She stated LOVE is in the Air Force and on the date of this call he was stationed at Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas. LOVE has since been transferred to duty with the Air Force in Viet Nam, having been so transferred on December 27, 1967.

Miss AUBERT furnished the above information in the presence of her mother, Mrs. AUBERT. Mrs. AUBERT was unable to furnish any additional information.

Both Miss AUBERT and Mrs. AUBERT were exhibited photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and were unable to effect an identification. Both also advised that the name JAMES EARL RAY was entirely unfamiliar to them with the exception of news items they had seen and heard concerning RAY.

Mr. FRANK BUTLER STEVENS, 28330 Hollywood, Roseville, Michigan, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

On April 4, 1968, the date of the assassination of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., he and his wife remained at their home until approximately 6:00 p.m., at which time they went to the Centennial Bowling Alley and Far, Gratiot and Eight Mile Road, Detroit, Michigan. While at the Centennial Bar he and his wife first learned of the assassination of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. over the radio. They were at the bar by themselves, however, their presence was known to HARVEY, the Bartender.

He was advised that the Detroit Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation had received a telephone call from an anonymous person who indicated that he, FRANK STEVENS, had flown to Memphis the day before the assassination of KING and had been in possession of a large sum of money. He was advised that the caller also indicated that FRANK STEVENS had stated that he "had a job to do" in Memphis. STEVENS advised that he had not been out of the State of Michigan in the past 10 months and he feels that the above information is the result of a joke.

Approximately four or five days following the assassination of Doctor KING his business partner, PAUL KOTY, was in the Playmoor Bar, Livernois Avenue, Detroit, speaking with the owner, WALTER HARVARD. WALTER HARVARD is a Negro and PAUL KOTY thought that he would "have a little fun with him". When WALTER HARVARD asked if PAUL KOTY had seen FRANK STEVENS, PAUL replied that he had not seen FRANK since the day before the assassination of Doctor KING at which time FRANK had received a telephone call and had immediately taken a plane for Memphis. PAUL told FRANK that as soon as he had made that statement to WALTER HARVARD, HARVARD excused himself and made a telephone call.

He was acquainted with FRANK BUTLER STEVENS, however, he has not seen STEVENS in approximately one and one-half months. Approximately four days after the assassination of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. he was tending bar one evening and became engaged in a conversation STEVENS' business partner. He cannot remember the name of this individual, however, he believes his first name is PAUL.

PAUL mentioned that he had recently been double-crossed by FRANK STEVENS in a business deal and said that he would like to get even with STEVENS. PAUL went on to state that he had seen STEVENS the day before the assassination of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. and at that time STEVENS was in possession of approximately \$4,500.00 and indicated that he and someone else were flying to Memphis and they had a "job to do". PAUL did not furnish any more information regarding this alleged trip by STEVENS.

Immediately upon receipt of this information from PAUL, he passed this information along to a friend of his whom he felt would give it to the proper law enforcement agency. He declined to identify this friend.

Dear Mr. Johnson:

In the names I sent you two weeks ago, I overlooked the name of Harvey Sadler, former sheriff of Macon County, Ala.

Mr. Sadler was regarded as the foremost "racist" of Macon County when I was there. Negroes feared him greatly and said he was allied with Governor Wallace in a number of attempts to terrorize them and keep integration out of Macon County, including an aborted attempt to hold a Klan rally in Tuskegee in 1961, the burning of the Chehaw School and the Notasulya School in 1964 and 1963

Sadler was appointed to fill an interim position as Sheriff in 1965. Before the appointment could be made, people of Macon County were reportedly under instructions from Wallace to "get that nigger out of there", a Negro, James Charity, who had been appointed the first Negro deputy sheriff in Tuckegee, or Macon County, history by former Sheriff Preston Hornsby, who ran for and was elected Probate Judge.

Charity was 'persuaded' to become the first Negro policeman in Tuskegoe. Subsequently, Negroes elected a Negro sheriff.

I asked Sadler if he were a member of the Klan and he denied it. That was in 1965. He wouldn't say if he were a member of the White Citizens Council, or not.

I suppose he has gone back to tending his grocery, which depends on Negro trade, on the Auburn Highway in Tuskegee.

I thought you might like to know that many Alabama Magroes feel that the King assassination was plotted by the Wallace forces to provoke Negroes to riot to further Wallace's political ambitions. Negroes feel that he is insane with political ambition.

They also feel that Rev. Abornathy is in danger, or the Poor March in danger of being burned out or stampeded to provoke bloody nationwide rioting, also to further Mallaco's ambitions.

