



Altorney General Aggravated Bureau By Glowing Report on King Case

THE DEEP-scated unhappi- Education (COPE), flew from the making quick swings west, aness of J. Edgar Hoover's Washington to Indianapolis Federal Bureau of Investigaation with its boss, Attorney General Ramsey Clark, was saggravated by Clark's misleading public optimism about a quick solution of the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

EFBI agents working on the King case grumbled privately hat Clark's repeated statements hinting at imminent capture of the assassin were not justified by the actual progress of the investigation. On the contrary, some agents complained that what legitismate information the Attorney General did let drop risked drying up the killer's trail.

Justice Department In iconferences, Clark justified his contribution to the credibility gap on the grounds that optimistic talk about closing the case "would help morale"—that is, calm down Negro anger in the turbulent days immediately following the murder.

Simultaneously, there is considerable skepticism inside the Justice Department and FBI that the present renewed investigation of Black Power-extremist Stokely Carmichael will result in any action.

FBI agents are making detailed probes into Carmichael's role in formenting the Washington, D.C., riots of April 4-6 following Dr. King's death, but many feel Clark will never push for a Carmichael prosecution. The Justice Department staff overwhelmingly recommended a year ago that the Government seek an indictment of Carmichael, but the Attorney General vetoed the advice on grounds that it would only make him a martyr.

Barkan's Mission

THE LATEST secret missibn by Al Barkan, organized labor's top political action agent, to sup Sen Robell Robe idential nomination wound up a complete failure.

Barkan, head of the AEL-CIO's Committee on Political for a closed meeting last Tuesday of the Indiana AFL-CIO executive board. His mission: to win support for Gov. Roger Branigan, the favorite son candidate, against Kennedy and Sen. Eugene McCarthy in Indiana's May 7 primary.

Barkan was supported in this view by the United Steel Workers, powerful in the Gary area—but few other unions. While many Hoosier labor leaders said they would back Vice President Humphrey if he were on the ballot, they opposed supporting Branigan. Against Barkan and the Steel Workers were the United Auto Workers, machinists, plumbers, packinghouse workers, the Amalgamated Clothing Workers, oil and chemical workers, teachers and municipal employes.

The result was neutrality by Indiana labor, a victory for Kennedy—thanks largely to his brother, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, who had spent the previous week urging Indiana union heads not to commit themselves.

Miller in South

WILLIAM E. Miller, the former New York Congressman who was Barry Goldwater's running mate in 1964, will be hunting delegates for Gov. Nelson Rockefeller in the South this spring.

As former Republican national chairman, Miller has plenty of political ties in the conservative South although lining them up for Rockefeller will be most difficult.

Miller's impending travels mark the slow upswing in Rockefeller's unannounced candidacy for the nomination.

The moderate Republican political pro, Al Abrahams, has been signed on as Washingtonbased trouble-shooter. He'll

setting up Rocketeller for President state and local campaigns. Some Rockefeller strategists want Abrahams to work into a key political intelligence job for the Governor as the pipeline between Washington and the New York-based Rockefeller staff.

Abrahams has excellent credentials for the job. He served as executive director of Republicans for Progress, a post-Goldwater organization that provided financing and research help for moderate-to-liberal Republican candidates.

Rockefeller's personal toplevel research will be handled by New York attorney Oscar Rubhausen. The highly respected Richard Nathan, on leave from the Brookings Institution, will be chief of domestic affairs and Henry A. Kissinger of Harvard will handle foreign af-

Without fanfare, Rockefeller's Washington headquarters will be opened this week on Connecticut Avenue-but without the usual political fanfare and flag-waving.

A footnote: Gov. George Romney of Michigan attended a high-level strategy breakfast by Rockefeller supporters Thursday morning at Washington's Mayflower Hotel (at the invitation of Sen. Jacob Javits of New York) but remained uncommitted. He explained that he had to keep his favorite son status to keep Michigan's 48member delegation from splintering. The consensus of others present was for a Rockefeller announcement of candidacy as soon as possible.

James Earl Ray who used the alias Eric Starvo Galt has been identified as the subject in the King case. Ray is an escaped convict from the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, Missouri. His description is based on information in the official records of the penitentiary where he was photographed and his description was recorded. He is forty years old having been born at Alton, Illinois. This has been verified through official birth records. It was determined through exhaustive investigation that King's slayer was an individual who had used the names John Willard, Harvey Lowmyer and Eric S. Galt. The description of this individual and information on his past activities were developed through witnesses, some of whom had only fleeting contact with or observation of the subject, resulting in variations in the descriptions furnished. On painstaking reconstruction of the subject's background we secured a photograph which had been taken in connection with his completing a bartending course in California in March, 1968. Upon identification of Ray as being Galt we were then enabled to furnish more precise description and background information from official records.

