Dear Mr. Hoover:

On Sunday afternoon, April 7, a white male was driving north on Interstate 71 in Ohio near the Ashland, Ohio exit. His car had an Alabama license plate 3-34652. The car, a very old model, was palest blue, almost white, with a top almost entirely red rust in color from rust. He. attracted my attention when he drove around me with his face covered by his right hand. Very foolishly I followed him for about half an hour at speeds from 70-90 miles per hour. Each time he went around another car he placed his right hand over the right portion of his face, concealing his profile. From his haste and attempt to conceal his identity I had the uncanny feeling that he was in interstate flight and trying to avoid being recognized. Near the bottom of the rear car window were black letters and numbers about $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 inches high which said, KKK 2---. I was unable to catch the last three numbers of this four digit series.

Please check the driver of Alabama license 3-34652. He acted very strangely. Could he possibly be the murderer of Dr. Martin Luther King? Some 60+ hours after the crime in Memphis, he could, by swift driving be already in Ohio.

Sir, this is no crank letter. I am just trying to help out in this time of trouble.





"THESE ARE WRITTEN. THAT YE MIGHT BELIEVE ..."

The heartthrob of the Gospel of John is sounded in these words, found in John 20: 31. Complete the verse, and you have the whole purpose of the gospel in one sentence: "... that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name."

This is why John is called "The Gospel of Faith." Yet, paradoxically, the word faith does not appear in this gospel. Just once, a form of the word appears: "Be not faithless, but believing" (words spoken by the Risen Christ to Thomas-Jn. 20: 27).

The fact that the word believe or a form of the word -believed, believest, believeth, or believing—appears 98 times in the Book of John can be used as a basis for giving it the title, "The Gospel of Faith." Note particularly that these are verb forms-words of action. John says to believe, instead of saying to have belief.

But there is a much deeper reason than statistics with words for giving this title to John's Gospel. Believing is an inherent element of each story that John has told, whether any form of the word appears in the story or not.

Likewise, believing is the underlying purpose of these lessons: "Studies in the Gospel of John."

Note:

It would be wise to investigate each and everyone of these officers. Because once they organize on what attitude to take, you will have a hard time finding out anything.



This is the fourth letter regarding ways and clues to solving the murder of Martin Luther King.

When the Negroes had their Progressive National Baptist Convention in Memphis, Tennessee a year or two ago, I wrote the Police Department right away and warned them to keep an eye on Charles G. Adams, of Boston. I gave them the license Number of his \$5200 Buick Electra which he had just forced his poor members to give him for this convention. His members had a fist fight and hair-pulling in the meeting over differing in giving him such an expensive car while they were so poor. He stood in cold blood and watched the fighting and would not give up in his intentions to get the expensive Buick.

I also wrote the Memphis Police Dept. that Adams was a trouble maker in starting racial marches and causing uproars among the races. I simply told the Police to be on guard against Adams in Memphis. But I did a foolish thing; I wrote the Negro Judge B. L. Hooks, a judge and resident of Memphis, and told him that Adams deserved a reprimand for making his congregation give him a new car under a fist-fight in his church here in Boston. I told him how poor the membership was and how divided they were on lavishing gifts and trips upon Charles G. Adams. I did not know that Adams and Hooks were the closest of friends. So Hooks never replied to my letter.

so if Hooks and Adams were friends, as close as I think they are, it would be well if the FBI would question (without Hooks' knowledge) certain White Officials who also work in the Courthouse, and see if Hooks ever registered objections to King's marches in that City. Since Adams was against King's way of staging marches, it may be that Hooks was against it also. And certainly white official would agree with Hooks and this may account for a white man's slaying of King. Hooks may have taken the same attitude as Adams against King. It should be a very indirect investigation and in feeling out Hooks' attitude among the whites. He may have opposed the march in Charles G. Adams' favor as well as the whites of that city. This investigation should be most indirect. Hooks could have worked against King through the Police Department. Hooks is teamed up with Adams here in Boston.

Note how the two are on the same roster of officersprine sandt with the National Negro Baptist Convention and Publishing Company.

Gentlemen:

This is the third letter to you giving possible clues to the Martin Luther King slaying.

Since Charles G. Adams took Martin Luther King's pulpit in Atlanta. Georgia for the whole week before King was slain, it seems he, Adams, should be questioned as to who appointed him to run the revival and under what conditions; he should also be questioned as to any confidences he may have entered into with the officers of Dr. King's church (many times the deacons and trustees de confide in a visiting minister against the passor); (Adams had a way of trying to root greater men than himself out of their positions).

It would be very wise to question the tenor of things during his schedule with Martin Luther King's church in Atlanta last week, to determine if Adams did any secret deals with King's membership. Adams likes to place his friends in big churches. especially from Harvard and who knows if they are not paying him large sums of money for such pastoral placements?

Adams actually wants rulership, and sponsors more racism than Christian doctrine. He staged a march against the Police Dept. in Dorchester. Mass about two years ago.

Now he is presently fooling his illiterate congregation with the idea of building a Concord Towers for \$30,000. He keeps them raising money, but with no results. When this \$30,000 is raised he will in all probability give them a reason why he cannot go through with it.

He may keep his monies deposited in Detroit, Mich. his home town, where he spends the summer every year. He has found that his Harvard Masters Degree helps him to fool and fleece the unlearned Negro people, so he keeps them jumping.

