Records of the Toxas State Mental Hospital reflected that JACODS had a sister named MINIMA POWERS altegedly residing at 8125 Israr Drive, Houston. A chock of the following records failed to reflect any information for MABIMA POWERS:

An effort to locate 8125 Lazar Drive revealed that the address is non-existent. There is in Houston a Lamar Street and West Lamar Street, however, there is no address of an 8100 block on either street.

On May 9, 1968 JACK HEARD, Assistant Director, Texas Department of Corrections (TDC) Huntsville, Texas, advised as follows:

On March 25, 1965 WILLIAM THOMAS JACOBS received a two year sentence at FDC. His minimum discharge date was June 6, 1966. JACOBS lost no time and caused no trouble. On January 12, 1966 in view of his good behavior, he was transferred to the Texas Department of Corrections Pre-Release Unit, Huntsville and was given a trustee status. As such he picked up another month which accounts for his release on May 11, 1966. On Hay 11, 1966 JACOBS was discharged from the TDC with no parole involved. TDC records contain no subsequent information regarding JACOBS.

Information developed by the FIT determined that ERIC STARVO CALL stayed alone at the Hotel Rio, Room 212. Merelos 86, Puerto Vallarta, Mexico during the period October 19 to November 6, 1967 and from November 7 until November 13, 1967 at the Hotel Tropicana. One of the U.S. residents who was visiting at the Hotel Rio during the time that GALT resided at this hotel was Mr. and Mrs. LH (MARX E) SCHRADER, 3126 Righway 146, LaForte, Texas. Another was Mrs. E.H. COLLINS, JR; and Mrs. VIVIAN FRIEDBERG, 5711 LaFitte, Galveston, Texas.

The following investigation was conducted by SA FRANK M. IVEY:

On May 1, 1968 Mes MARY E. SCHRADER, 3126 Highway 146, LaPorte, Texas advised that she and her husband stayed at the Hotel Rio in Room 206, Puerto Vallarte, Jalisco, Mexico for about four or five days in late October, 1967. She stated she did not recall anyone by the rame of ERIC STARVO GALT or other aliases of this name staying there at the same time. She was unable to identify the photograph of the subject as anyone that she had seen during her stay in Mexico.

On May 1, 1968 LEWIS R. SCHRADER, 3126 Eighway 146, LaPorte, Texas was interviewed at his place of employment, Ebaseo Construction Company, where he is a pipe-fitter employed on the construction site of the Houston Lighting and Power Company, San Leon, Texas. Mr. SCHRADER stated teat he and his wife were on a vacation trip during late Cauchar, 1967 and stayed at the Hotel Rio (room unrecalled) Fuerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico, he stated he did not recall anyone staying there at the time by the name of ERIC STARVO GALT and was unable to identify the photograph of the subject as anyone he had seen.

The following investigation was conducted at B uston, Texas on May 1, 1968 by SA B. PERKOWSKI, JR.:

Mrs. VIVEAU (WIRUISKG, 5711 LaFitte Avenue, advised she scayed at the Lotel Rio in Puorto Vallarta,

Hexico, cometime in about October, 1967 for a period of about four or five days. She was accompanied by her sister, Mrs. E.N. COLLINS, JR. Shown photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and told that he may have used the name of ERIC GAME, the stated she does not recall that she noticed this person at the Hotel Rio or claushere during her visit to Mexico. She does not recall her room number in this botel and does not believe she held any conversation with GALF.

She stated also her sision lives in Houston, Texas at 5208 Mt. Houston Road and is employed in the office of Dr. HAROID SCHAFFRER at 5105 San Jacinto, telephone number JA 3-9812.

Mrs. E.K. COLLINS, JR., 5208 Mount Houston Road, Houston, Texas advised that during her trip to Puerto Vellarta, Mexico in October, 1967 when she was accompanied by her sister, VIVIAA FRIEDEERG she can recall no male who looked like the pictures of JAMES HARL RAY, also known as Eric Starvo Calt. It is her recollection most of the residents at Hotel Rio were elderly people and not fit the description of RAY, also known as Galt. She was unable to recall the number of the room at the Hotel Rio in which they stayed.