They feel that Galt or Ray made his contact here, rather, picked up his initial mensy here, that he was recruited through his brother in the prison, that the "bounty" story was circulated in a Missouri prison to draw attention away from the South.

I just thought I would pass this scuttlebutt along. If you ever release anything, I hope you won't forget that I'm in the newspaper business.

The following investigation was conducted by SA DELMER R. EXON, on May 24, 1968.

At Tulsa, Oklahoma

ROEHM WEST, Attorney, Enterprise Building, identified his client, who has been in contact with EDGAR EUGENE BRADLEY, North Hollywood, California, as being BETTY HELM, 3, Woodward Boulevard, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

BETTY HELM, 3 Woodward Boulevard, who requested her identity be concealed, advised that she has been acquainted with EDGAR EUGENE BRADLEY since 1937. In November, 1962, BRADLEY visited her in Tulsa and left, presumably to go to his residence in California. BRADLEY was with HELM on November 19, and 20, 1962. He left her residence in the early morning hours of the 20th. Since BRADLEY became involved in the GARRISON investigation at New Orleans, he has been trying to get HELM to furnish him with an affidavit concerning his whereabouts during November, 1962. HELM has declined to furnish such an affidavit.

She said she received telephone calls from BRADLEY on May 2, and May 19, 1968. She presumed these telephone calls were long distance from his residence at North Hollywood, California. In one of the calls he mentioned that his telephone bill was high and he would rather not make so many telephone calls pertaining to the affidavit he has been trying to obtain. HELM stated she has simply referred BRADLEY to her attorney. She said she had no information that BRADLEY has been in the Tulsa area during the recent past and she felt that if he had been in the Tulsa area he undoubtedly would have called her.

HELM further stated that she has never had any reason to think that BRADLEY would physically harm anyone. She had never known him to be engaged in any plot of any kind. Although BRADLEY is a radical anti-Communist, she has no information concerning his views on racial matters. HELM stated that when in Tulsa, BRADLEY normally stayed at the Adams Hotel.

WANDA BALLARD, Clerk, Adams Hotel, advised that a search of her records failed to reflect that BRADLEY was a guest at any time during May, 1968.

In view of the mental condition of the source of the information that the subject may be at CLARK's residence and the fact that Nev. CLARK is a Negro minister, who has been active in NAACP affairs, no further investigation is believed warranted in this matter.

ROYSTER stated that from previous acquaintance with PUCKETT, he was aware PUCKETT did not like the late President KENNEDY or his brother. At no time did ROYSTER hear any mention of the name of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and he did not have any specific information as to the identity of the intended victim nor the name of the person "they" sent to shut him up. ROYSTER emphasized that he had reported the information to his minister, FLOYD RATON, Creedmoor, N. C., on a confidential basis on the possibility that it might have bearing on the assassination of Rev. KING, but he, ROYSTER, had no additional information in the matter whatsoever. ROYSTER added further that he had been the only other individual present in the store at the time of the conversation. At about the time the above comments were made, MELVIN PUCKETT'S brother, ULYSSES C. PUCKETT, came to the store and filled the prescription and ROYSTER left.

ROYSTER expressed the opinion that PUCKETT was a member of the local unit of the KKK. He based this opinion on the fact PUCKETT has a Citizens Band Radio in the store and one of the numbers on his list was that of the KKK.

ROYSTER further reported that three PARHAM brothers operated a garage at Bullock, N. C., known as the Bullock Garage. He understood DAVE PARHAM left Bullock, N. C., about two days prior to 4/4/68, driving a red Mustang. He was gone for approximately one week before returning driving a light blue Mustang. He stated DAVE, a white male, in his 30's or 40's, who, insofar as he knew, had moved to the vicinity of Bullock during the summer of 1967. ROYSTER stated that he thought possibly DAVE PARHAM could have been the person referred to by PUCKETT although he was unaware of any association whatsoever between PUCKETT and PARHAM. Furthermore, he had heard some conversation indicating DAVE PARHAM had been gone during the week of 4/4/68, on duty with the National Guard.

He said that he had a couple of former prisoners staying at his place for a short period about three or four years ago but he could not remember their names. He advised that since his wife left him and ran off with an ex-conrict ne wanted to forget the past. He could offer no additional information.

Several unsuccessful attempts were made on 8-24-68, in an effort to contact the residence of 2836 Eads Ave., SIMO.

FISHER said that JIM BRADLEY, a lifer, also was friendly with RAY though he does not know to what extent.

No leads are being set forth to interview BRADLEY since he has already been interviewed, nor WARREN RAY since it appears that WARREN RAY is undoubtedly identical with RAY EUGENE WARREN and information concerning both of these inmates was set forth in Kansas City report of 5/15/68.

