This case concerns the murder of Martin Euther King, Jr.

Personnel of the Exhibits Section were dispatched to the Memphis and Birmingham Divisions in order to produce an artist's sketch of the unknown subject based upon witnesses' observations and descriptions. Witnesses in Birmingham furnished oral descriptions which are at variance with the descriptions of Memphis witnesses. Consequently the artists' conceptions show differences which cannot be reconciled.

It was not felt that we should provide the press an artist's conception which was not a good likeness and which would possibly further confuse witnesses and other citizens who may have seen the unknown subject. To have done so would have not been in the best interest of the Bureau and could lead to further unwarranted criticism.

ACTION:

The Exhibits Section personnel now in Memphis are being dispatched to Atlanta in order to prepare sketches from descriptions obtained from witnesses at the rooming house where Galt was last

seen.

## FBI SECRETIVE ABOUT SKETCH

Police Say Drawing Of King Slayer Is Withheld

Memphis, April 14 (F)—The FBI is withholding nation-wide distribution of a composite drawing of the assassin of the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., police sources said today...

"They haven't given us anything but a physical description," said one police official. "They aren't handing out pictures of the man. They either don't have a good one, or they're going it alone."

The official asked that his name not be used, citing the FBI's ban on comment about the investigation.

#### Resemblance Noted

When Jacksonville (Fla.) police questioned a Louisville man last night about Dr. King's slaying—the man since has been cleared of any connection—police Lt. M. P. Richardson said, "It's a long shot, but he looks too much like the sketch of the man who is wanted in the King slaying."

Jacksonville police said today that the man was arrested after a resident noted a likeness to a composite picture which appeared in Florida newspapers. This sketch was prepared by a newspaper artist from the description given of the slayer. It was not released—nor indorsed—by the FBI.

Residents of the Memphis rooming house from which Dr. King was shot April 4 reported last week that investigators had shown them composite drawings. But they said the sketches were the same—or at least very similat,—as those prepared by newspaper artists.

#### Requests Danied

FBI officials have rejected reporters' requests for a composite drawing of the man they are seeking in what is perhaps the most massive manhunt of modern times. They refuse to say whether they have prepared such a sketch.

Agents have a good physical description of Dr. King's assassin: 30 to 32 years old, 5 feet, 10 inches \*tall, weighing 35

pounds, with a receding nairline and a long thin nose."

They also have a good description of the white 1966 Musitang which witnesses say sped away from the Memphis room-King was shot as he stood on a motel balcony 205 feet from the rear of the rooming house.

Car Impounded
A white Mustang was impounded Thursday night from an Atlanta parking lot where it had been parked since the morning after Dr. King's slaying.

The impounded car bore license tags issued in Birmingham. Ala., to Eric Starvo Galt, 37, who identified himself as an unemployed merchant seaman when he applied for an Alabama driving license last year.

At almost the same moment last week that they were impounding the car in Atlanta, the FBI sent over the Florida Teletypewriter circuit a request to locate Galt. The message was withdrawn four hours later with the explanation that it was erromeous. The FBI refuses to say why it was seeking Galt.





This case concerns the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

It has previously been reported that Galt met Charles Stein Stein's sister, Rita Stein, and Marie Martin in a Los Angeles bar, 12/14/67, and drove Stein to New Orleans, 12/15/67, to get Rita Stein's children and return them to Les Angeles.

Marie Martin says she first met Galt in the middle of December, 1967, in the Sultan Room at the St. Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, where she works as a cocktail waitress. She asked Galt if he would take her home and when he agreed she told him she lived in New Orleans. She explained that Rita Stein had to pick up her children in New Orleans and Galt was given the impression that either Marie or Rita was going to New Orleans with him. When he learned that Charles Stein was going to New Orleans with him instead of one of the women, Galt told her, "If it's a set up, I'll kill him. I have a gun, " REC-48 Wall all to

After Galt returned to Los Angeles from New Orleans. 12/21/67, Marie Martin says she saw him about 30 times in the Sultan Room. He usually drank straight vodka but sometimes drank beer. He never smeked. His hands were clean and were not calloused. His eyes were blue but sometimes appeared hazel. He was always solemn, showed no emetion and was pale as if he were indoors a great deal. Galt said he had just finished a six week APR 23 1968 bartender course but could only make a screwdriver.

Marie Martin said Galt told her on one occasion he was driving through a Negro community and tomatoes were thrown at his car because it had Alabama license plates.

Charles Stein now recalls further details of his trip to New Orleans with Galt, 12/15-21/67. Galt had one small bag, similar to the one recovered at Memphis, and probably a shaving kit. He wore a wrist watch, believed to have been purchased in Mexico, and a dark brown suit with faint vertical lines. Galt used an excessive amount of hair dressing and drank beer throughout the trip. He was soft spoken, believed to be right handed, and continuously played country and Western music on the car radio. Stein thinks Galt had Mexican insurance on his car. This is being checked.

Galt seemed familiar with New Orleans and mentioned contacting two men associated with either an engineering or contracting firm, probably in Chalmet (phonetic). Galt mentioned these men lived near the Jackson Barracks. Galt told Stein he had seen him, probably 12/18/67, while Galt was in a bar. Stein says the bar would have to have been in the 400 or 500 block of Canal Street, New Orleans.

