William Bradford Hute has written a third article for "Look" magazine. The article appears in the issue dated April 15, 1989, but this issue was circulated on April 1, 1989. A review of the article reveals that James Far Lay allegedly registered at the Tay clodge Motel, Five Points, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29, 1883; at a motel near Florence, Alabama, on April 1, 1988; and at a motel near Corinth, Mississippi, on April 2, 1988. It is to be noted that Ray, using the name Harvey Lowmyer, negotiated the purchase of a rifle at the Aeromarine Supply Company, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29 and 30, 1989. On April 3, 1988, he was registered at the Rebel Motel in Temphis, Tennessee.

In an effort to establish whether or not Ray was in contact with any individuals immediately prior to the assassination, appropriate investigation should be conducted by the Birmingham and Jackson Offices. It should be understood that there is to be no indication made whatsoever that the following investigation has any connection whatsoever with the case involving James Earl Ray.

Birmingham and Jackson Offices should make inquiries of the motels in or near the cities indicated above to determine the identities of individuals registered during the period March 29 to April 3, 1966. Efforts should be made to identify all individuals listed. as well as

obtaining descriptions and registrations for the automobiles of such persons. A review of such records might indicate whether any one individual might have accompanied Ray or been in contact with him during this period. Fertinent or questionable registration records should be obtained if possible for examination by the FBI Laboratory.

Memphis should insure that the Eureau is kept currently advised of pertinent developments in this case, particularly all aspects of court action since the death of Judge Eattle on March 31, 1989.

In view of the fact that more than a year has passed since these persons stayed over night at Corinth, and since similar investigation of this type in this case has previously been unproductive, and since HUIE has admitted that RAY frequently is untruthful in statements to him, and further since it is not believed that it is of any particular importance to establish whether or not JAMES EARL RAY stayed over night at Corinth on 4/2/68, all offices will disregard the leads set out in Jackson airtel dated 5/7/69, unless specifically advised by the Bureau to cover same.

On 4/2/70, Mr. GORDON MC LENDON, owner and President of KLIF Radio Station, telephonically advised that an individual who had identified himself as JIM COLLINS, telephone 741-3161, indicated he was an employee of Spot Productions in Dallas, Texas, had called and stated that he would like to give some very confidential information to MC LENDON which he felt would result in an excellent story. COLLINS stated that he knew of some men in Memphis, Tenn. who definitely had some new evidence in the JAMES EARL RAY case and they would be able to prove that RAY was not in the room from which the shot was fired at MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. at the time of the shooting, but was in a nearby garage having his car fixed, and that KING was killed by a Cuban communist. He furnished the following names:

- 1. HAROLD STREIBICH, Attorney, Memphis
- 2. ARTHUR HANES, private Detective
- 3. RENFRO HAYES, Attorney, Memphis

I advised Mr. MC LENDON that of course this was a private murder case and that RAY had been represented by a number of attorneys, as far as I knew, but that I would check with our Memphis office and see if we had any interest at this time.

I talked to SAC ROBERT JENSEN, Memphis, and he stated that ARTHUR HANES was not a private investigator, but was actually RAY's first attorney; that he, of course, is a former FBI Agent and a lawyer from Birmingham, Alabama and he and WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE have collaborated in writing some kind of a story concerning RAY's life.

RENFRO HAYES is a private investigator, originally hired by HANES. He and HANES have fallen out and HAYES has filed suit against HANES, claiming that he has never been paid for his service in the amount of approximately \$10,000.

STREIBICH is listed as an attorney in Memphis, but his connection with the case is not known. JENSEN also stated

At 1:35 AM, 8/6/70, Det. SEWELL in the Crimes Against Persons Section of the Dallas PD telephoned me at home and advised that an individual by the name of ROY RICHARD ERWIN was at their department and had claimed that he was the person who drove the car in which JAMES EARL RAY disappeared from Memphis shortly after the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. SEWELL advised that the information he was furnishing was primarily public source material that could be obtained from the newspapers and that he had been caught in some discrepancies. He stated he had called Capt. BOB COCHRAN of the Memphis PD and COCHRAN had suggested that he might contact the Memphis FBI or that SEWELL might contact the local FBI to see if we were interested in interviewing ERWIN. He stated that ERWIN was a white male, admitted previous terms in the Georgia State Penitentiary and claimed to be from Dalton, Georgia.

I shortly thereafter called the Memphis Office and talked to ASAC CLIFF HALTER. HALTER stated that they had definite proof that RAY had driven the car himself and that there was no necessity for any interview with ERWIN. I so advised Det. SEWELL.

