NASH(S SUICIDE, PRISONER TRIED TO GET CLOSE TO WARDEN SWINSON, WITHOUT SUCCESS. ONE-HALF POUND OF AMPHETAMINES FOUND IN TRASH CAN IN THIS PRISONER'S CELL. PRISONER DESCRIBED AS APPROXIMATELY THIRTYTWO YRS OF AGE, W/M, SIX FEET, ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY LBS., BLACK HAIR. THIS PERSON HAD SIX TO EIGHT OTHER PRISONERS PUSHING DRUGS FOR HIM IN PRISON. DOWDA CLAIMS TWO GANGS IN PRISON, ONE FROM ST. LOUIS AND OTHER FROM KANSAS CITY. RAY ASSOCIATED WITH LEADERS OF ST. LOUIS GANG. INVESTIGATION MARIETTA, GA., REFLECTS LEWIE DOWDA IN APR., 'SIXTYSEVEN, MADE TRIP TO MISSOURI. DOWDA ADVISED ATTEMPTED TO CONTACT LEO BARNETT AT FLAT RIVER, MO., BUT UNSUCCESSFUL AS BARNETT IN FLORIDA PRISON. DOWDA CLAIMS ON RETURN TO GA. MET ONE BILLY "DINK" CHUMLEY IN BAR SOMEWHERE IN ALA. Re Bureau teletype 4/25/68, requesting further information regarding LAWRENCE EUGENE WRAY.

Enclosed for Bureau is copy of correlation memorandum reflecting information in Kansas City file re LAWRENCE EUGENE WRAY.

LAWRENCE EUGENE WRAY was inmate with subject at MSP from April, 1965, until April, 1967. He is currently a PCI of the Kansas City Office. He was interviewed 4/24/68 but could furnish no information re subject's whereabouts. WRAY is willing to aid the FBI in any manner whatsoever, but advised that it would have to be cleared through his Missouri Parole Officer.

WRAY is working at a local hospital in Kansas City, but suggested that if the Bureau knew of anyone who may be in contact with subject, he would travel to that individual's location and approach him as a former cellmate and friend of subject, stating he is willing to help subject, and could hand over prepared identification papers in an assumed name, such papers as driver's license about to expire, Social Security card, or even passport about to expire, then if these papers were forwarded to subject and he utilized them, it would possibly come to Bureau's attention. WRAY went on to state he was in the same cell with the subject for two months at MSP, however, prison records fail to substantiate this.

This file was opened 5-28-65 upon information received 5-26-65 from Sheriff Glenn Carson, Bolivar, Mo.

On 5-15-65, WRAY was brought to Polk County, Bolivar, Mo., from the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Mo., where he was serving four years for burglary from Kansas City, Mo. He was to face charges of issuing a fraudulent check in October, 1964, in excess of \$900. WRAY bought some guns and fishing tackle. At the time he ran a bait shop "by" Hermitage, Mo.

At about 9:00 p.m., 5-24-65, WRAY escaped alone from the jail by removing some bricks in the jail wall. A pickup truck was stolen near the jail and recovered at Brighton, Mo.

Sheriff Carson said he understood that WRAY had a history of escapes; also that the State of Kansas had a detainer on WRAY, believed stemming from a kidnapping of a law enforcement officer and releasing him within the state.

Sheriff Carson identified the following relatives of WRAY:

Subject was identified as individual who stole a 1963 Mercury at Springfield, Mo., and transporting this vehicle to Topeka, Kansas. This matter was investigation in 26-41916 and instant UFAP case was closed 6-11-65.

26-41916 (LAWRENCE EUGENE WRAY, aka; ITSMV)

Information was received from the Topeka, Kansas, PD by SA David E. Robinson that a LARRY MILLER had taken a 1963 Mercury to a garage at Topeka and had requested this vehicle be disassembled and the motor and transmission be put in a 1957 Ford, which he had also taken to the garage. The Ford bore a Missouri license registered to SUE or ADAM VINCENT, 2517 Waters St., Springfield, Mo., for a 1951 Chevrolet. The PD had also determined that the 1963 Mercury had been registered to GLEN E. BUNCH, Panama, Mo., and had been traded to a Ford Motor Company at West Plains, Mo.

On 6-10-65, SA John E. Williams determined from C. E. Vaughn, Bookkeeper, Will Fisher Oldsmobile, Springfield, Mo., that above-mentioned Mercury was purchased on 5-29-65 by individual giving name LAWRENCE D. FRANKS, 2052 N. Lyon, Springfield, Mo., with worthless check in the amount of \$2100 on the Bank of Urbana, Urbana, Mo. The check was in the possession of Greene County Prosecutor's Office, Springfield, Mo.

On 6-10-65, Gene Swank, Salesman, Will Fisher Oldsmobile, advised that since he sold the Mercury to FRANKS, he had observed a photograph of LAWRENCE WRAY, an escapee from the County Jail, Bolivar, Mo., and this photograph was a photograph of individual to whom he sold vehicle.

According to Sgt. Myron Taylor, MSHP, Springfield, Mo., the Missouri license registered to Sue or Adam VINCENT, referred to above, had not been reported stolen.

Authorized complaint was filed, 6-10-65, at Topeka, Kansas, and a warrant was issued.

As a result of information furnished to the Topeka, Kansas, PD, WRAY was apprehended by that department at Topeka on 6-10-65.

LAWRENCE EUGENE WRAY was interviewed on 6-11-65 by SA David E. Robinson and furnished a signed statement.

