On 4/22/68, WILLIAM O'KEEFE, Jefferson County, Kentucky Police Department, advised that his department was conducting investigation regarding the theft of a 1964 Chevrolet Impala, bearing 1968 Kentucky license H12109, VIN 41847J247629. Vehicle was stolen from Sumner Brothers Auto Sales, 530 East Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky.

WILLIAM CHRONWELL, Salesman at Sumner Brothers, interviewed, at which time photograph of JAMES EARL RAY was displayed. CHRONWELL stated that the photograph of RAY bore a resemblance to person who saw steal above-mentioned vehicle.

Vehicle recovered at Valley Station, Kentucky, and processed.

Neighborhood investigation conducted in area of recovery, and no suspects were developed.

Identification Division, Latent Fingerprint Section, is requested to compare enclosed latent prints with prints already on file for JAMES EARL RAY for elimination purposes.

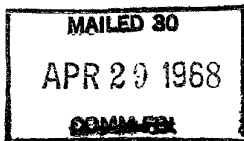

Dear President Johnson:

I contacted the FBI in Memphis on Saturday April 6 (or whatever day it was that the first artist's drawing of the reconstructed features of the King assassin first appeared in the Memphis papers) and inquired as to the color of the hair. I was told that it was black.

On Saturday evening, April 6, a nationally broadcast news program reported that the color was "sandy."

On Sunday morning I again called the FBI in Memphis and inquired as to the accuracy of the report. An agent responded that all reports were only of a dark haired assassin.

This morning the report (for the first time in newspapers to my personal knowledge) gave a report of a sandy-haired man. I enclose a clipping.

The information I have concerns a sandy haired man who falls within the description supplied by witnesses. I have no special reason to believe there is a connection with the murder but I think the incident should be checked out by the FBI for the purpose of eliminating it.