ADDENDUM; At 12:30 PM this date, Capt. GEORGE LUMPKIN of JGS:mfr the Dallas PD stated that he and one of his officers had reinterviewed ERWIN and that ERWIN was insistent now that he had been paid \$1,000 to drive a stolen car with a police radio in it away from where MARTIN LUTHER KING had been killed and divert the police in their chase of trying to locate RAY. He stated he had recorded same and that he would make a copy available.

I again called the Memphis Office and talked to ASAC HALTER, who stated we should send them the summary of what ERWIN is claiming, but that this matter had been run out and there was nothing to it. He was asked, however, to search and see if they

He stated Agents had interviewed him and it had been determined that he was a chronic liar and was actually not in Memphis on the date of the murder, but was in Chattanooga, Tenn.

I called Capt. LUMPKIN back and he stated immediately that ERWIN had now admitted both of the stories were false. He was also told, however, that we had had previous contact with ERWIN and that there was no indication he was mixed up in the case.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (UPI) -James Earl Ray, convicted assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., filed a \$50,000 damage suit against Tennessee officials, claiming he was being confined in "oppressive" conditions for a crime he did not commit.

The suit, one of many legal actions taken by Ray since his guilty plea in the 1968 assassination, drew special attention when a local television station quoted sources Wednesday night as saying Ray's suit would contend others were involved in the King

But the only hint of conspiracy mentioned in the suit concerned two telephone numbers of persons in Louisiana. Ray claimed his former attorney, Percy Foreman, had mishandled information about the phone numbers.

And in an interview with the Nashvile Banner Thursday, Ray said, "I never saw anybody shoot King. But that's as far as I want to go."
"As far as the crime, I

contend I'm not guilty," Ray told the Banner. "But there no use for me to make

statements to the newspaper that I'm not guilty. I've got to get in a courtroom for

Ray, who drafted the suit in his solitary-confinement cell in the state prison, said he gave the two phone numbers to Foreman, who in turn gave them to the late Z. T. Osborn, another of Ray's attorneys, who was later disbarred.

The suit says one of the numbers belonged to a Baton Rouge Parish (County) official "under the influence" of a Teamsters Union official.

Ray Loses Bid for New Trial

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (UPI)— James Earl Ray, convicted assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., lost a bid for a new trial Thursday when a federal judge ruled Ray's initial guilty plea in the case was voluntary and "on the advice of competent counsel of his own choosing."

Ray claimed his famed defense attorney, Percy Foreman of Houston, had compromised his rights and pressured him into admitting the 1968 murder in order to preserve the commercial value of books written about the murder of the Evil Eights leader.

But, U.S. District Judge Robert McRae Jr. rejected Ray's arguments and accepted instead the state's contention that Ray made a "reasoned and reasonable decision to accept a 99-year sentence rather than risk the death penalty" by going to trial.

."Although the circumstances (surrounding the guilty plea) include conduct on the part of Ray's retained attorneys that should have been performed differently," McRae said in a 38-page decision, "The total circumstances do not reflect a violation of the Constitutional rights applicable to one who voluntarily pleaded guilty on the advice of competent counsel of his own choosing."

Ray is serving his sentence at the main Tennessee prison in Nash-He and was not present for Mc-Rae's ruling. However, one of his three defense lawyers, Robert Livingston of Memphis, was in the court.

"We have no complaint at all about the fairness of this court," Livingston said as he prepared to telephone his fellow attorneys—Bernard Fensterwald and James Lesar of Washington—with the news.

"He ruled against us, but we have two courts upstairs (the 6th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Cincinnati and the U.S. Supreme Court) that could rule (McRae)"

The coverup by Sen. Church

WASHINGTON—On Oct. 10, 1963, the then-attorney general of the United States put his personal signature on a document that launched and legitimatized one of the most horrendous abuses of federal police power in this century.

In Sen. Frank Church's subcommittee hearing room, the authorized wiretapping and subsequent unauthorized bugging and attempted blackmailing of Martin Luther King Jr. is being gingerly examined, with the "investigation" conducted in such a way as not to unduly embarrass officials of the Kennedy or Johnson administrations.

No zest

With great care, the committee has focused on the FBI. When the committee counsel first set forth the result of shuffling through press clips, it seemed as if no Justice Department had existed in 1962; Wednesday, an FBI witness pointed out that it was Robert Kennedy who authorized the wiretap of Dr. King, and that "the President of the United States and the attorney general specifically discussed their concern of Communist influence with Dr. King."

But the Church committee showed no zest for getting further to the Kennedy root of this precedent to Watergate eavesdropping. If Church were willing to let the chips fall where they may, he would call some knowledgeable witnesses into the glare of the camera lights and ask them some questions that have gone unasked for 13 years.

