Puzzling Aspects Of Murder Hunt

Editor: Few would deny that the murder of the Rev. Martin Luther King has turned out to be a very strange happening in more ways than one.

To take just one example: after the murder, it was reported in the press that a man was seen to drop a rifle on the sidewalk near the scene of the crime. This rifle was first reported to be a Browning but later was said to be a Remington which was actually found in a rooming house. Quite a difference!

Next, we read that the Remington was in the possession of the FBI and that ballistic tests would be made to determine if the bullet which killed the Rev. King came from the Remington. Naturally, if the bullet was found there would be no problem. But, so far, I have seen no report from the FBI.

The presumption would be, of course, that the fatal shot was fired from the Remington, except for the puzzling fact that a published chronicle of events in the life of the prime suspect, Eric Stover Galt or James Earl Ray, or whatever his real name may be, states that as long ago as September 1967, the mystery man received a package in the mail from Chicago, weighing 20-25 lbs., 3 ft. long and 1 ft. wide.

This package could have contained a Browning and until such time, if ever, that tests prove the Remington bullet killed the Rev. King, the possibility remains that the shot came from another rifle, probably the Browning.

As things stack up today, at least in the minds of the general public, the question of who murdered the Rev. King must take a back seat to the question of what murdered him. Was it a bullet from the Browning or the Remington, if there were actually two rifles? In that case, the owner of the Remington might not have been the killer nor had anything to do with the crime.

The Remington could have found its way into the rooming house through the hand of someone else. If this seems farfetched, a little reflection will show that name switching and impersonation could make one person appear as two or two persons appear as one.

That something like this happened is made probable by the fact that the FBI has itself switched very recently from identifying its suspect as James Ray to saying he was Eric Galt. Indeed a very strange happening.

To stimulate public cooperation and possibly elicit pertinent information from individuals motivated by financial rewards, it is being suggested that information on the substantial financial rewards offered in the Murkin case be emphasized through nationwide publicity. The rewards are for information leading to the arrest and conviction of Dr. King's killer.

Contact today with the Memphis Office reflects there is a current known total of \$100,000 in outstanding rewards. The "Commercial Appeal" and Scripps-Howard newspapers have each offered \$25,000, businessmen and citizens in Memphis have offered several thousands more and the Memphis City Council has underwritten the reward up to a total of \$100,000. This compilation was set forth in the April 27th edition of the "Commercial Appeal." Although there have been rumors of additional rewards by such organizations as the SCLC, these are apparently without foundation.



- At approximately 11:30 A.M. a telephone call was received at this office from Major Wilbur HISCOCK of the Consulate General of the United States of America to the effect he had been alerted one Jean-Guy MERINEUA of Ste. Foy, P.Q. had reported having seen the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther KING in the City of Quebec during the week-end of 19/21 Apr. 68.
- 3. Mr. Jean-Guy MERINEAU of 2596 Pontleroy Avenue, Ste-Foy, Quebec was interrogated and he advised he was a part-time waiter at the Marquis de Montcalm cocktail bar forming part of Universal Motel situated at 2300 Chemin Ste. Foy, Ste-Foy, quebec. He asserted that during the evening of 20 Apr. 68 a male tourist had crashed a private party on three different occasions and because of his intoxicated condition was each and every time evicted from the premises.
- 4. Mr. MERINEAU furthered that following his awakening this morning he began perusing the newspaper Dimanche-Matin 21 Apr. 68 edition and he believed the individual who had given him a hectic previous evening strongly resembled James Earl RAY © Eric Starvo GALT. Subsequent investigation resulted in ascertaining two other barmen and a bellboy of the said establishment shared the opinion of Mr. MERINEAU the alien had facial features and composure highly resembling that of James Earl RAY whose portrait appeared in local newspapers.
- It was later determined the suspect had been registered in room 240 at Universal Metel and had checked-in at the hour of 2:00 PM on 19 Apr. 68. He surrendered the room in the proximity of 11:00 A.M. on 21-4-68 and it was established beyond a reasonable doubt subject occupied the said room in company with a woman and another couple.
- The registration motel card showed the male occupants of the double-bed room had inscribed their identities as being Robert BILLINGS of 190 Temple Avenue, Old Orchard Beach, Maine and Paul-TIBRLETTE of 5 Wildwood Lane equally of Old Orchard Beach. The license number of the vehicle in which they travelled was shown as 117-492 State of Maine. 7. At the time of my arrival at the motel room 240 had been thoroughly scrubbed by the cleaning women and all walls and furniture had been cleansed with a damp cloth. This precluded any attempt to examine the quarters for latent finger-prints. Sixteen (16) empty bottles of spirits bearing the labels Rheingold, Dawson and Haffenreffer lager beer as well as Seagrams whiskey and Lawrence vodka said to have been removed from the room in question were taken into custody for examination by the N.C.O. i/c Quebec Identification Section. Several prints suitable for comparison were found on the bottles, however, none compared with those of the sought killer.

- 8. At a later date employees of the Marquis de Montcalm cocktail bar were displayed F.B.I. Wanted Flyer 442-A and after viewing same they were less convinced the individual who had caused them inconvenience during the evening of 20-4-68 was in fact the murderer of Dr. Martin Luther KING. Two waiters advised the person in question had an indented scar near the left eye which was very conspicuous. The F.B.I. wanted circular indicated RAY has a small scar on the centre of his forehead and palm of his right hand.
- Vanier, P.Q., was reported to have been the desk clerk at the motel when the suspect arrived and departed. He was interrogated and advised subject produced his driver's license as ways of identifying himself when the checked-in at the motel. Mr. ROY added the person in question was in possession of a State of Maine driver's permit in favour of Paul TIBRLETTE of 5 Wildwood Lane, Old Orchard Beach, Me. He added Mr. TIBRLETTE had difficulty locating the registration certificate for the car he was operating, and therefore, he and TIBRLETTE proceeded outdoors to verify the license number of the vehicle. He described the automobile as a late model Dedge convertible.
- According to Mr. Michel ROY the suspect bore no similarities to James Earl RAY. He described Mr. TIBBLETTE as being 32 or 33 years of age, 6'l" to 6'2", long thin face, 165 to 170 lbs., wearing a sports jacket with red insignia and bushy curly hair. He added this same person had rented a room at the motel on a previous occasion during the fall of 1967. He did not see the other occupants of the vehicle as they entered the establishment through a side entrance.
- It was found payment for the rooming facilities was paid in advance in U.S. currency and charges amounted to \$21.00. Investigation also revealed the motel is equipped with an electronic switch board and they have no control of telephone calls made locally. Long-distance calls are made direct with the operator of the Bell Telephone Co. who later advises the accounting department of the motel the cost of the call. Customers are billed accordingly and records are destroyed once payment has been settled.
