Paul Carter, Manager of the Luggage Department, Irving's Sport Shop, 10th & E Sts N.W. Washington DC looked at the Q15 zipper bag and stated the bag model is "Tel-Star" and is manufactured in Japan.

This model was put out originally in 6 ^{sizes} pieces - 16", 18", 20", 22" 24" & 26". He stated the Q15 bag is a 20". Each piece measures slightly less than is claimed, such as the 20" bag measures approximately 19".

Carter sells the 20" bag for \$5⁹⁵ to \$6⁹⁵.