For example, he could call Nicholas Katzenbach, Attorney General Kennedy's deputy and successor, and ask what he knows of the Kennedy decision to wiretap Dr. King. Who at Justice concurred in the recommendation? How does the FBI know the President was consulted or informed?

After Katzenbach assumed office, and the wiretapping continued, he was told by angry newsmen that the FBI was leaking scurrilous information about Dr. King. Why did he wait for four months, and for a thousand telephonic interceptions, to discontinue the officially-approved tap?

Of course, this sort of testimony would erode Church's political base. That is why we do not see former Asst. FBI Director Cartha (Deke) Deloach, Lyndon Johnson's personal contact with the FBI, in the witness chair. What did President Johnson know about the character-assassination plot and when did he know it? What conversations took place between Deloach and President Johnson of the tapping of Dr. King, or about the use of the FBI in any other intrusions into the lives of political figures?

THE COMMITTEE is not asking embarrassing questions even when answers are readily available. A couple of weeks ago, at an open hearing, an FBI man inadvertently started to blurt out an episode about newsmen who were wiretapped in 1962 with the apparent knowledge of Attorney General Kennedy. The too-willing witness was promptly shooshed into silence, and told that such information would be developed only in executive session. Nobody even raised an eyebrow.

That pattern of containment by the Church committee is vividly shown by the handling of the buggings at the 1964 Republican and Democratic conventions which were ordered by Lyndon

Johnson. Such invasions of pointeal headquarters were worse than the crime committed at Watergate, since they involved the use of the FBI, but the Church investigators seem to be determined not to probe too deeply.

Double standard

If FBI documents say that reports were made to specific Johnson aides, why are those men not given the same opportunity to publicly tell their story so avidly given the next president's men? If Lyndon Johnson committed this impeachable high crime of using the FBI to spy on political opponents, who can be brought forward to tell us all about it?

But that would cause embarrassment to Democrats, and Church wants to embarrass professional employes of investigatory agencies only. A new sense of congressional decorum exists, far from the sense of outrage expressed in the Senate Watergate committee's hearing room. When it is revealed that the management of NBC

News gave press credentials to LBJ's spies at the 1964 convention, everybody blushes demurely—and nobody demands to know which network executive made what decision under what pressure.

I have been harranguing patient readers for years about the double standard applied to Democratic and Republican political crimes, and had hoped the day would come when the hardball precedents set by the Kennedy and Johnson men would be laid before the public in damning detail.

Obviously, Democrat Frank Church is not the man to do it. His jowl-shaking indignation is all too selective; the trail of high-level responsibility for the crimes committed against Dr. King and others is evidently going to be allowed to cool.

Pity. You'd think that after all the nation has been through in the past few years, our political leaders would have learned that the one thing that brings you down is the act of covering up.

Dr. King letter held unjustified

WASHINGTON — A top
FBI official testified Wednesday there was no legal
justification for the 25 separate attempts by the
bureau in the 1960s to discredit the late Dr. Martin
Luther King Jr. as a civil
rights leader.

James B. Adams, associate deputy FBI director, teld the Senate Intelligence Committee there is "no statutory basis or justification" for the attempts which included sending King and hill wife an anonymous letter which King took as disaggestion he commit subcide.

ADAMS SAID, however, he believes the FBI was justified in Investigating King because of the possibility that Communist influences were being brought to bear on him and on the civil rights movement.

He said he can find no basis for King's conclusion that the FBI-prepared letter and the tape recording that accompanied it suggested King kill himself. But he acknowledged under questioning that interpretation is "a possibility."

in another development related to disclosures of FBI harassment of dissidents, director Clarence Kelley urged Congress to exercise more control over his bureau and help "restore any breach of credibility" it had suffered.

ON THE NBC-TV Today program, he said Congress should pick an FBI director "in whom they have trust, then set up regulations and guidelines and then have good oversight.

"I would not object at all to come to congress and report to the committee with oversight authority and tell them exactly what we are doing and how we are doing it."

Witnesses said the bureau similarly harassed a wide range of Americans and compiled 500,000 dossiers between 1959 and 1971 on Communists, student radicals, blacks, feminists, the Ku / Klux Klan, auti-war grups and others.

Sprague: Ray says he had help in King killing

Compiled from wire reports

James East Pay, convicted assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King, has told House investigators that he was aided by other persons both before and after the slaying of the civil rights leader, former House Assassination Committee chief coursel Richard A. Sprague said Monday.

Sprague, who interviewed Ray at the Brushy Mountain State Prison in Tennessee last month, said Ray talked about accomplices but did not identify them.

