Postal Buildings Blocked In House

Union Station Complex Tied Up In Dispute

Plans to construct a nine-million-dollar Post Office complex on the Union Station site at 300 East Calhoun have been pincushioned by a House subcommittee.

A jurisdictional battle between the White House and House Public Works subcommittee on public buildings and grounds has tied up plans for the new building.

The Union facility would replace DeLoe and Davis stations. Butler, Amer and Post Office garage. Most offices now in the Main Street Post Office would be shifted to which held back.

Without the approval of the subcommittee, headed by Representative E. J. Cramer (D-Mo.), Congress cannot put up funds for the project. It is anticipated that the Johnson administration will back away from the battle and the projects will be cleared.

Plans for the projects were sent back to the General Services Administration by the subcommittee because of an administrative stand that President Johnson, and not the subcommittee, should decide which projects are approved and which held back.

Masaryk's Death Back In Spotlight

Czech Officials To Reinvestigate 20-Year-Old Disputed Mystery

PRAGUE, April 3. — (UPI) — The Czechoslovak government's office announced Wednesday it will reinvestigate the controversial death of former Foreign Minister Jan Masaryk, a disputed mystery for 20 years.

The body of Dr. Masaryk, son of the founder of Czechoslovakia, Thomas G. Masaryk, was found in the courtyard of the foreign ministry March 10, 1948.

The Communist regime which had just seized power had incriminated suicide by jumping from a bathroom window. For two decades belief has circulated both here and abroad that he was murdered. His death symbolizes the brutality of Stalin era rule for millions of his countrymen.

An announcement by deputy general prosecutor Frantisek Cerny that the case would be reopened was viewed as part of the liberal trend in the new Communist regime which took control last January. The senior Masaryk, known as a "good person," has been rehabilitated.

Meanwhile, the attorney in the Czech government controlled, Deputy Premier Otakar Strougal and Defense Minister Klement Lomsky resigned Wednesday as the new reformist leadership pushed a sweeping reshuffle of the Communist government and party hierarchy. The two formerly were supporters of the ousted president and party chief, Antonin Novotny.

ANTWERP, Belgium, April 3. — (UPI) — Hippies and flower children, some with beards and long hair, were seen in the streets of Antwerp Wednesday night, a striking 19th-century church early Wednesday night.

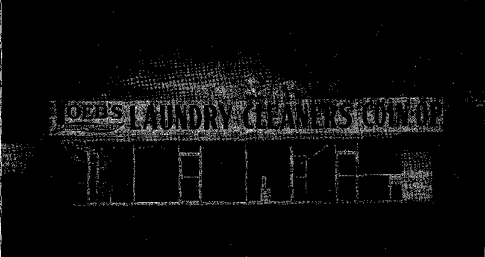

Senators Say Offer By Hanoi Is Encouraging

The North Vietnamese offer to the South Vietnamese is "certainly very important," Sen. Fulbright said today. "It is quite different from the offer we have received on past occasions." Fulbright said he hoped there would be a cease-fire before any formal negotiations begin, but would not make this a precondition for talks.

Fulbright conceded he was wrong when he predicted in the Senate Tuesday that the new bombing restrictions imposed by President Johnson would prove of little consequence and would offer no incentive to peace negotia-

tion to peace negotiations. He said Mrs. Fulbright had criticized his Tuesday remarks, telling him that he talked too much. "She told me I should keep my mouth shut," he said.

Senator Albert Gore (D-Tenn.), a member of Fulbright's committee and who has given with the Arkansas, said of the Hanoi offer: "At least it is movement—and movement in the right direction."

"While it is the first overt move for a face-to-face conversation, we should not be too about it is genuine and serious and explore it and exploit it if possible."

There was very little speculation here on the possible effect of the Hanoi offer on the American presidential race, Gore said. "It is too nebulous to have any effect at this time."

The Daily State primary
proved both that Lyndon John-
son is far from dead, political-
ly, and that Senator Eugene
McCarthy — a nobody four
weeks ago — is now a serious
contender for the presidency.

Equally important, it dis-
closed that Richard M. Nixon,
galling up 30 per cent of the
GOP vote, has the momentum
that should be virtually un-
stoppable — no matter what
sensationalism Nelson Rockefeller
faller of New York and Ronald
Reagan of California eventual-
ly decide to do.

President Johnson, on the
ballot but not in the running,
polled 37 per cent of the Demo-
cratic vote, despite his dra-
matic withdrawal from the
race Sunday night.

For Democratic profes-
sionals around the country, regis-
ter a hint on whether the pub-
lic will take the President at
his word and count him in for
the next summer election.

If the Vietnam War has tak-
en its toll on the President's

gust, Johnson must be

drop below 50 per cent and the
President's would edge up
over 40 — far from the thum-
ping victory of 60 per cent
or more.
