The information on Subject was sent to PSO Salisbury, with a copy of your memorandum dated 14 May 1968. Results of talks will be forwarded to you as soon as possible.

The RSO took the liberty of supplying the same information to the South African C.I.D. The C.I.D. will abide by the request for no publicity, and will coordinate their efforts with the Rhodesian Police, who have regular liaison personnel in Pretoria.

The information was given to South African C.I.D. on the outside chance that Subject may have changed his mind at the last minute, if he intended to go to Rhodesia, because it would be easy to lose himself in South Africa, unless he created a disturbance, rather than go to Rhodesia where he had, in the past, openly declared that he wished to emigrate However, both police forces in Rhodesia and South Africa are cuite efficient and will arrive at some conclusion in the near future. Their reports will be forwarded promotly.

The TCR-1 is actually completed or filled in by banks, savings and loan associations and other financial type institutions when a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal, or other payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution, which involves U.S. Currency as follows:

- 1. Transactions involving \$2,500 or more of U.S. Currency in denominations of \$100 or higher.
- 2. Transactions involving \$10,000 or more of U.S.Currency in any denomination.
- 3. Transactions involving any amount in any denomination, which in the judgment of the financial institution exceed those commensurate with the customary conduct of the person or organization concerned.

After the TCR-1 Forms are executed they are then sent to the Federal Reserve Banks and their branches who in turn retain them for about one month and at which time they are then sent on to IRS Intelligence Units in the particular area.

In a recent major case (YOUNGNAP) within the Los Angeles Division, the above information became known, and as a result a Confidential Source was developed who furnishes us copies of these forms on a weekly basis. In reviewing the data on such forms it was believed that the information would be of value in investigations relating to Anti-Racketeering, Federal Reserve Act, Bankruptcy, Ascertaining Financial Ability, Fraud Against the Government, Bank Robbery and larceny cases as well as Security type matters.

For the above reason the Los Angeles Division opened a dead file captioned:

"CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS, REPORTS OR PERSONS OR ORGANIZATIONS INVOLVED AR"

And copies of all the TCR-1 Forms received since March 3, 1968 have been filed alphabetically in a special indices after they have been indexed to the general office index. These forms are then reviewed periodically for individuals whose name continually reappear for possibly anti-racketeering matters.

Enclosed for the Bureau and each office receiving this communication is one unexecuted copy of the TCR-1 Form.

For information of the Bureau, the Los Angeles Division is currently reviewing the TCR-1 Forms for individuals who may have made a \$10,000 withdrawal of funds and appropriate investigation will be conducted as to each such individual.

The Bureau may wish to have each office contact the IRS Intelligence Units within their division and review copies of these forms for the month of April, 1968. It is believed that this would expidite coverage of the requested lead and cover a larger geographical area.

INSTRUCTIONS

This report is required pursuant to Treasury Department regulations revised August 3, 1959 (31 Code of Federal Regulations 102).

Forms TCR-1 shall be prepared in original only for currency transactions involving United States currency as follows:

- 1. Transactions involving \$2,500 or more of United States currency in denominations of \$100 or higher;
- 2. Transactions involving \$10,000 or more of United States currency in any denominations, and
- 3. Transactions involving any amount in any denominations,

which in the judgment of the financial institution exceed those commensurate with the customary conduct of the business, industry or profession of the person or organization concerned.

Reports shall be filed on or before the 15th day of the month following that in which the reported transactions occur, with the Federal Reserve Bank of the district in which the reporting financial institution is located. Copies of this form may be obtained from any Federal Reserve Bank.

According to referenced communication, the Intelligence Units of the U. S. Treasury Department have been receiving from Federal Reserve Banks a form known as TCR-1 "Report of Currency Transactions; Person or Organization Concerned in Transaction Reported." These

forms are completed or filled in by banks, savings and loan associations, and other financial type institutions when a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal or other payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution, which involves the U. S. Currency

in which \$10,000 or more is handled.

In view of this, every office receiving this communication will explore the feasibility of obtaining the information from Internal Revenue Service Intelligence Units within their division. It is very possible that the infor-mation requested by the Bureau regarding withdrawals of \$10,000 or more from banks could be more readily obtained through the Internal Revenue Service.

If any discussion ensues at banks or other financial institutions, you should not mention the completion and filing of these forms under any circumstances. This information is War your intelligence only.

NOTE: The Bureau requested the Atlanta, Birmingham, Memphis, New Orleans and Los Angeles Divisions to make appropriate inquiry at banks to determine identity of individuals making a withdrawal of \$10,000 and over in cash, confining this inquiry for period of April, 1968. The Bureau requested this as a possibility exists that subject was a hired assassin and a pay-off could have taken place.

Los Angeles advises that a form is actually completed or filled in by banks and other type financial institutions when a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal or other such payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution which involves transactions of \$10,000 or more of U. S. Currency in any denomination. Los Angeles advises that the Internal Revenue Service Intelligence Units of various places throughout the United States has this information on file and it is possible that the offices obtaining such information from banks could use this source to readily obtain the necessary data. These facts are being called to the attention of respective field divisions.

Internal Revenue Service Headquarters at Washington, D. C., advises that the completing of the form is an agreement between financial institutions under jurisdiction of Federal Reserve System and the Treasury Department and every such institution does actually complete thr form. This information is confidential and should not be discussed with any financial institution. Internal Revenue also advises that these forms are sent by the financial institutions to Federal Reserve who in turn sends them to the appropriate Internal Revenue Intelligence Unit, and they will be available to the Intelligence Units.

Dr. GERBER stated that as a rule, only bodies that have met with violent deaths or have not been identified are taken to the morgue in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. However, he stated that many individuals who have died of natural causes do pass through a coroner's office where there is no physician available to sign the death certificate.

Dr. GERBER stated that many deceased do not pass through a coroner's office or medical examiners office when the death certificate is signed by a physician. In such cases, the body goes directly to a mortician. Dr. GERBER stated that the Executive Secretary for the National Funeral Directors Association is HOWARD RATHER, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Recommendations and Requests:

- 1.) Bureau will furnish the Cleveland Office with 2500 Identification Orders #4182, along with Bureau approval for Cleveland to circularize this Identification Order with a letter from the Director as set forth above.


