While ten fugitives currently appear on the "Top Ten" list, the Bureau on one previous occasion briefly carried eleven subjects on the list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" and such an unusual situation naturally generates extraordinary public and press interest. (Richard Laurence Marquette, charged with a brutal butcher murder in Portland, Oregon, was added to the "Top Ten" list on 6-29-61 as its eleventh member. He was caught the following day in California.)

With the identification today of Ray as being identical with Galt and the resultant intensified press interest in the Bureau's manhunt, it appears most timely to promptly announce Ray's addition to the "Top Ten" list, as an additional means of expediting his prompt location.

Galt Is Charged In Dr. King's Slaying

BIRMINGHAM, ALA. — The FBI charged Eric Starvo Galt late Wednesday with conspiracy in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Joe Gamble, special agent in charge of the FBI office at Birmingham, said he issued the complaint Wednesday.

Mr. Gamble declined to comment on whether the FBI considered itself closer to an arrest than before Galt was officially named in the case.


The FBI had named Galt in a lookout bulletin last week in Florida but withdrew the bulletin four hours later, saying it had been released in error.

The charging of Galt was first announced Wednesday by the FBI in Washington.

In the first official mention of a conspiracy in connection with the April 4 assassination of Dr. King in Memphis, the FBI said the alleged plot involved also a man Galt described as his brother.

And the FBI issued a photograph which it identified as being one of Galt, "also known as Harvey Lowmyer and John Willard."


