Abstract The purpose of this study was to examine the effects of a 12-week, low-intensity, low-impact, and low-volume exercise program on the physical and psychological health of older adults. a Mr. King, an Australian journalist ^{now deceased but} then in charge of Australian Associated Press Office in New York.

The job Mr. King interviewed me for was a position as 'sub'. He was extremely courteous but left me with the impression that he was not very anxious for me to try the work, so I did not press the matter and decided to return to Australia.

As you will gather I am a journalist, and have done a good deal of 'crime' work. You have a letter from me on file - or should have, perhaps if you retain such things - sent some three months before Mr. Kennedy's assassination and containing a warning about his safety. A second matter of interest - and the only tangible link I can think of to connect me with the Martin Luther King case except the name, and my interest in ecumenical church activities, is that I have had an unusually tough times these last ten years even for a crime reporter and a woman journalist - and it may be that Dr. King may have become interested in my case.

With his experience he may easily have had some clue as to the 'gang' or person causing me the trouble: I think his interest would have been a sympathetic one, and he may have felt the need and value for some sort of exposure of the manner in which

I have been treated.

This is an approach which I myself believe highly dangerous and often ineffective.

I have been trying to work my way out of bother by my ability, with the help of some very good friends - and the method is working, though rather slowly.

If I can be of any further assistance I shall be only too pleased to help you.

I understand there is a reward for the 'tip' leading to the arrest of Dr. King's assassin.

If the information I have tendered has been of use, I should be glad to be considered for this.

I missed quite a large reward in a Sydney case because I left it too late to write a 'follow-up' letter of application - I was rather sick at the time.
