Thereafter, RICHARDSON was immediately recontacted in person and available photographs, including photographs from the wanted flyer, were shown to RICHARDSON and he still maintained it was highly possible that the hitchhiker he had just let out could be RAY.

RICHARDSON said that this man claimed to be a Canadian and was enroute to Vancouver, Canada, where he hoped to obtain a construction job. RICHARDSON said this man claimed he had hitchhiked an airplane ride from the Bahamas to Miami and then had hitchhiked all the way from Miami coming through Alabama, Louisiana, Texas, New Mexico, and Colorado. RICHARDSON said this man appeared to be very tanned, almost sunburned, and had said he had been in the Bahamas for the past two months. RICHARDSON observed although this man said he was a Canadian, he did not seem to be very conversant with the geography of Canada. RICHARDSON described this man as follows:

Age Approximately 38 - 40
Height 5'10"
Weight 165 - 170 pounds
Eyes Blue or gray
Hair Medium brown

Hair was half-way between a crewcut and long. RICHARDSON said this man complained about his unruly hair and said he was letting it grow out from a crewcut. This man was not carrying any luggage but RICHARDSON observed this man had at least \$100.

Extensive efforts to locate the individual as described by RICHARDSON were conducted immediately and have produced no results to date. These efforts included checking of buses and trains for Canada as they were loaded in Seattle, checking buses at the Canadian border; checking one bus at Everett, Washington, that had left Seattle for Canada prior to the time the SA's arrived at the Seattle bus station; checking highway routes from Seattle to Canada that a hitchhiker could use; and immediately recontacting and alerting the border patrol at the Canadian line.



Enclosed for the Bureau is a business card of PETER N. GORMAN, a builder, who resides at 9023 Lark Ellen Circle, Los Angeles, California.

GORMAN provided this card to SA G. J. MOOREHEAD on 4/25/68 and explained that on Friday, 4/19/68, he had hired a day laborer from the street in Los Angeles what he described as the slave market. He said that this is where transient non-union workers gather for day jobs.

The man he hired demolished a shed that GORMAN had on one of his job sites and assisted GORMAN in placing several glass doors in his garage. GORMAN asked the man if he could work again on 4/20/68 and this was agreed. The man wrote his name, telephone number and address on the reverse of the enclosed business card. It is shown as follows:

When GORMAN went to pick this individual up on the morning of 5/20/68, the man did not appear. GORMAN checked at the hotel and determined that they had no tenant named JUNEAU and that the telephone was a disconnected number. GORMAN did not have a good recollection of the man, however, he said he was similar to a newspaper picture of JAMES EARL RAY. This person said he had been in New Orleans, however, GORMAN also had been in New Orleans and from their conversation he said it was obvious to him that the man was not familiar with that city.

GORMAN provided the following description: White, male, 5'10", 165 pounds, slight to medium build, 40 years, right-handed, brown hair.

GORMAN pointed out that he realized that many of the persons who "shape up" in the slave market are "on the lamb" and that even if this man is not RAY, he might still have reason to conceal his identity.

The Bureau is requested to examine the enclosed card for any handwriting comparisons that can be made. GORMAN stated that he has fingered the card repeatedly and would have obliterated any fingerprints. The Bureau may dispose of this card as they see fit.

The glass doors mentioned herein were inspected for latents and none were located.