The descriptions of the then unknown subject developed in the initial stages of this investigation were based upon extensive interviews of witnesses in varied locations reaching from Tennessee to California. The remarkably close resemblances which we developed and the information elicited which revealed the true extent of the subject's physical description shows that a most commendable job was done by the Agents in their investigative activity.

The Associated Press article had been the subject of a previous memorandum in which it was indicated that Assistant Chief Bill Price of the Memphis, Tennessee, Police Department, denied making the statements attributed to him and this was submitted to the Director in a letter from Frank Holloman, former Special Agent who is now in charge of the Memphis Police Department.

FBI officials are quietly trying to play down contradictory descriptions of the appearance and habits of James Earl Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, the elusive escaped convict charged with the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The discrepancies have fueled speculation that perhaps Ray and Galt actually are two persons, or that two or more persons used the name Galt.

No official statement has been is-Sued to rebut this theory. But FBI sources insisted that Ray and Galt are the same person.

"We know there's only one person involved here," said one official.

"We've got his fingerprints and we know who he is."

Although the FBI now insists the man it seeks is Ray, it has not amended a conspiracy complaint against Galt - charging that Galt had conspired with "an individual he alleged to be his brother" to violate Dr. King's civil rights—to change the name to Ray.

In enlisting the public's help in the manhunt, the FBI has distributed thousands of flyers. The first set bears Galt's name, the second Ray's.

Puzzling aspects of the case con-

tinue to pop up.

Atlanta residents said cigarette or cigar ashes were scattered on the carpeted floor of a white 1966 Musstang that FBI agents impounded there a week after Dr. King was slain. They also said a cigar butt fell out of the car when agents opened the door. The FBI has said the car was owned by Galt. But a number of people who knew Galt say he does not smoke.

Reporters showed copies of the FBIreleased picture of Galt to the Birmingham witnesses, and to residents of the Memphis rooming house from which the fatal shot was fired. Almost all said the photo didn't resemble the man they saw.

Varying ages have been given for the hunted man, from 25 on up. The FBI said Galt gave his age as 36. It

said Ray is 40.

Estimates of the fugitive's height have ranged from 5-feet-8 to 6-feet, his weight from 160 to 175 pounds. His eyes have been described as either blue or hazel, his hair as either brown ود معدمان

An FBI official brushed off the

varying descriptions, saying "you run into this every time - it's human hature."

"Anyway, this guy is a professional con. He can change his hair line in three minutes with a razor, and he can gain or lose 20 pounds when he wants to."

There are conflicts, too, in descriptions of Galt's habits, including:

Appearance: The FBI reported Galt "is said to be a neat dresser," while others who knew Ray said he was careless in his dress.

Speech: The Memphis rooming house manager said the man to whom she rented a room three hours before Dr. King was slain had a Southern drawl. An inmate who knew Ray in the wissouri penitentiary said Ray, a native of Illinois, had no Southern accent.

Money: Galt appeared to spend money freely, and paid \$2000 cash for the white Mustang. Ray, said the inmate, "was tight as a tick . . . if you owed him money, even a few cents, he would bug you to death."

Music-dancing: The FBI said Galt "is a fan of western and country music" and "is said to be an avid dancer." The inmate said Ray "never expressed any liking" for music or

The FBI said Galt took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965. But after reporters pointed out Ray was in prison these two years, FBI officials said the statement should. have read "reportedly" took dancing lessons.

Galt graduated from a Los Angeles, bartending school last March, the FBI said. Reporters determined that at this same time a duplicate driver's license was mailed to Galt at the Birmingham rooming house.

Dr. Donald B. Peterson, superintendent of a Missouri state hospital where Ray was examined for six weeks in 1966, said "We didn't find anything to indicate he was a killer or had tendencies to kill."

The penitentiary warden, Harold Swenson, said he remembered Ray. "It's odd, but I won't believe he didit (killed Dr. King) until it is proven."

But in Dalton, Ga., a former cell mate quoted Ray as once saying he would be willing to kill Dr. King for a \$1 million bounty.