He knew he was against Dr. King, and yet took his pulpit last wee

He has invited Martin Luther King's father here to speak in his church next month, just as a drawing card for money purposes. Just as he posted the title Truman Capate's IN COLD BLOOD on his church bulletin to attract big money collection

Charles G. Adams should be very cautiously and thoughtfully questioned regarding the death of Martin Luther King. COMPANDE he was not King's friend, although he posed as star-

I have already written you one letter concerning remarks and plans by Charles G. Adams against the late Martin Luther King. but since I read the newspapers today and see where the marches Ld will continue as usual, I recalled Adams saying: "Dr. King does not have enough intelligence as to staging his marches."

The Southern Conference must have some guilty members on its roster, because the inflow of donated funds has attracted men such as Charles G. Adams. He told his Concord Baptist Church Membership that they were striving with Martin Luther King to submit to their organized authority in the handling of marches which would also require their authority over the inflow of the donated funds.

Mr. King had a harder struggle with his greedy fellow Negro ministers than he did with the whole white race.

After the Progressive National Convention at Memphis a few years ago, Adams has not ceased to find fault with Dr. King's way of handling things. Adams is a money grafter and he is overcharged with Black Power.

So, I feel if they are so cocksure and calm about continued marches in spite of King's tragic death, their plans must have gone through at the death of the leader of both marches and financial donations.

There is nothing under the heavens that Charles G. Adams wants more than money and power.

He lives at 40 Hillsboro Road, Mattapan, Mass. He is as saintly as any man you can meet and can fool the very "elect" if it were possible. He had to be a traiter if her cauling reach in King's pulpit the week before he was killed and had already planned against him.

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

Gentlemen:

If you will study very carefully this list of Baptist Officers who were closely associated with Martin Luther King you will find the names of two who should be questioned very carefully.

These are preachers who pulled out from the regular National Baptist Convention and organized a convention of their own, but could not rule Martin Luther King when it came to staging marches. After this convention about two or three years ago, Charles G. Adams, historian, on the list of officers came back to Concord Baptist Church here in Boston and started to poison the minds of his members against Martin Luther King and the way he staged his marches. This list also includes a very close friend of Adams who is a judge in the courts of Memphis, Wennessee, namely, Judge B. Hooks (you will see his name also on the enclosed list of officers) who did not agree with King and his marches. They wanted to help control the marches, but it seems King would not accept their arguments.

This same Charles G. Adams of Concord Baptist of Boston has just finished a week's revival in Martin Luther King's church in Atlanta, but he was not King's friend. There was also some (strife over King's manner of doing things. They contended that King was staging marches against the hands that fed them, etc.

I really do not think you could make a mistake by questioning both this Judge B. Hooks of the Memphis Courts and this Charles G. Adams of Boston who preached in King's church the week before he was killed. They did much to knock King's manner of staging marches.

These officers methonly pulled out from the regular convention but pulled out from the publishing company and started publishing their own literature. There has always been the most SURPhitter strife in these National Baptists Conventions.

Enclosed for transmission to the FBI Laboratory are two packages of laundry tapes, four tapes per package, obtained from Thermo-Seal marking machine, Naples, Florida.

BYRON MILLER, foreman, Prather's Laundry, Naples, Florida, advised he uses a Thermo-Seal marking seal and Thermo Seal tape rolls made by the Textile Marking Machine Company, Inc., Syracuse, New York. He stated the code 02B-6 or D2B-6 is not one of his codes and never has been. MILLER's machine is model H5L1, serial number 31793.

Samples of code 02B-6 and D2B-6 were run on the above machine and it was noted that depending on how the machine was operated, the first part of the letter "O" or "D" could be cut off if the machine is operated fast. If themmachine is operated fast, the first letter is partially cut off many times. MILLER advised this does not mean the machine is faulty.

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This machine also stamped out the entire code when properly operated and portions of the "O" and "D" were not cut off.

These tapes are being forwarded to the FBI Laboratory for information inasmuch as MILLER advised that when these machines are operated too fast, the first digit of the code is often cut in half. These tapes are not being furnished for comparison with those submitted by the Memphis Division in captioned matter, since MILLER advised that this code is unknown to him.

It is requested that these tapes be returned to the Miami Office at such time as the FBI Laboratory has examined them.

Any background information from your files or developed in the interview which would bear on the validity of her information should also be obtained. Advise Jones that if she has additional information to furnish, she may find it more convenient to furnish it directly to your office in Boston.

Submit results within two days receipt furnishing appropriate copies to the office of origin, Memphis.

Sara F. Jones in a letter to the Bureau dated 4/5/68 and two letters dated 4/6/68 discusses the differences in the leadership of the Baptist ministry of which Martin Luther King was a member. She states that one minister, the Reverend Charles G. Adams, in the Boston church reports to be a friend of Kings, but in reality he opposed him for control of the finances and program of the church and poisons people's minds against him. She indicated that Adams and the judge in Tennessee, who had enjoined King's march, should be investigated in connection with the shooting of King. She has no specifics, and it would appear she has a fixation concerning the Reverend Adams opposition to King. There is no pertinent information in Bureau files identifiable with Jones. Her letter is not being answered in writing as she possibily has a mental problem.
