LAST WEDNESDAY, APRIL SEVENTEEN, WHICHARD WAS AT OGLESBY'S TRAILER AND REMOVED FROM THE TRAILER A LARGE NUMBER OF EMPTY BEER CANS THAT WERE IN THE TRAILER FROM THE NIGHT BEFORE THE KILLING. OGLESBY CLAIMED TO HAVE BEEN UP ALL NIGHT WITH A FRIEND AND HIS FRIEND'S GIRL FRIEND FROM TEXAS. AT THIS TIME OGLESBY HAD ON A BED, TWO RIFLES, ONE OF WHICH HAD A SCOPE, A SHOTGUN AND A REVOLVER AND LARGE QUANTITY OF AMMUNITION WHICH HE DESCRIBED AS EIGHT THOUSAND ROUNDS.

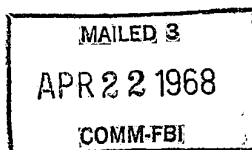

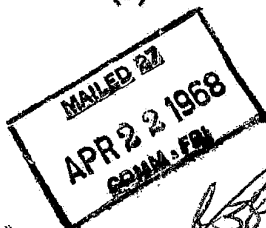

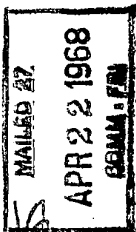