8. Telephone Calls From Pay Telephones December 15 - 17, 1967 Along Inter-State Righmay 10, Mozas

CHARLES STELLY whon interviewed by agents of the FBI av Los Angeles inApril, 1968 alleged that while traveling by automobile in the company of JAMES BARL RAY from Los Anneles to New Orleans in mid-December, 1967 RAY made approximately six telephone calls most of which were made while traveling through Texas. He recalled that one call may have been completed as SERRY had to wait for quite a The for RAY to return to the car. In the other instances FAY was gone for such a short period of time from the car that STEIM was of the opinion that the calls were not completed. STEDY was unable to meall the exact location from which RAY made the alleged completed phone call, but he was in the opinion that it was in the area "just west of Fig. ston" at a service station type establishment just off of U.S. interstate Elghway 10. The call was made at right, from a phone booth located by an access road paralleling the Assessy near a ligher store and gas station at a point where the freeway is cight lanes wide with a fence separating the freeway from the access read; SERIN further defined the time of the call as at approximately 9:00 PM on December 16, 1967 and was probably made to New Orleans, Louisiana.

On April 26, 1968 Everett Collier, Vice President and Editor, Houston Chronicle, a daily Houston newspaper, advised as follows:

LOUIS LOMAX and CHARLESSEEIN had arrived at Houston of 4:15 YM, April 25, 1968.

LOMAX is a controversial TV personality from the Los Augeles area who had his own TV show until Murch, 1968. He has also authored a book entitled "The Negro Revolt".

LOMAX and STEIN, accompanied by a Chronicle reporter, searched the area west of Houston in an attempt to locate the phone hooth from which JAMES EARL RAY allegedly made a call on the evening of December 16, 1967 and the search was unsuccessful. According to COLLIER, the Chronicle reporter, who accompanied LOMAX and STEIN on their search, described STEIN as being extremely vague and not at all sure of the area wherethe call was allegedly made.

COLLTER also advised that the North American Newspaper Alliance (MANA) has been trying to get in touch with LOMAX on April 26, 1968 for the purpose of writing a story on April 26, 1968 about STEIN's trip from Los Angeles to New Orleans with HAY.

COLLIER stated that he thought NAMA was controlled by columnist DREW PEARSON.

On April 27, 1968 DON MICHAELS, Houston Chronicle, ad-land that he dropped LOUIS LOMAX and CHARLES STEIN at Sen Artorio at 4:30 PM on April 26, 1968. They intended to want a car in San Antonio and indicated to MICHAELS that they hould turn the car in at San Antonio when through.

MICHARIS made the deservation that both LOMAX and STRIN appeared to be "lost" as far as their operation is concerned, MICHARIS further commented that, in his opinion, SIRIN is taking LOTYX "for a ride", MICHARIS learned from comments made by SIRIN that SIRIN had slept most of the way on the December cross-country trip, California to Louisiana when he assomeshed RAY.

JERRY F. NC FREESON, Manager, Holiday Inn, 9799 Katy, reviewed records for the period December 14-20, 1967; D.J. GRAVINK, Manager, Howard Johnson Motor Lodge, 7953 Katy, reviewed records for the entire year 1967; LOWELL MASON, Assistant Manager, Cactus Court, 7631 Katy, records for December, 1967. Each advised no record of CHARLES STEIN or of JAMES EARL RAY by name or aliases as occupants of motel unit during respective periods indicated.

The following investigation was conducted by SAs FRANK M. IVEY and WILLIAM G. MORRISSEY on April 25, 1968 at Houston, Texas.

Registration records of the following motels along Katy Fromky west (T.S. 10) were reviewed through the following persons for the period December 16-18, 1967 for Officials STEIN and/or JAMES EART, RAY by name or aliases. No record was located:

9. Ansociates of JAMES FARL RAY

Information devoloped by the Hansas City Office, PBF determined that MSAL EDGAR ARMY had been closely associated in Massouri State Penitentiary with - JAMES MARL RAY while RAY was incarcerated at that institution will his escape April 23, 1967.

