On 5/3/68 Mrs. WYOLENE POINTER, Superintendents Office, Eastern State Hospital, Williamsburg, Va., furnished their file on FRANK HENRY NILES, patient # 43520. A review of this file revealed the following information:

NILES was committed at Eastern State Hospital on 1/17/68 under a regular commitment by Special Justice DANIEL GRINNAN, City of Richmond, Richmond, Va.

He was diagnosed as being a psychoneurotic reactive - depressive reactive.

He was allowed one pass, which was issued for the period of 4/24-26/68, when he listed his destination as being 6150 Wilson Boulevard, Arlington, Va. He has missed no scheduled roll calls at Eastern State Hospital.

Very little background information has been acquired by Eastern State Hospital. On several occasions they have sent personal background questionnaires to Mrs. CECILIA HOPE LEWIS at 5099 Tinelawn Avenue, Chattanooga, Tennessee. They have received no replies from Mrs. LEWIS.

Their files revealed that NILES was confined at the St. Joseph Hospital, 205 West 29th St., Lorain, Ohio, from 6/28/67 to 8/11/67.

NILES is described as a white male, born 131 pounds, 5'9" tall, blue eyes, gray hair, with mustache.

The admitting doctor was W. H. BATTE.

His attending physician is Dr. MARTIN PALMAZ.

Interview of Dr. PALMAZ revealed that NILES is an alcoholic currently assigned to the Alcoholic Vocational Rehabilitation Section of the Eastern State Hospital. It is noted that this area is not secured at all times. Dr. PALMAZ advised that NILES is a definite racist but has had no violence exhibited toward any of his fellow Negro inmates. Dr. PALMAZ described his feelings as being merely a general prejudice. He is described as being very polite but in definite need of a great deal of activity to keep his mind occupied. Dr. PALMAZ advised that he has a very deep-seated hostility toward life in general and that things need to go his way at all times. Dr. PALMAZ considers him to have definite suicidal tendencies. Dr. PALMAZ advised he has never heard NILES make any comments regarding any of the racial or Nazi leaders in the United States.

Dr. PALMAZ noted that NILES wrote a letter to the Social Security Administration recently in regard to his Social Security account, number which he felt was delinquent.

It was noted that since March 30, 1968, NILES has been allowed to work at the Howard Johnson's Restaurant, off the Eastern State Hospital's grounds, in Williamsburg, Va. Since that time and to date, he has worked five and six days a week, we hours per week, and is paid \$58.

On 5/3/68 JAMES HAMILTON, Manager, Howard Johnson's Restaurant, Williamsburg, Va., was interviewed and advised that NILES was employed at his restaurant from 3/30/68 to the present time. He noted that he was at all times on duty during the period 4/3-6/68. His days off during the instant period were April 2 and 9, 1968. HAMILTON advised that NILES is very well liked and gets along well with all the Negro help.

It was noted that NILES returned to the Eastern State Hospital after his work days during the instant period and at all times during his period of employment at the Howard Johnson's Restaurant. He has missed no roll calls at Eastern State Hospital.

No further investigation being conducted concerning NILES at Norfolk.

Records of the Derver Police Department, Bureau of Identification and Records, Denver, Colorado, reveal that Holt Chew, Denver Police Department Bunker 56534, was placed on probation April 24, 1967 after conviction for shooting James Thomas Jackson, a Negro on January 20, 1966.

On April 29, 1968 and April 30, 1968, Chew was interviewed by Special Agents of the FEI. He was asked if be recalled he made a telephone call to the office of Martin Luther King in Atlanta, Georgia on December 18, 1868. He reflected for a few moments and then said he was not about to lie about the situation, especially to the FBI. He said that he has no love for Martin Luther King and is glad be is dead. He stated King was not the non-violent civil rights leader he claimed to be. Wherever he went, violence followed and he was responsible for 37 deaths in the United States. He added that, as a personal matter, King was directly responsible for the distruction of the business career of one of his sons, Bill Chew of Saint Augustine, Figures. He estimated his son's financial loss at \$400,000.00.

Chew stated that his son was head of a hotel and motel association in Saint Augustine, Florida a few years ago when King and his followers came down to Florida and started efforts to integrate the industry. His son was also operating a motel in Saint Augustine at the time. Bill Chew was taken into Federal Court by these people for refusing to integrate his establishment and as the result of an unfavorable court decision, he ended up resigning his position with the association and selling his motel at a

severe loss. Chew said that there was considerable newspaper publicity over the matter at the time.