Galt attended the International School of Bartending, Los Angeles, 1/19/68 to 3/2/68 when he graduated. The school has a photograph of Galt which is being forwarded to the Bureau. On his application he showed a prior employment as "Mr. Willard", \*751 South Figueroa, Los Angeles, and stated his Selective Service Classification is 3A. On 3/2/68 the school offered him a bartending job and he declined saying he was leaving town in two weeks to visit his brother.

Galt told a fellow bartending student he had been a cook on a Mississippi River boat or barge.

Los Angeles witnesses say the above photo of Galt is an excellent likeness.

Jimmie Garner, manager of the hippie rooming house in Atlanta, admits that he lied when first interviewed and now says Galt had no connection with William Lee and Harold G. Anderson.

Garner now maintains Galt checked in 3/24/68 paying \$10 for rent through 3/31/68. On 3/31/68 Galt paid another weeks rent. Garner saw Galt only on the two occasions he paid rent. On 4/5/68, when the linens were changed in Galt's room, a note was found saying

in effect, "I have to go to Birmingham. Can't take TV now. Will try to get back in a week to pick it up." The note was destroyed. Garner states he originally lied to conceal the existence of Galt's television set since he would have appropriated it if Galt did not return.

Garner could produce no record of Galt except for his name on the back of an envelope which he says was hand printed by Galt.

All items associated with Galt in the rooming house are being examined in the Laboratory.

Wesley G. Hughes, "Redding Record Searchlight," Redding, California, advised he is preparing an article based upon the following theory relating to the name Eric Starvo Galt. Eric, A simple noun, means a payment imposed for homicide. Starvo is the middle name of Eric Starvo Blofield, a villainous character in James Bond novels. Galt, as a simple noun, is a gelded swine; gault has other meanings including "rabbit track" which has a significant connotation to Hughes due to the apparent fictitious cover used by Galt.

#### ACTION:



Attorney General Ramsey Clark announced today that Eric Starvo Galt is being sought by the FBI as a fugitive on a Federal charge arising from the fatal shooting of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968.

Director J. Edgar Hoover stated that a Federal complaint was filed by the FBI in Birmingham, Alabama, today charging Galt with conspiring to violate the civil rights of Dr. King in violation of Title 18, Section 241, of the United States Code.

The FBI complaint charges that "On or about March 29, 1968, at Birmingham, Alabama, ...Eric Starvo Galt and an individual whom he alleged to be his brother, entered into a conspiracy which continued until on or about April 5, 1968, to injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate Martin Luther King, Jr.,...in the free exercise or enjoyment of a right secured to him by the Constitution or laws of the United States; namely, the right to freely travel from state to state. In furtherance of this conspiracy, Eric Starvo Galt did, on or about March 30, 1968, purchase a rifle at Birmingham, Alabama...."

According to Mr. Hoover, a 30.06 rifle equipped with a telescopic sight was found near a rooming house on South Main Street in Memphis immediately after the fatal shooting of Dr. King occurred. The rooming house overlooks the Lorraine Hotel and Motel where Dr. King was staying.

Mr. Hoover said that FBI Agents determined that the 30.06 rifle had been purchased from a gun dealer in Birmingham, Alabama, on March 30, 1968. The telescopic sight also was purchased from this dealer.

The FBI Director said that Galt, who has used the names of John Willard and Harvey Lowmyer in the past, is the owner of a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama license plates which was located abandoned in Atlanta, Georgia, on April 11, 1968. Investigation disclosed that Galt purchased this car from a private citizen in Birmingham on August 30, 1967. The Mustang's odometer showed that it had been driven more than 19,000 miles between late August, 1967, and early April, 1968.

According to Mr. Hoover, Galt's travels in the Mustang included trips to Los Angeles, California; New Orleans, Louisiana; Birmingham, Alabama; and Mexico, as well as to Memphis, Tennessee, and Atlanta, Georgia. Galt was reported to have been in Memphis on April 3 and 4, 1968, and to have departed from there for Atlanta.

Intensive investigation by the FBI has disclosed that Galt has claimed to have been employed as a cook on Mississippi River vessels and as a merchant seaman. He is said to be an avid dancer and took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965; in Birmingham during September and October, 1967; and in Long Beach, California, from December, 1967, to February, 1968.

Galt left Los Angeles on December 15, 1967, and drove his white Mustang to New Orleans, where he claimed he contacted either an engineering or a contracting firm. He left New Orleans on December 19th and arrived back in Los Angeles on December 21, 1967.

While in the Los Angeles area early this year, Galt took a course at a school of bartending and was graduated on March 2, 1968.

The fugitive is described as a white male. He is approximately 5 feet 8 inches to 5 feet 11 inches tall and weighs between 160 and 175 pounds. He is said to be a neat dresser and has a medium build.

Galt has brown hair, which he wears in a "brush" cut.

He reportedly has blue eyes; his nose is straight and narrow; his teeth

are straight and clean; and he has given his date of birth as

The fugitive is said to have a nervous habit of occasionally pulling at an ear lobe with his hand. His left ear protrudes farther from his head than his right ear.

According to Mr. Hoover, persons who have met Galt describe him as a "loner" and state his language and diction have a "rural" quality and suggest that he probably does not have a high degree of education. He is said to drink alcoholic beverages and has a preference for yodka and beer. He is a fan of western and country music.

Galt should be considered armed and dangerous. Any information concerning him should be furnished immediately to the nearest FBI office.
