King Challenges Court Restraint, Vows To March

Attorneys representing Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. go before United States District Judge Bailey Brown at 2:30 p.m. this morning to challenge a temporary restraining order against any mass march here.

Dr. King and others planning a Monday march in support of striking sanitation workers yesterday appeared headed toward a possible clash with the order.

But United States Atty. Thomas R. Brown said the temporary order is not meant to be enforced even if it means calling in federal troops.

LBJ Going To Hawaii To Consult On Peace Move, Set Stage For Red Meeting

US Wary Of Bid To Talk Of Peace On Enemy Terms

WASHINGTON, April 3. — The administration is expected to take to North Vietnam about Hanoi's latest peace proposals, but it is frankly suspicious that it is merely being invited to talk about ending the war on the enemy's terms.

The fear in official quarters here is that the Hanoi government is using the recent political convulsion in the United States as an invitation to demand the departure of former Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara, the replacement of Gen. William Westmoreland, and the forthcoming retirement of President Johnson, as a condition for talks.