"All of this suggests that this (Ray) was a person who did not act alone," Sprague said.

Meanwhile, in Nashville, Tenn., Jack Kershaw, Ray's attorney, said Monday he will ask the House Assassinations Committee for further ballistics tests on the rifle which police said Ray used to kill the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Je

Sprague resigned as the assassination committee's chief of staff march 30.

Sprague conceded that he was unable, prior to his resignation, to develop information which might either prove or disprove Ray's claim of receiving assistance. But he said the words of Ray, who pleaded guilty to the 1968 slaying and is serving a 99-year prison sentence, provided leads that should be explored.

Ray has been trying for years to withdraw his guilty plea and win a full rial. In a number of recent statements, he has maintained that King was killed by a mysterious Latin whom Ray knew only as "Raoul."

A Justice Department task force recently concluded there was no evidence that Ray was part of a conspiracy though the report said the source Ray's funds "remains a mystery." Ray spent more than \$10,000 during the year, while his total earnings were just a little more than \$600

Meanwhile in Columbus, Ohio, federal authorities plan to investigate an Ohio Penitentiary inmate's claim that FBI and CIA agents offered a New York underworld figure a \$1 million contract in 1968 to kill Martin Luther King Jr., it was reported today.

Scripps-Howard Newspapers, in a copyrighted article by William Pillar, said Ed Evans, chief investigator for the House assassinations committee, will question Myron Billett, 52, in connection with his allegations.

Billett, alias Paul Buccilli, told C.cipps-Howard Newspapers he set up a secret meeting in January 1968 at a hideaway motel in Appalachin, N.Y., between the agents and the late Carlos Gambino, who reportedly headed one of five New York crime families.

Billett, who also claims to be a former undercover agent for the FBI, said he was told the offer to kill King came from Washington and was approved by the late FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

Billett said Gambino, however, rejected the contract and later passed the word from New York City that none of the crime families, with which he was associated, would accept the offer to kill

Billett, in a letter to Scripps-Howard newspapers, said he wanted tell his story to congressional probers now that others are alleging conspiracies existed in the assassination of Ring at 1968 and (insicate page, name of newspaper, city and state.) "I think we better lay it on the line before someone blows the lid on the whole deal," Billett wrote. "Carlo Gambino was the top man who said no to the CIA and FBI. I do know that the order came right down from Washington and it was approved by Hooges.

"I can give you the meeting place we had in New York, the name of the motel, the woman who called ahead and made the arrangements for us and thousand who were at the meeting," he said.

J. Edgar Hoover, wanted King dead.

An FBI spokesman said the bureau would have 'no comment" on the allegation that it conspired to have King killed.

THE BOOK alleges that:

 Dr. King's police protection was removed on the day of the assassination in a plot that involved city and federal authorities.

• An FBI unit in the Atlanta office which was referred to as the "destroy King squad" investigated and covered up the death of King, a Nobel Prize winner.

 King's convicted assassin, James Earl Ray, who pleaded guilty to the murder before publicly recanting the confession, was set up as a patsy by unnamed indi-

While the book covers considerable material included in the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence's report

last year, it apparently includes some new "findings."
The book depicts a "cozy" relationship between the Memphis police department and the FBI, including the fact that a top police official was a good friend and former colleague of Hoover

It also says that a 21-year FBI veteran, Arthur Murtagh, recalls that when King was shot in Memphis, agents in the anti-King Atlanta unit expressed delight.

"They got 'Zorro' the -," Lane said of how one top FBI official reacted. "They finally got the -."

ZORRO, LANE said, was the FBI's code name for King.

At the news conference, Lane and Gregory also showed parts of a taped interview with Ray, who maintained his innocence

Interviewed in his prison cell in Tennessee by Lane, Ray said he was coerced into pleading guilty by state and federal authorities who threatened to harm his brothers if he did otherwise.

That assertion was supported by Jerry Ray, the convicted killer's brother, who said a third brother, John Ray, is serving an 18-year sentence for a "bank robbery he didn't commit."

The Lane-Gregory book comes at a time at which the beleaguered House Committee on Assassinations appears to have overcome all congressional obstacles in its drive to determine who killed King and former President John Kennedy.

The assassinations panel, plagued by internal bickering and stiff congressional opposition, secured a \$2.5 million budget last week after trimming its initial request by \$4 million.

THE COMMITTEE lately has taken a low profile while it shops around for a new staff director to replace Richard Sprague, the controversial former head who quit on the eve of an important reconstitution vote in March.

One staffer said the current committee is like a "ship without a rudder sailing smoothly after a rough start."