On April 25, 1967 LMAD EDGAR ABBY also interviewed at Passey Unit, Dexas State Department of Corrections, Houston, Texas, ABIG advised as follows:

He and JAMAS EARL RAY had been inmates at Missouri State Penitentiary for about five years. He and RAY had handled minor nareotics while in prison in order to get memor for commissary lioms. AEBY stated that he had never known RAY to be a user of hard narcotics. AEBY has three brothers, NITH ADBY, Box 64, Segoville, Texas who also was a friend of RAY and who had served time with RAY at Missouri State Penitentiary: AURIBY AEBY, address unknown, Dallas, Texas; and JAMES AEBY who owns and operates a filling station, Dallas, Texas and who has never been arrested.

ARBY advised that he arrived at Ramsey No. 1 on April 24, 1968 after having been transferred from Missouri State Penitenthary to the TDC, Huntsville, Texas. ABBY stated that while enroute to Huntsville he was ledged in a jail in Oklahoma City for one night where he mailed a postcard to FRANK CULNAN, an inmate, Missouri State Penitentiary.

AEBY advised that his ex-wife JUDY possibly results in the Novston area but he has not seen her for the real years and does mot know where she could be located.

AEBY stated that JAMES HARL RAY had very for friends while in the Missouri State Penitentiary. He described RAY as being "very deadly". He stated that RAY was not a load cabble resumn type individual and that RAY as or expressed any hated for the Megre race but if anyone accepted that may way hay mould immediately contrive means to get even. For a cabbel that he was a chief cook while at the may a diagon for a cook while at

as a slicer in the local soon. ABBY advised that RAY on two occasions, once in 1952 and again in 1955 attempted to escape from Missouri State Familiary but in each case he was unsuccessful. In one instance the ladder broke and in the other instance the rope which he was using failed to support him and he fell and fractured his arm. After serving time in solitary RAT was again returned to the bread room.

AEBY stated that RAY had mentioned to him that he, RAY, had a brother in St. Louis and that he, RAY, was from St. Louis. AELY advised that he did not know the names of RAY's brother or where he could be located. When questioned about the escape route utilized by RAY in 1967 AEBY advised he would not divulge this cacape route as the route is still good and could be used by other prisoners. AEBY advised that he hated the warfen at Fissouri State Fendtentiary and hoped that he was receiving considerable "heat" as a receit of RAY's escape. Regarding the escape of RAY, AEBY stated that it would have been the 'smart thing to de" to have an outside man waiting to assist RAY in leaving the territory. AEBY would not about that he knew of any outside man so assisting RAY in his escape. AEBY did not state whether on not RAY had had any inside help in his escape.

ABBY advised that in 1963 or 1964 RAY had a nervous breakdown while at Historia State Penitentiary and RAY developed a bad stomach which necessitated RAY eating special foods. ABBY on naturnal occasions would cook eggs for RAY because of RAY's stomach. He stated RAY was partial to eggs. He recalled that while at Missouri State Femitentiary RAY quit aroking probably because of his stomach allment. He recalled too that RAY enjoyed tinkering with mechanical things and that RAY had built an airconditioner out of spare parts for RAY's jail cell. RAY was also handy in the repair of radice, parts for which he would chean from the penitentiary machine shop. AEBY stated that he did not believe that RAY would go to Mexico or leave the country and he stated that he hoped that RAY would never be caught. AEBY stated he would in no way render assistance that would aid in the capture of RAY and he would furnish to further information regarding RAY.

JUNE CARREST PRESENT THE Thomas, also known as Judy Carol Acry, 10005 V. Terret. Houston, no telephone, interviewed of the 25 1984 and the following information:

She was rearried to NEAL EDGAR ARRY for approximately two years in 1960 and 1961. When he was arrested and returned to Hissouri in 1961, she came to Houston and has not seen Arrest since that time. She last contacted him on advising him of the birth of their daughter. She has diversed ARRY and has not corresponded with him since that date. Subject RAY is unknown to her and she has not been contacted by any of ARRY's associates during the past six years. She stated ARRY does not know her exect address and could not locate her himself.

The only relative of AEBY who subject RAY might centact would be brother ADERY AEBY, Dallas, Texas. She does not know the whoresbouts of AEBY's relatives and never was closely associated with them.

