THOMPSON advised that in general, the artist's conception was not sufficiently swarthy in appearance to convey the proper complexion of HARDIN. THOMPSON had no further remarks as to the general description of the subject.

On June 4, 1968, Deputy United States Marshal Paskal Bowser, Executive Office of United States Marshals, Ninth and D Streets, Northwest, Washington, D. C., made available to SA Lear an army photograph taken on October 22, 1967, at the Pentagon following the anti-Vietnam demonstration.

The photograph shows various writings on the wall of the Pentagon, one of which is, "Who is John Galt?" Mr. Bowser said he did not see the actual writing and his knowledge is limited to his noticing the writing on the photograph. He did not know the significance of the writing, if any, but wanted to bring it to the attention of the FBI because of the name "Galt." He had been reviewing photographs of the demonstration in an unrelated matter.

This case involves the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

In continuing to run out the story reportedly furnished the Los Angeles "Times" by an individual identified only as "Bob," information has been developed indicating that the individual known to Leamont Anderson White, an effeminate Negro, employee of Western Union in Los Angeles, as Bob Brickley is in reality Lester Edward Packett. FBI Number 827170A. This individual has been the subject of Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property and Interstate Transportation of Stolen Motor Vehicle cases investigated by the Bureau. A photograph of Packett was exhibited to Leamont Anderson White who identified it as the photograph of the individual he knew as Bob Brickley.

The manager of an apartment house located at 812 South Westlake, Los Angeles, identified this same photograph as a former resident of that apartment house. The manager stated that the individual resided in an apartment with Odela A. Packett who is currently serving a 30-day sentence for prostitution in Los Angeles.

Mint. Kill Jerry Cohen of the Los Angeles "Times" advised that the newspaper had promised their informant, "Bob," that they would not reveal his identity nor furnish information which would lead to his location. Cohen did advise our Los Angeles Office that he would advise if any of the photographs exhibited to him were identical with his informant, "Bob." Cohen stated that the photograph of Frank Brickley, an ex-convict who has been primarily suspected as being "Bob," was not identical with his informant but Cohen "declined to comment" when the photograph of

Memorandum to Mr. DeLoach RE: MURKIN

Lester Packett's wife, Odela Packett, was interviewed in the Los Angeles County Jail and she stated that she filed for divorce from Packett two months ago on grounds of desertion, cruelty and nonsupport. She stated her legal fees were being paid by her relatives and she added that she was so mad at Packett at the time of the filing of the divorce that she tore up all of the photographs she had of him. She described him as a shiftless drifter who never held a job during their five years of marriage. She stated she does not know his present whereabouts.

Background information on Lester Packett and interview with Odela Packett indicates he has spent time in Belle Glade, Florida; Reno, Nevada; various locations in Tennessee; Chicago, Illinois; and Kansas City. These areas were mentioned in connection with the story furnished the Los Angeles "Times" by "Bob." Leamont Anderson White believes Packett is the individual who took his two guns and is the only individual outside of Frank Brickley and a person whom he knew as Brickley's cousin whose name he could not recall that would have known he even possessed the guns.

John Eugene Gawron, the old man who lived with Ray's mother from 1954 until her death in 1961, previously advised he taught Ray to be a burglar. He previously stated that he and Ray cased a bank in 1958 or 1959 but did not rob it because Gawron injured his leg. Gawron furnished varying information regarding subject's alleged involvement in a bank robbery following his escape from the Missouri State Penitentiary on 4/23/67. After numerous efforts to elicit the truth from Gawron, he has now revealed that the bank allegedly robbed by Ray and an accomplice is located in Alton, Illinois. Gawron stated that Ray's accomplice in the bank robbery told him, Gawron, that his name was "Jimmy," last name unknown. Gawron stated that the last time he saw "Jimmy," last name unknown, and they visited him on the nights of 5/13 and 14/68. Ex-convicts John Paul Valenti and James H. Carpenter are known to have visited Gawron on those dates.

Bureau files show that at approximately 1 pim.,7/13/67, two unknown subjects wearing stocking masks entered the side door and robbed the Bank of Alton in Alton, Illinois. One subject proceeded directly

to the tellers' area, walked behind the counter, emptied cash from two tellers' cages and left the bank by the same route. Unknown subject number two stood outside the side door flourishing a sawed-off shotgun and covered the customers and employees until unknown subject number one left. Then he backed out of the bank. The robbers obtained \$27,230 in loot, not \$50,000 as alleged by Gawron.

St. Louis City Jail records establish that James H. Carpenter was in City Jail, St. Louis, from 6/5/67 to 3/1/68 and could not, therefore, have participated in the bank robbery or have contacted Gawron as Gawron had claimed in 1967. Carpenter's description does not fit either of the unknown subjects; although Ray's description could approximate that of unknown subject number two.

Gawron led Agents to the above bank and identified it as the one he and Ray had cased in 1959. The modus operandi planned was substantially the same as that used in the actual bank robbery. Gawron stated that he had deliberately misled Agents as to the amount involved and the location of the bank to gain time to be sure he would be in the clear. Investigation of the bank robbery mentioned above is being intensified to ascertain whether Ray could have possibly been involved, thereby accounting for his source of funds.

## ACTION:

Vigorous investigation is continuing in order to bring this matter to a prompt conclusion.



On June 4, 1968, the above-captioned individual, who identified himself as a free-lance writer, appeared in my office and furnished me the attached copy of a letter which reflects that McMillan is writing a book for Little, Brown and Company, Publishers, Boston, Massachusetts, concerning the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King and one of the important features of the book would be a fully developed profile of the assassin. This book is to be published by Little, Brown and Company.

McMillan asked if we could be of assistance to him in connection with the preparation of his book.

It was pointed out to him that we could not be of assistance in connection with the book, that this case is a pending investigation, and that the FBI, therefore, is unable to furnish any information concerning the case other than has been contained in the previously issued press releases. McMillan was disappointed but appeared satisfied with this decision. Our files reflect that McMillan is a free-lance writer who was the author of an article entitled "The Birmingham Church Bombing" which appeared in the "Saturday Evening Post" issue of 6-6-64, which was not unfavorable to the FBI. Our files also reflect that he was the author of an article which appeared in November, 1960, captioned "Racial Violence and Law Enforcement" dealing with troubles in Little Rock, Chattanooga and Montgomery. The article was printed in pamphlet form by "New South," a publication published by the Southern Regional Council which, in turn, is interlocked with the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, an organization cited as subversive by the House Committee on Un-American Activities. 


