relative to BERNARD HALFANT.

STANISLAW SLAWIK (not STANISTAR FLAWIK as set forth in referenced teletype) an established source of the Dallas Office and owner of the Old Warsaw Restaurant, 3914 Cedar Spring Road, Dallas, Texas, today advised that BERNARD MALFAIT (not BERNARD HALFANT as set forth in referenced teletype) is the assistant chef at his restaurant and has occupied that position in excess of one year. SLAWIK stated he can account for MALFAIT's whereabouts on a daily basis during that period until the middle of April when MALFAIT went directly to Mexico City with reservations at the Maria Cristina Hotel, Mexico City, made by SLAWIK the day preceeding MALFAIT's departure from Dallas.

Inasmuch as BERNARD MALFAIT has been eliminated as a suspect in this case, no further action being taken in this regard in Dallas.

On 4/26/68, Colonel ROBERT C. HUTCHINSON, JR., Florida Southern College, ROTC, Lakeland, Florida, telephonically advised he had read article in "The Army Times" concerning JAMES EARL RAY, wherein there was statement to the effect that the solution to RAY's whereabouts may rest with Army. The article went on to relate, RAY's military career, and solicitating information from anyone who might know him.

Colonel HUTCHINSON stated his Sergeant Major, EUGENE E. F. BRITTI was stationed with 16th Infantry Regiment and had roster of personnel which included RAY's name.

Sergeant Major BRITTI was contacted at Florida Southern, whereby he furnished a xeroxed copy of the Company "B" roster, which included RAY's name. BRITTI said RAY was attached to the 1st Battalion, 16th Infantry Regiment, and that the Roster in his, BRITTI's) possession was compiled on 7/7/48.

BRITTI stated the original 10th Infantry was headquartered in Austria with Battalions spread all over Europe. BRITTI and 13 others were sent from Austria to Frankfurt, Germany to reorganize the 10th. The reorganized group was formed from other units being deactivated or from excess personnel which other units no longer needed.

Sergeant BRITTI said that the Regiment moved from Frankfurt to Grafenwohr, Germany and was actually there, in 7/7/48, when the roster was made up. He said after the roster was made up the group was known as the 7802 Infantry Regiment, although it remained the 16th.

The Sergeant said when RAY was discharged in 12/48, his Battalion was stationed in Furth, Germany at the Montieth Barracks. He said they were sent there from Grafenwohr in the fall of 1948.

Two copies of roster of Company "E" ~~are~~ enclosed for Bureau. Two copies each are enclosed for Memphis and Kansas City for possible investigative lead purposes. It is believed that if leads presently outstanding do not produce RAY, the Bureau and OO may desire to have locale of the men on the roster be determined from Army sources and these men contacted.

Tampa advised that a Colonel read an article in the "Army Times" concerning subject Ray wherein a statement was made to the effect that the source of Ray's whereabouts may rest with the Army. The article related about Ray's military career and solicited information from anyone who might know him. A roster was furnished of Company "B" which included Ray's name, roster being of men who were in the same outfit as Ray during Ray's military service.

Tampa transmitted this information for possible lead purposes. It is felt that due to the extensive investigation at this time in other areas, and in view of the fact that Ray was in the military service 20 years ago, the people on the roster should not be interviewed *now*.

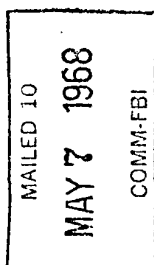