PETERN promised complete cooperation and will immediately advise the FER of any information received regarding RAY.

#### 10. GEORGE VILLIAM RUSSELL

GEORGE WITHIAM RUSSELL, a salesman for Pat Lape Mobile Hones, 3712 Telephone Road, Houston, Texas when interviewed on April 26, 1968 advised that JAMES EARL RAY was unknown to him by name or photograph. Pussell bad been inconcerated at Missouri State Penitentiary from May, 1958 to December, 1966. He was released in 1966 and had come to Houston from St. Louis, Missouri in approximately Movember, 1967. RUSSELL also stated that the name MEAL EDGAR ADDIT was also unknown to him.

Information was received by the FBI, Birmingham, that ERIC STARVO GAIT had once indicated that he had been exployed as a barger working out of St. Louis, Missouri between that city and New Orleans, Louisiana.

On April 11, 1968 COURTNEY ALLEN, Vice President, Stoom City and Hew Orleans Forge Lines, Houston, Texas Edvised records of their company, 1953 to date, contained no employment record for an ERIC STARVO GALT.

Since April 3, 1968 there has been only one such departure, a Marine Sea Transport Service vessel. TRAVISIAM checked the list of crew members and passengers and advised it did not contain the name ERIC STARVO GAME, HARVEY LOWMEYER, HARVEY LOWMYER or JOHN WILLIARD or any logical variations of these names.

On April 11, 1968 MARGIE LE BARRON, U.S. Customs, advised her files reflected no American vessels have sailed from Galveston since April 4, 1968. She stated several foreign vessels have sailed from Galveston since April 4, 1968 but her files would not contain the crew and passenger lists as these are maintained by the agency that handles these vessels. On May 23, 1968, a confidential source advised the Cleveland Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that his wife had recently returned from Miami, Florida, where she had worked in a bar. During her stay in Miami she met a man named Roland (last name unknown), who stated he was a Ku Klux Klan Grand Dragon and who drove a white Mustang. Roland stated to her after King's death that he had knowledge of it, and that Adam Clayton Powell, Stokely Carmichael, and H. Rap Brown were also scheduled for assassination and that "we will take care of Bobby Kennedy so he will never become president."

Roland reportedly carries weapons in his car and is accompanied by a large, vicious Doberman pinscher dog.

Roland was identified by the Miami Office of the FBI as Roland Chesley Talbott, Jr. Talbott operates a white Mustang and breeds Doberman pinscher dogs. He is a former member of Klavern #6, United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and last attended a meeting of Klavern #6 on September 11, 1967.

A characterization of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, is contained in the appendix section of this memorandum.

Talbott was interviewed on May 24, 1968, at his place of employment, McGahey Chrysler-Plymouth, 1930 N. E. 2nd Avenue, Miami, Florida. He stated he has been "shooting his mouth off" sympathizing with individuals responsible for or connected with the shooting of Martin Luther King, Jr. ever since April 4, 1968.

Talbott further stated that he is of the opinion that Adam Clayton Powell, H. Rap Brown, and Stokely Carmichael should also be assassinated and that Bobby Kennedy should be stopped by non-violent means so he can never become president. Talbott believes Kennedy is responsible for all the current racial unrest in this country.

Talbott advised that he believes in the supremacy of the white race and stated that he is a former Klansman. Talbott stated even though he makes many controversial statements, he has no intention of perpetrating any such act such as shooting a Negro or political leader and is not acquainted with anyone who would do so.

Talbott advised that on occasion he carries firearms in his automobile but not for the purpose of shooting anyone.

The employment records of McGahey Chrysler-Plymouth were reviewed with reference to Roland Talbott and these records indicate that Talbott was at work at McGahey, Miami, Florida, on April 4, 1968.

#### UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC. KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klam organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klams, Knights of the Ku Klux Klam of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised on July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states.)

Roland reportedly carries weapons in his car and is accompanied by a large, vicious Doberman pinscher dog.

Roland was identified by the Miami Office of the FBI as Roland Chesley Talbott, Jr. Talbott operates a white Mustang and breeds Doberman pinscher dogs. He is a former member of Klavern #6, United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, and last attended a meeting of Klavern #6 on September 11, 1967.
