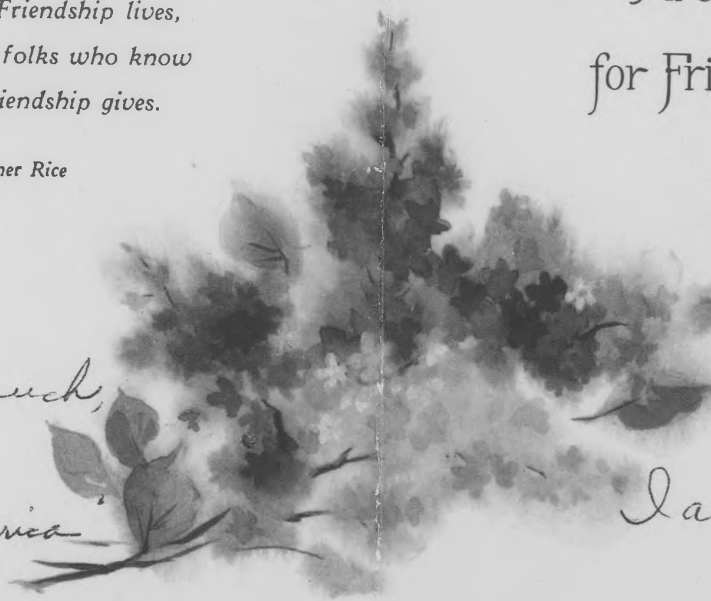

In retaliation for the family's participation in numerous marches, the landlord riddled their outside water pump with bullets (their only source of water), and ordered them to vacate their house.

The family then secured a piece of ground from a friend and, with money sent by Operation Freedom to purchase materials, built the house pictured above. Members of the Saulsbery family did the construction work.

Last spring a group of displaced families in Wilcox County, some thirty miles south of Selma, secured an acreage of land, and planted their first crop of cucumbers. A neighboring processing plant purchased all they could produce. These families look forward to the formation of a vegetable co-operative, and want to secure a larger acreage for their planting next spring. The processing plant assures them that it will buy their entire crop. Last spring, Operation Freedom made a grant to these displaced families for the purchase of seed and fertilizer.

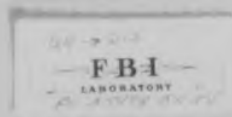

SELMA AND VICINITY

Outside Selma, Alabama, but in the same county (Dallas), there is an enormous plantation - the Minter plantation - which stretches for miles and miles along the highway and the county roads. This is one of the plantations which existed back in the days of slavery; it has passed on to succeeding generations of Minters. A large number of Minter tenants are now suffering because Mr. Minter has not liked their participation in the freedom movement.



Mrs. Bertha Lee Perkins, pictured above with her husband and five of her 13 children, participated in the Selma marches at the time of the Pettus Bridge bludgeonings, and spent time in jail. Her family is one of those whom Mr. Minter will be evicting after the deadline of December 31.



Mrs. Pearl Moorer, second from the right in the back row, has participated in many phases of the struggle. She is a central figure in the Minter plantation group of tenant farmers which has been receiving Operation Freedom aid during the past year.

On Mrs. Moorer's right is Arthur Brown who has spent his life on this plantation and who picks cotton by feeling for it, as he lost the sight of one eye years ago, and has nearly lost the sight of the other. Piles of cotton can be seen in front. Mr. Brown and the Moorers are among those who face eviction on December 31.



This is the Moorer family (two children are away at school). Mrs. Moorer is at the left of the truck's tailgate, and her husband, Mr. Will Moorer, is at the right. The sign on the back of their truck says "Vote Independent," a very unpopular sign with the white landowners who not only are seeing Negroes go to the polls and vote but are seeing them campaign for Negroes who are for the first time running for office against the party machines. The three boys in the truck attend the formerly all-white elementary school.



Pictured above are the nine children who are attending the formerly all-white schools in Wilcox County, outside Selma. Sherryl Threadgill (who lives in Camden) is standing second from the right in the back row. She was struck a hard blow on the nose by a white boy at school. Fearing her nose had been broken, her parents took her to Selma for an examination. Fortunately it was not broken. Sherryl returned to Camden undaunted and more determined than before to remain in school. Seated on the car to her left is her father, Rev. Thomas Threadgill. At the extreme left is Albert Gordon, who drives the children to and from school, since busses for white children refuse to pick up Negroes.
