



Holt Chew was interviewed by the Denver Office on 4/29-30/68, inasmuch as in December, 1965, Holt Chew called Martin Luther King's Office and warned that King should be careful as someone is going to assassinate him. Chew reportedly flew from Denver to Augusta, Georgia, on 4-6-68, and allegedly was in contact there with his son, Bill Chew. Denver airtel of 5-1-68, requested Savannah to locate and interview Bill Chew and to attempt to verify the purpose for Holt Chew's visit to Augusta. Denver, by airtel dated 5-8-68, requested authority to check toll calls made by Holt Chew. No action will be taken on the Denver request until Savannah completes investigation regarding Bill and Holt Chew.

JOHN FRANCIS SMALLWOOD

Records, Jacksonville Shipyards, Jacksonville, Florida, examined on 4/30/68, by SA CHARLES J. HONETOR, disclosed SMALLWOOD, Social Security Number [redacted] was employed as a welder by Aero-Jet Corp., Jacksonville, from June, 1964 to June, 1965, when he voluntarily left for other employment. SMALLWOOD was rehired by the Jacksonville Shipyards and except for short periods was regularly employed as a welder from August, 1966 to date. SMALLWOOD, on 4/15/68, went on an official leave of absence until 5/14/68. His reason for desiring a leave was shown to improve his financial status. Records show SMALLWOOD was continuously employed at the Jacksonville Shipyards during the period from 1/7/68 through 4/12/68. He was employed eight hours on 4/4/68 and eight hours on 4/5/68.

JOHN FRANCIS SMALLWOOD, residing 10710 Wake Forest Road, Jacksonville, Florida, was interviewed 4/30/68 by SAs CHARLES J. HONETOR and GEORGE A. MC BRIDE. SMALLWOOD advised he has been in Jacksonville almost continuously since leaving North Carolina. He stated he has visited with relatives in North Carolina once in 1965 and again at Christmas time in 1966. He stated he has received no information indicating any of his wife's

relatives or others had part in instant matter. He said he is of the opinion that the incident which occurred in 1963 and which he reported was caused by racial tensions at that time. He said that since he has been in Jacksonville his wife has had cancer and he has been financially hard pressed. He said that he has been working as a welder at the Jacksonville Shipyards since coming to Jacksonville. He said that during this period he was also employed as a welder with Carcpo Research and Engineering Incorporated, 4120 Haines Street, Jacksonville. He advised that he took a leave of absence at the Jacksonville Shipyards to attempt to improve his financial situation. He said that during his absence from the shipyards he is working at Bellingers Boat Yard located Atlantic Boulevard and Intracoastal Waterway. He said that he can make more money in this job and he may not return to the Jacksonville Shipyards. He advised that he does not believe in violence now any more that he did in 1963 when he informed on his relatives. He stated he will cooperate with the FBI and any information coming to his attention concerning instant matter will be promptly furnished.

Since no evidence of conspiracy on part of SMALLWOOD, no further action regarding him being taken.

This case involves the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

On 5/14/68 a man using the name William A. Marshall signed an escrow contract to purchase a home at Bonita, California, for \$51,000. He presented a \$5,000 check on a local bank as earnest money and indicated that he had a \$65,000 certified check in his hotel room. The \$5,000 check he gave is worthless. He claimed that he was employed by International Harvester, Bloomington, Illinois, and had been recently transferred to the San Diego area.

On the afternoon of 5/14/68 Marshall appeared at an automobile agency in Chula Vista, California, where he selected a car and after displaying the escrow contract showing he had made a \$5,000 deposit on a home, he was permitted to take the car when he said he wanted to show it to his wife. The car has not been returned.

Bonita and Chula Vista are suburbs of San Diego.

Several witnesses who were in the company of Marshall for periods of time ranging up to three hours state that he bears a resemblance to photographs of the subject and one witness is almost positive of the identification. Intensive investigation has been instituted to identify and locate Marshall.

It has previously been alleged that in the summer of 1967 Ray and James Loama Owens were seen entering the Jefferson-Gravois Bank, St. Louis. Owens has been interviewed and denied any contact with Ray since leaving prison. He furnished the following information.

Owens first met Ray at a St. Louis Rescue Mission in 1959. Ray was using the name Jim O'Connor and later used the names Ryan and Ray but always used Jim as his given name.

Owens never knew Ray to work but he was thrifty and always seemed to have money. He knew Ray was a robber and Ray said he only robbed businesses he felt were protected by insurance. He was close mouthed and a loner but likeable and he was also a thinker who read widely on a variety of subjects.

Ray liked cars and pistols. He once demonstrated his marksmanship to Owens by repeatedly shooting a tin can while it was bouncing. Ray believed women were to use and forget and had a preference for "street bums."

On one occasion Owens claims Ray showed him \$1,000 in travelers checks and said he was going to Canada. When Owens next saw Ray a month later he said he had been to Canada. Ray also talked of prior trips to Mexico to cool off and mentioned Vera Cruz, Acapulco, Nogales and Mexico City.