Chow placed King in the same category as Stokely Carmichael and H. Rap Brown and stated frankly that he hoped the same fate befalls the latter two. He made the statement that he is not against the Negro race; that he was born in Georgia, brought up with Negroes and hunted and fished with them. He made it clear that he is against some individual Negroes like Carmichael and Brown, who advocate violence and have no regard for property rights, but is not against all Negroes.

Having made these points, he returned to the original question and stated that he had no recollection of the telephone call and admitted that the reason could be that he could have been drinking at the time the call was made. He volunteered that at that time in his life he was a "bad drinker". He emphasized that he had no doubt that he made the call, if interviewing Agents said he did, but that he could not recall it. He stated that he was certain, whether or not he had been drinking, that he would not have made a threat over the telephone since he knows such a threat could lead to trouble for him. He said if he had had any intention of doing anything concerning King, he would not have used the telephone, he would have taken direct action.

Chew advised that he is certain that no one "put him up" to making the telephone call, and it was not an action involving anyone other than himself. He was shown photographs of James Earl Ray, the man being sought in connection with the assasination of Martin Luther King, but disclaimed any knowledge whatsoever of Lay.

He constantly referred to King, Carmichael and Drown using expletives in an effort to show his intense dislike for these men.

He stated that he was in Denver on April 4, 1886 and April 5, 1988 and left the city by Eastern Avilines for Augusta, Georga on April 6, 1988 where he is promoting business interests in the food industry, whoreby he hopes to set up his son Bill in business. He was unwilling to further identify his business interests. He stated his son bill is

presently running the Paradise Motel in Sylvania, Coergia and drove up from there to meet him in Augusta the first part of the week of April 7, 1988. Both he and his son then drove to Sylvania and on to St. Augustine, Florida where they were met on April 12, 1986 by Mrs. Chow and a younger son, who had just returned from military service in Morea. He said his wife and younger son flow from Denver. Thereafter, he and his family vacationed in Florida until he, his wife and younger son returned to Derver on April 20, 1986 in a new car he purchased in Florida.

He specifically stated that he had nothing to do with Hing's death and said that he knew of no conspiracy relating to it. He stated that he saw Hing's famous! on television and the way it was conducted it looked to him like it had been planned for 20 years.

He volunteered to the interviewing Agents that he has every intertion of protecting his apartment house property in Denver, Colorado with as much force as is necessary if anyone attempts to cause damage or loot it. He stated that he was angry at the leaders of this country for putting up with rioting, looting and the like. He thinks that the Attorney General is "very weal" and used more explatives to emphasize his point. He stated that he in "all for law and order, but would like to see law enforcement empowered to act. He also stated that be was angry because the National Association For The Advancement of Colored Feople were able to close tusinesses throughout the country after King's death when very few businesses closed aster President Kennedy's assasination; and he is convinced that threats were used to accomplish the closing of businesses in Denver, as he was so informed before he left on his trip.

It should be noted that a source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on January 21, 1966 that Chew is a highly irascible and unpredictable individual, an alcoholic and possibly a user of narcotics.

Mrs. Holt Chew on April 30, 1968 advised that her husband left Denver on April 6, 1968 for Augusta,

Georgia via Eastern Airlines and that she and a younger son traveled to Florida to meet him on April 12, 1968 via United, Mastern and Delta airlines.

Records of the Retail Credit Men's Association, Denver, Colorado revealed on April 30, 1968 that Holt Chew was born at Bert City, Georgia. He attended school there and came to Denver in 1932. He served in the United States Army during World War II and has been owner and operator of Holt Chew Motor Company for many years. His wife's name is Elaine and he has four children. He has been on record with the credit bureau since February, 1937 and has maintained a satisfactory credit rating.

Holt is described as follows:

It would appear that if Chew still operates Holt Chew Motor Company, that a review of toll call records made by him might be a considerable project. By return airtel advise if Chew still operates the above-named motor company and whether, in your estimation, a check of telephone toll calls made by Chew since 4/23/67, the date that suspect James Earl Ray escaped from prison, would involve the expenditure of considerable Agent time.

Chew, in interviews on 4/29-30/58, admitted he was glad Martin Luther King was dead. Chew holds King responsible for an alleged \$400,000 loss suffered by Chew's son, Bill Chew, as a result of efforts of King and his followers to integrate the motel industry in Florida. In December, 1955, Chew called King's office and warned an assistant that King should be careful as someone was going to assassinate him. Chew denies knowing suspect James Earl Ray and declared he knew of no conspiracy relating to it. Chew flew from Denver to Augusta, Georgia, on 4/5/58. Suspect James Earl Ray was last known to have been in Atlanta, Georgia, on 4/5/58. Denver has requested to check toll calls made by Chew to determine if he is possibly implicated in this case.