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knowing the name of the complainant, it would be extremely difficult to locate the case number for the original offense that is, the purchases on March 8 and 11, 1968. He said that this case number would have to be obtained since if anyone was arrested by the police department on that charge, it would have been listed within that case number. He said that either Detectives W. HICKEY or J. ZACHARIAS, of his Command, might have handled the matter because they are the officers he usually assigns credit card cases to.

On 5/21/68, Detective WILLIAM HICKEY advised that he thinks he recalls the original report from the Shell Station and would make an effort to locate it. He further advised, however, that he could not recall anyone being arrested for this offense. Subsequently, on 5/22/68, Detective HICKEY advised that he was unable to locate any CB number for a fraudulent credit card purchase on the dates indicated at a Shell Station on Armitage Avenue. He also advised that he had discussed this matter with the various detectives assigned to Area 5 with negative results. He did suggest, however, that Detectives ZACHARIAS be contacted.

On 5/27/68, Detective ZACHARIAS advised that he had no record nor recollection of either the original offense or of anyone being arrested and released on a fraudulent credit card use in Area 5.

Due to the manner in which the Chicago Police Department maintains its records, it would be physically impossible, based on the information furnished, in Milwaukee airtel of 5/16/68, to identify the individual supposedly using GOLDMAN's gas credit card who had been picked up and then released by the Chicago Police Department. Accordingly, for that reason and for the reasons set forth in referenced Chicago airtel, no further investigation being conducted into the identity of the assailants of MARSHALL GOLDMAN.

BROWN reinterviewed at his present residence, Talladega, Ala., and following is synopsis of additional information obtained: BROWN was shown all available photos of JAMES EARL RAY and picked out photo taken at bartending school as one most resembling RAY. Concerning other photo taken of RAY in California in January or February, 1968, EROWN said this did not resemble RAY, but did strongly resemble a person who came to a gas station where BROWN worked in June, 1967, in Reform, Ala. This person was driving a late-model red Mustan and was accompanied by two white males, one being an ex-convi from the Missouri State Pen, FNU ALLEN, other unknown to BROWN. BROWN had no conversation with driver of Mustang, but ALLEN, whom BROWN had known in the pen, told BROWN that he and his two friends were going to Tuscaloosa, Ala., from Columbus, Ga. ALLEN had been released from pen few months before BROWN (June, 1965.) BROWN claimed he had seen ALLEN and RAY in conversations in the pen on several occasions and that BROWN was positive that ALLEN and BROWN knew each other. 3 - Bureau 2 - Kansas City (44-760) 2 - Memphis (44-1987) 2 - St. Louis (44-775) 3 - Birningham RME:mf1 (11)						1
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BROWN claimed that ALLEN was considered to be a "stool pigeon" inside the pen. ALLEN came from Kennett, Mo., and had been convicted of robbery. BROWN claimed that RAY was living in F Hall when BROWN met him through JOHNNY VELANTI, and that ALLEN also lived in F Hall. (Review of Kansas City report dated 5/15/68 fails to indicate that RAY ever lived in F Hall; however, it is noted that in St. Louis report of 5/10/68, VELANTI claimed that RAY did live in F Hall.)

BROWN claimed the information he was furnishing concerned JAMES EARL RAY and he did not have him confused with any prisoners with similar names such as JAMES RAYE (as claimed by VELANTI) or JAMES WRAY.

BROWN claimed that VELANTI once said he, VELANTI, would get along in Mexico if he ever got there, and that he, VELANTI, would go to some small town past Mexico City to hide out, if he ever escaped. VELANTI named the town, but BROWN can not recall name. This claim was made in presence of RAY. VALENTI also claimed he had run off from an orphans' home at the age of 14, and was later "taken in" and raised by a Sheriff. VELANTI then became involved in allowing the escape of several prisoners being held by this Sheriff in Louisiana. Because of their close association in the pen, BROWN said it was most likely that RAY and VELANTI would get together outside.

BROWN continued to claim he had no knowledge of any convict organization in the pen, but it appeared to interviewing agents that he was possibly withholding information when pressed on this point. He said there were several poker games operated by certain convicts and that some others took bets on sporting events. One of these was JOHNNIE JOHNSON, who operated a game with his *half-brother" BOBBY ASHE. BROWN claimed he had seen JOHNSON and RAY in several conversations together and that RAY usually always played in the game operated by JOHNSON and ASHE.

BROWN identified one "SLICK" STEDHAM (ph) as a poker game operator who also was used to collect gambling debts inside the pen.

BROWN identified his closest friends in the pen as DONALD COX from St. Louis, who left in 1963 after serving