WRAY stated he was born at Topeka, Kansas; graduated from the Highland Park High School, Topeka, Kansas, in 1957 through Kansas State Industrial Reformatory; completed two and

one-half correspondence college courses; could read and write the English language.

He advised that on the night of 5-24-65 he escaped from the county jail at Bolivar, Mo. He was met by some friends who transported him to Springfield, Mo.

WRAY gave the details of his purchase of the Mercury from Will Fisher Oldsmobile. He said he wrote a check in the amount of \$2100 on the Bank of Urbana, Urbana, Mo., and a mortgage was to be held by the agency for \$160. WRAY signed the check LAWRENCE D. FRANKS. He continued that he had never had an account at the Bank of Urbana and knew the check was worthless.

According to WRAY, he was given a bill of sale but tore it up. He went to Dugan Drive It Yourself Company, obtained a blank motor vehicle lease agreement, filled it out using the name LARRY WAYNE MILLER, and intended to use this lease agreement to show legal possession.

WRAY continued that he took a Missouri license plate from a vehicle belonging to SUE VINCENT to put on the Mercury. He left Springfield in this vehicle the night of 5-29-65, being followed into Kansas approximately ten miles by some friends from Kansas City, Mo. They were there to transport some guns for him across the state line and assist him in case he was stopped.

WRAY then told of his dealings concerning putting the Mercury parts into the 1957 Ford, his selling parts of the Mercury chassis to a salvage dealer in exchange for the Ford plus \$85.00.

WRAY said he intended to drag the Mercury over to Kansas City, Mo., after the Ford was running. He believed that by abandoning the Mercury there, it would appear that the vehicle did not cross a state line. Federal authorities would not be involved. He planned to have the Ford registered in his name and would have a proper title.

In closing, WRAY stated he felt he had done nothing morally or legally wrong.

In addition to the afore-mentioned signed statement,

WRAY advised that at the time of his escape from the jail at Bolivar, Mo., he had in his possession a .45 caliber revolver. This revolver had been passed to him by running a string through the cell window and pulling the gun back through the window in a bag. He had been assisted in this by friends, whom he refused to name, from Kansas City, Mo. These friends were also waiting for him outside of the jail on the night of the escape. After leaving Bolivar, he was driven by these friends to Springfield, Mo., and introduced to SUE VINCENT, where he established residence.

Subject, on 6-23-65, appeared in USDC, Topeka, Kansas, waived indictment and pleaded not guilty to an information.

AUSA Franklin, Topeka, Kansas, noted that subject's FBI Identification Record reflected WRAY was confined at the Atascadero State Hospital, Atascadero, California, on 8-1-61, and at the State Hospital #1, Fulton, Mo., 1-21-65. AUSA Franklin requested subject's mental ability be determined through a check of mental institutions where he had been confined.

On 7-30-65, Mr. Robert Rosson, Registrar, State Hospital #1, Fulton, Mo., advised his files reflected LAWRENCE EUGENE WRAY was admitted to the hospital on 1-21-65 for the purpose of pre-trial examination. WRAY was committed by the Jackson County, Mo., Court, where he had been held on charge of Burglary-Larceny and two charges of car theft. He was discharged on 3-1-65 to the Sheriff of Jackson County, Mo.

On 2-26-65, WRAY was diagnosed as having no mental disease within the meaning of noted section, Missouri Revised Statutes 1959. He was said to have capacity to understand and could participate in his defense. He did have knowledge and appreciation of the nature, quality and wrongfulness of his conduct.

Mr. Rosson said the files reflected additional diagnosis as "Sociopathic Personality, chronic - severe; anti-social". Mr. Rosson noted that this diagnosis did not reflect insanity.

SA Leo C. Bailey reviewed the records, State of California, Department of Mental Hygiene, Atascadero State Hospital (ASH), Atascadero, California, on 8-17-65.

WRAY was admitted to ASH on 8-1-61, based on an order from Superior Court, Los Angeles County, California, having been charged with Burglary with Explosives and Forgery, which led to his confinement.

While in the Los Angeles County Jail, WRAY was thought to have suffered an acute break with reality and court-appointed psychiatrists felt he was suffering from a mental illness. His wife, however, felt that WRAY was malingering since he did not want to go to prison.

These records revealed that upon admission, WRAY was truculent and non-communicative, did not understand why he was being persecuted.

On 8-24-61, the hospital staff diagnosed WRAY as possessing a schizophrenic reaction - paranoid type. Over a period of several months, WRAY gradually improved. Psychological tests indicated WRAY possessed normal intelligence, but was unable to control his anxiety and his anti-social behavior. As of 11-19-62, WRAY was considered to be in complete remission. On this date when examined, he was alert, coherent with quick mental processes. He was not particularly evasive, there was no evidence of psychosis and he appeared functioning at a bright normal intellectual level. The hospital staff decided WRAY was to be returned to court, feeling that he was capable of cooperating in his own defense.

As of 11-19-62, the ASH staff diagnosed WRAY as possessing a schizophrenic reaction, acute undifferentiated type, in remission, with marked anti-social trends. According to the records, WRAY was an outwardly cooperative patient, who nevertheless demonstrated considerable hostility towards authority and discipline. WRAY was considered as an escape risk.

On 12-14-62, WRAY was discharged from ASH and returned to the custody of the Los Angeles Sheriff's Office for disposition of his case. This disposition was not shown in the hospital records.

The records did reveal that WRAY entered Topeka, Kansas, State Hospital, 5-24-54, on a 90-day observation order. He had been referred to this institution from the Boys'
