I talked to a 31-year-old West Sider who, for four years, was in Missouri State Pen Cell 187.

James Earl Ray, the alleged assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was in Cell 191, some 10 feet from 187.

The West Sider is in trouble with the law again. That's how I found out about his connection with Missouri State Prison.

"I guess I knew Jimmy Ray as well as any man," the West Sider said between drags on a smoke. "I rented him books in prison. One of the books he got from me was Ian Fleming's 'On Her Majesty's Secret Service.'"

"In that, Ernst Stavro Blofeld was the head of SPECTRE. I also rented him Agn Rand's 'Atlas Shrugged.' John Galt is in that."

James Earl Ray, an escapee from the Missouri State Penitentiary who is charged under the alias Eric Starvo Galt with Civil Rights - Conspiracy in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., at Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968, is being recommended as a special addition to the FBI's list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

While ten fugitives currently appear on the "Top Ten" list, the Bureau on one previous occasion briefly carried eleven subjects on the list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" and such an unusual situation naturally generates extraordinary public and press interest. (Richard Laurence Marquette, charged with a brutal butcher murder in Portland, Oregon, was added to the "Top Ten" list on 6-29-61 as its eleventh member. He was caught the following day in California.)

With the identification today of Ray as being identical with Galt and the resultant intensified press interest in the Bureau's manhunt, it appears most timely to promptly announce Ray's addition to the "Top Ten" list, as an additional means of expediting his prompt location.

A proposed press release announcing Ray's addition to the FBI's list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" is attached, along with copies of his photographs.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) James Earl Ray be approved as a special addition to the list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

(2) This memorandum be returned directly to my office for further expeditious handling.

Galt Is Charged In Dr. King's Slaying

By Associated Press

BIRMINGHAM, ALA. — The FBI charged Eric Starvo Galt late Wednesday with conspiracy in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Joe Gamble, special agent in charge of the FBI office at Birmingham, said he issued the complaint Wednesday.

Mr. Gamble declined to comment on whether the FBI considered itself closer to an arrest than before Galt was officially named in the case.

The FBI had named Galt in a look-out bulletin last week in Florida but withdrew the bulletin four hours later, saying it had been released in error.

The charging of Galt was first announced Wednesday by the FBI in Washington.

In the first official mention of a conspiracy in connection with the April 4 assassination of Dr. King in Memphis, the FBI said the alleged plot involved also a man Galt described as his brother.

And the FBI issued a photograph which it identified as being one of Galt, "also known as Harvey Lowmyer and John Willard."

The FBI said a warrant was issued in Birmingham, Ala., Wednesday on the basis of an FBI complaint which charged that Galt and an individual, "brother," brother, engaged in a conspiracy to murder Dr. King.

on or about March 30, bought a rifle at Birmingham. The bureau did not say specifically that this was the rifle that killed King.

But the statement said "a 30.06 rifle equipped with a telescopic sight" was found near a rooming house on Main street in Memphis after the fatal shooting occurred.

Novotny Still Opposes Czechoslovak Liberals

Informants said the orthodox group had been given an ultimatum by liberal reform elements to surrender their hold-out positions on the powerful committee where Novotny retains membership or face exposure for their roles in Stalinist terror trials.

Novotny's supporters include once-powerful men now reduced to bare committee membership. But Novotny has a considerable following among lower echelon party bureaucrats.

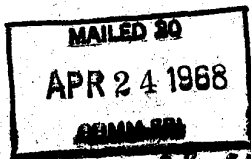

Request-My name be used in no way or information I send made public, please.

I do not know if the following is of any value. But my conscious is bethering me. I ask only my name not be used. I want no reward, if the information helps in any way. To bring up the frightening incident in Illinois the night of April 11, I will write a detailed background.

A man I saw that night-in a white CADILLAC -looked like this picture, except he had on dark colored glasses. The hair line looked the same, and the facial contours.

Background detailed:

My son-in-law, Dersie Fox, was killed in a car accident Dec. 23 at Pontiac, Michigan. My daughter, Doris, was injured. I had returned from the Presnell Hospital (Kennett, Missouri) but was still sick in bed (Asian Flu). And was unable to go to Michigan.

As my health and strength improved, I was selected the delegate to attend the Missouri East Seventh Annula Conference of the Woman's Society of Christian Service in Jefferson City, Missouri on March 22-23. I went there in a car with friends.

From there, Saturday late afternoon, I took the Trailway bus, changing in St. Louis, to Hammond, Ind., arriving there about 2:35 a.m. (Our Jeff City bus was late as it had to wait on the bus from Memphis, Tenn. to Kansas City, Mo. because of the snow in the south.) My son-in-law and daughter, and Mrs. Gerald Gentry, met me in Hammond.
