On 5/9/68, Mr. ROBERT T. CONROY, 815 Parkway Avenue, Alliance, Ohio, was contacted. CONROY indicated he had telephoned the FBI in Washington, after he had seen a man who resembled RAY, coming out of Turner's Drugstore, Alliance, Ohio. CONROY stated that he was downtown, driving in his own car when he observed this individual, who appeared to be, or at least resembled RAY. He stated he went around the dock, came back and copied a license number after he observed this man enter an old green vehicle which he believed to be a Chrysler product. This license was copied down by himself and he then telephoned the FBI in Washington giving them the details as he recalled same. In regards to distance, CONROY said that he was on the opposite side of the street when this man left the drugstore and he again observed him after driving around the block from a distance of 30 or so feet, but did not get a good view, since the man was in the car. CONROY was not absolutely sure that this individual was RAY, however, indicated he wished to aide the FBI in any conceivable way possible, therefore, had immediately or soon thereafter telephoned Washington. CONROY had no additional information to add to the above facts or elaborate on the information furnished Washington.

On 5/13/68, Mrs. DOROTHY MEYER, Saline, Michigan, advised she was unable to definitely ascertain if the caller on the tape of the anonymous telephone call to Coconino County Deputy Sheriff RAY STOCK on 4/20/68, was her brother DAVID WILSON. Mrs. MEYER indicated there were pronounced similarities between the voice on the tape and the voice of her brother, however, several of the expressions and words used by the person making the anonymous telephone call were foreign to her and extremely unlike those used by her brother.

Mrs. MEYER indicated she was not in possession of a tape of the voice of her brother as she had indicated to Special Agent of the Phoenix Office during prior telephone call. Mrs. MEYER said she had been in possession of such a tape, however, she discovered that this tape had been erased by her husband.

Inasmuch as there is no suitable tape recording of DAVID WILSON in the Detroit Division to be used as a comparison with the tape of the anonymous caller, that tape is being returned to the Phoenix Office.

Further inquiry in the area indicates that PHILLIPS may be an employee of SAM FREEMAN who operated a Fish Camp in Shannon, Miss., and may have been a runner for SAM FREEMAN.

The information furnished to Chicago by PHILLIPS concerning illegal "booze" operations in and around the Tupelo, Miss., area is common knowledge to both law enforcement and private citizens in the area. This includes information that CARL MURPHY, JR. hired J. W. RILEY to kill JAMES "GRUBBY" GRUBBS.

It is the opinion of local authorities that CARL MURPHY, JR. would run anyone out of that section of the county who attempted in any way to infringe on his bootleg business.

DAVID LAMAR SCOTT, Tupelo, Miss., was a well known operator in the northern district of Miss. He has been convicted in both state and federal court for whiskey violations.

Attempts to locate CARL MURPHY, JR. for interview purposes in connection with alleged offer of \$2,500 to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. has been negative.

MURPHY has never been known to associate with racial groups or to be involved in segregation in any way. He has always been known as a bootleg whiskey operator in the northern district.

Referenced airtel requested investigation of Chicago and Memphis based upon the theft of credit cards from MARSHALL I. GOLDMAN, Aurora, Illinois, who was assaulted by three white males at Madison, Wisconsin, on 2/27/68, in view of a possible tie in this case because of phone calls made to and originating from Memphis, Tennessee, around 4/4/68.

Review of the airtel places the assailants in Madison, Wisconsin, on 2/27/68, in Chicago, Illinois, on 3/8 and 3/11/68 and 4/3/68. In addition, phone calls were made from Booneville, Mississippi, and Baldwin, Mississippi, on 3/29 and 3/31/68. In view of the fact that the subject was known to be in Los Angeles at the St. Francis Hotel from 1/22 to 3/17/68 and that he purchased the murder weapon in Birmingham, Alabama, on 3/29-30/68 plus the fact that a call was made from Chicago, Illinois, on 4/3/68 when it was known that the subject was registered in the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, it appears to this office that the assailants of GOLDMAN and/or the individual utilizing his credit cards could not logically be identical with the subject and the requested investigation will not be conducted UACB.

Investigation at Everett, Pa., disclosed that THOMAS S. SMOUSE of RD #1, Everett, is a gasoline attendant at the Esso Service Station on the westbound lane of the Pennsylvania Turnpike near Bedford, Pa.

SMOUSE was contacted at his place of employment by SA JOHN S. HUGHES on 5/7/68, when his letter to the Bureau was orally acknowledged.

SMOUSE stated that at approximately 2:00 AM on 4/21/68, a man came into his service station and asked if he could sleep in his vehicle for approximately one-half hour. The man explained that he had to be in Chicago, Ill., on Sunday, 4/22/68, and that he did not desire to sleep too long. SMOUSE stated that the man went into the rest room in the gasoline station and then returned and made the comment to SMOUSE that he felt that he was much too tired to sleep for only one-half hour and decided that it would be better if SMOUSE would awake him at approximately 5:00 AM.

SMOUSE stated that he permitted the man to sleep in the car until 5:00 AM and then attempted to arouse him. At this point, two young Pennsylvania State Police officers came into the service station and SMOUSE explained the problem to them. He stated that they laughingly blew the siren on the State Police vehicle frightening the man badly. He stated they did not question him even though he, SMOUSE, noted to these officers that the man in his opinion looked very much like the man who killed MARTIN LUTHER KING.

SMOUSE advised that he was suspicious of the man because of his haggard looking condition and because of his dirty dress and, therefore, took the license number of the vehicle, a blue Mustang, which he described as having Georgia license

One copy of this letter is being furnished the other offices due to their investigative interest in CARL RAY.

On 5/7/68, First Class Cabin Stewardess CATHERINE HINES, aboard Frontier Airlines Flight 785 F, 4/27/68, on flight from Albuquerque to Phoenix, and Tourist Cabin Stewardess Miss J. JACKSON, aboard the same flight, advised SA BOYD D. ADSIT that they recall no one by the name of CARL RAY being aboard that flight and neither recognized any picture of JAMES EARL RAY as being that of any person aboard the flight.

On 5/4 and 5/5/68, all hotels in Denver and all motels in vicinity Stapleton International Airport were checked for reservation by CARL RAY with negative results.

In view of the differences between the descriptions given of CARL RAY by the various airlines employees and the description of JAMES EARL RAY, and in view of the information set forth in referenced FBI Laboratory reports, Denver does not contemplate setting forth leads to have other persons aboard Frontier Airlines Flight 785, Albuquerque to Phoenix, 4/27/68, interviewed concerning CARL RAY unless advised to the contrary by the office of origin.
