was employed as a salesman for himself in a business located at 109 S. Haskel. He stated that he had been employed previously by the Lome Envelope, Inc., Dallas. He stated that DALLAS and his wife separated some six or seven years ago and that he lives alone at his residence, 6266 St. Albans. He advised that to his knowledge, DALLAS has not been away from home during the past thirty days as he is accumbomed to seeing him sometime during the day each day. He advised that he considered DALLAS a strict segregationist but could not furnish any other information concerning him.

On 4/15/68, DL 274-R advised that DEWAYNE DALIAS was unknown and that he was not now or had ever been a member of the ANP. Informant advised that DALIAS was probably with the "WALLACE For President Group" but he had not definite information concerning this.

On 4/16/68, JOHN ALLEN, Clerk, Dallas District fitrk's Office, advised that divorce record #59-312-DR reflected a divorce between BARBARA DALLAS and DEWAYNE DALLAS. A review of this record showed that a divorce was granted 5/21/59 with the court awarding Mrs. DALLAS custody of their two children, GLENN MICHAEL DALLAS, born 7/28/54 and STEPHEN DEWAYNE DALLAS, born 7/16/56.

On 4/17/68, DEWAYNE DALLAS was interviewed by SAS ALBRED D. NEELEY and JAMES W. ANDERTON at his office, 109 S. Haskel Street. DALLAS denied being out of the city of Dallas the past thirty days and furnished sales invoices for the period covering 3/29-30 and 4/4-5/68 showing sales made in Dallas on these dates.

DALLAS stated that He attended high school at Philadelphia Mississippi and graduated from Mississippi State University in 1949 and claimed that he served two years in the U.S. Navy (1944-46); was given an honorable discharge, MSN 7224 760. He advised that he came to Dallas in 1856 and has been in business for himself as the owner and operator of the DEWAYNE DALLAS Company. He stated that he is diverced and is the father of two children, both of whom are in custody of his former wife.

He denied membership in any organization other than the Dallas Chamber of Commerce and the First Baptist Church. He advised that he is known as a segregationist and was not surprised that some person receiving some literature which he had distributed from time to time accused him of some implication in the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

HOMER DILL, Manager, Mobile Interstate 20 Service Station, advised that as he recalls on March 31, 1968, at about 7:00 a.m. just after opening the station an individual driving a brand new white Thunderbird automobile two-door hardtop stopped for gas. He advised he did not note the license number as the individual paid for the gas in cash. He advised the individual drank a cup of coffee, and during the course of conversation, stated he was enroute to Memphis and was going to spend the night at his aunt's home in Dallas, Texas. He advised that while putting gas in the individual's car, he noted a 30-06 rifle laying on the back seat along with some other guns. He stated he inquired if this individual liked to hunt and he said he did, mentioning that there was no scope on any of his guns as he felt that a scope was unsportsman like, and did not give the animal a sporting chance.

DILL advised that at no time did this individual state that he was going to Memphis to kill anyone or to kill any Negro. He stated that this individual did not exhibit or speak of any animosity toward the Negroes.

DILL advised that this individual came back through Abilene on Appril 3, 1968, in the same automobile accompanied by a white female he understood to be his wife. He advised that he again bought gas, paying for it in cash and he again did not note the license number or get the individual's name. He advised that it was his impression that this individual had just returned from Viet Nam as he had two large deep scars on the left side of his face not yet completely healed as the scab was still on the wound. He advised as he understood this individual had just purchased the 1968 Thunderbird and had gone to Memphis to get his wife, having come from someplace west of Abilene and was returning to this area after which time he and his wife were going on a vacation. He stated that there was no indication that this man had any malice toward anyone or would kill anyone. was unable to furnish any further information which would assist in identifying or locating this individual. He stated should this individual come through again, he would obtain the license number of the auto and obtain all the information he could to ideatify the man and would immediately furnish the information to the FBI.

She described the man as 6', 165 pounds, short brown hair, white male, wearing dark trousers and a dark green plaid sport coat.

On 4/23/68, a neighborhood investigation was conducted at the Dallas South Shopping Center and it was determined that CARE BLACKBERN, Assistant Manager, Skillerns Drug Store, white male, 5'7", 170 pounds, brown hair, crewcut, carrying a brown paper bag, had been the individual identified by Mrs. WHITE. BLACKBURN was wearing a dark green plaid sport coat and dark slacks. He advised he had returned from lunch at approximately 11:10 AM and had walked up the alley next to the Skillerns Drug Store and entered the store. He said he was carrying a brown paper back with his lunch at that time.

Since this person is obviously the man seen by Mrs. WHITE, no further investigation is being conducted in this matter.

CHARLIE SHOWERS, a Negro male, septic tank installer, advised that he has telephone number 962-4761 and has had this number for several years. He recalls receiving a long distance call during the early morning hours during December 1967, which call was from his son in some place in Texas. He did not recall the point of origin of the call. He said his son was at that time en route home from California while serving in the military.