Ray told Owens he had been forced to leave Mexico City when a man came at him with a knife and he hit the man in the head with a pistol.

Ray planned the Kroger robbery for which Owens and Ray were arrested in 1959. Owens thought it had been well planned but was unsuccessful because it was executed when both were drunk. He said this was an exception to Ray's drinking habits which were usually moderate.

Owens pleaded guilty to the Kroger robbery and received a seven-year sentence. Ray stood trial and was given twenty years. While he was at Missouri State Penitentiary Owens frequently saw Ray in the yard and Ray never displayed any animosity towards him.

It was James Wallace who alleged he had seen Ray and Owens entering the bank in 1967. Owens claims he saw Wallace in 1965 when he was at the Jefferson-Gravois Bank. Wallace was standing on the corner with a woman and asked Owens if he was putting money in or taking it out. Owens replied he was putting it in.

The records of the Jefferson-Gravois Bank show that Owens opened an account in 1965 which was closed in 1966.

She could not recall the exact date, but stated that she had her telephone number changed to 534-2260 and it is a non-published number and no one has called this number from out of state except her husband.

On 5/3/68, Mrs. THEODORE KROTKY, 2112 Geary Dr., Santa Rosa, Calif., advised she has telephone number 545-6373 and on or about 12/16/67, a telephone call was placed to her residence from someplace in Texas, possibly Houston, and this call was made by Mr. KEITH JOHNSON, Dean of Men, University of Americas, Mexico City, Mexico. She advised Mr. JOHNSON called to tell her daughter, MARY KROTKY, that he would not visit her at home just before Christmas as planned, because of the illness of his father who resides in Kooskia, Idaho. Mrs. KROTKY advised that her daughter MARY is engaged to be married to Mr. KEITH JOHNSON.

On 5/15/68, Mrs. DELORES RAILEY, 2252 North View Drive, Hayward, California, advised that EDDIE LEON is an elderly Negro man who formerly rented a room in her home several years ago. She stated that this is the reason the phone, 538-1726, at this address is in his name. She stated

she is not aware of his present whereabouts. She advised that in December, 1967, she received several telephone calls from her mother, Mrs. SYBIL GAYLES, who runs Gayles Grocery Store in Beaumont, Texas. She stated she knows her mother calls from pay telephones and that this would be the only calls she could have received from Texas during December, 1967. She stated that her mother's phone number is 713-TE-5-9439, and believes that it is a pay phone in the grocery store. She stated that she does not know JAMES EARL RAY, and after viewing photographs of RAY, she stated she cannot recall ever seeing anyone appearing identical to this individual.

On 5/7/68, Mrs. GWEN HANKINS, nee MANION, was contacted at the residence of her parents, J. E. MANION, 365 Mullet Court, Foster City, California. She stated that she knew of the call received at her residence in December, 1967, and that the call was a collect call to her from a friend who was visiting relatives in Texas. She stated the call was from Beaumont, Texas and was from BILLIE JEANE KNOX. Mrs. HANKINS, after viewing a photograph of RAY, stated that she had no knowledge of anyone resembling him.

On 5/7/68, JOE CARPINO, Security Officer, U.S. Naval Post Graduate School, Monterey, California, advised that telephone number 372-9730, is a public pay phone which is located just outside the enlisted men's barracks, Building 259, at the school. He also stated that there is usually about 200 men assigned to the barracks but that this particular telephone is also available to anyone who frequents the enlisted men's club which is the next adjacent building.

CARPINO stated that many of the enlisted men had been transferred in and out of the barracks since December, 1967, therefore, it would be impossible to ascertain who received this particular telephone call at that pay station.

Mr. A. G. MC DONALD and his son MIKE MC DONALD, were interviewed on 5/14/68 at the A&W Rootbeer Stand located at 2138 East 14th Street, and advised that they owned the stand at 2366 San Pablo Ave. which had telephone number 841-0501. Mr. MC DONALD stated he recalled being charged

for a call from Texas in December, 1967. He stated he had not been able to determine who had received the call but suspected that it had been to one of his employees, MARIE PARKER. He stated that PARKER had been a friend of JEANNIE RYAN, nee BARNES, who had quit her employment and had left for the East on 12/12/67. He stated that it was his understanding that JEANNIE RYAN had left her husband, TIM RYAN, at that time and had gone East with another man. He said that he believed that she is now in Mississippi since he had recently been to the State Department of Employment to see a Mr. PERRY regarding an unemployment form filled out by her. He advised his reason for thinking that she had made the call was based on the fact that she had left about that time. Mr. MC DONALD and his son MIKE MC DONALD observed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and advised that they did not know him.

He pointed out he had lived at 1805 South 11th Street, St. Louis, from 1963 until June 1967, and again from September 1967, until February 1968. He could not recall having seen anyone fitting RAY's description in the company of GAWRON. He has never heard GAWRON speak of RAY in any manner.

A copy of this airtel is being furnished to St. Louis for information purposes since leads were outstanding in St. Louis to locate RAMSEY.
