I also need some additional detail as to your way of life inside the prison during the seven years prior to your escape.

Here are more questions:

✓ In that seven years name for me all the people who visited you.

✓ How often did you have a visit from somebody?

✓ Estimate for me how many times you had a visitor during that seven years?

✓ Did any woman ever visit you?

✓ Immediately prior to your escape on April 23rd, when had you had your last visitor? A month? Three months? Christmas? Six months?

✓ Tell me how and where you slept in prison? Alone in a cell? With one cell-mate? Who was your last cell-mate?

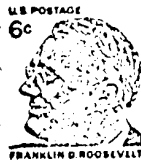
✓ Tell me about this last cell-mate? Who? What crime was he in for? Did he talk a lot? What about?

and LAWRENCE RAND on 4/4/68 were obtained by officers of
the Memphis Police Department. He advised he has no way of
knowing who touched or handled these registration cards.
He explained these registration cards were not picked up
by the Memphis Police Department until several days after
these individuals came to their attention. Consequently
the registration cards themselves were not treated as
evidence and therefore no limitations were made by the

Memphis Police Department for protection of these cards from being handled. He pointed out further the Memphis Police Department has no way of knowing if any other law enforcement agency personnel has handled these registration cards.

Inasmuch as it cannot be determined with any certainty the identity of the individuals at the Memphis Police Department that may have or likely handled these registration cards, no elimination prints will be obtained from personnel of the Memphis Police Department.

With regard to personnel of the William Len Hotel, mentioned above, who likely handled these cards, Mr. KENNETH W. NEWMAN, Manager of the William Len Hotel, advised SA GYLFE on 8/16/68 the only logical persons who would normally handle the above-described registration cards are Mrs. RUBY WIGGINS, who registered captioned individuals into the hotel, and Miss ROSE FRATINI, telephone operator, whose duty it is to file the registration cards for the hotel. He pointed out, however, all personnel of the hotel do have access to the registration cards should the need arise. He also commented other individuals such as the various law enforcement officers at times have access to and do handle the registration cards.

Bearing the above comments in mind as related by Mr. NEWMAN, elimination prints of Mrs. WIGGINS and Miss FRATINI were obtained. It is obvious the enclosed prints are not of good quality or clarity; however, the Bureau is requested to bear in mind the age of both of these women and the fact both commented while being printed that they are suffering from arthritis and therefore were not able to cooperate as well as they would have liked to, so as to furnish clear prints. Additional prints are enclosed of these two individuals so as to be of assistance, if possible, in the examination.

The FBI Identification Division, Latent Fingerprint Section, is requested to examine the enclosed fingerprint cards with the unidentified latent prints developed on the William Len Hotel registration cards concerning VINCENT WALKER and LAWRENCE RAND.

Submitted elimination prints not identical with latent prints previously reported on William Len Hotel registration cards. Memphis Division advised.

Recommend matter (see memorandum A. Rosen to Mr. DeLoach, dated August 5, 1968, entitled "Murkin") be referred to General Investigative Division for further consideration.

As a result of checking various hotels and motels in Memphis, Tennessee, regarding suspects in the Martin Luther King, Jr. assassination, it was determined that an individual by the name of Vincent Walker and another by the name of Lawrence Rand registered at the William Len Hotel in Memphis on April 4, 1968. On April 5, 1968, they made a hasty departure from the hotel taking a taxicab to the Memphis Airport. Investigation strongly indicates that these two individuals departed Memphis by Delta Airlines Flight No. 157, nonstop to Houston, Texas, on April 5, 1968, using the names of W. Davis and B. Chidlow.

This matter has been thoroughly checked with negative results in order to determine the true identity of these individuals. It appears that these two individuals may have been in Memphis for the possibility of committing some illegal activity or there as possible fugitives "cooling off" and departed immediately because of the pressure of law enforcement on the King assassination.

In view of the fact that these two individuals may be Bureau fugitives and could be possibly implicated as co-conspirators, it is recommended that this matter be referred to the Identification Division for the purpose of determining if it is feasible to check all unidentified latent fingerprints from the registration cards of the William Len Hotel with that of white Bureau fugitives between the ages of 20 and 35. It is noted that the best available information indicates that Walker and Rand are described as white males between the ages of 20 and 35.

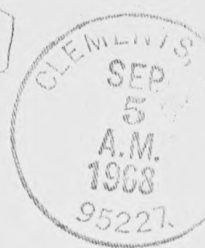

Memphis has transmitted to us copies of two separate letters addressed to James Earl Ray as made available by Captain Ray of the Memphis, Tennessee, Police Department who is in charge of the security of James Earl Ray at the Shelby County Jail, Memphis, Tennessee. Letter number one is postmarked 8-22-68 at Goleta, California, from Camp Marcos Camp, Leon William Short and letter number two is postmarked 9-5-68 at Clements, California, from Leon W. Short, General Delivery, Clements, California. These letters in general offer assistance to subject Ray in the form of financial help and generally are sympathetic towards Ray.

Memphis has instructed Los Angeles and Sacramento to identify the Camp Marcos Camp and Short, and instructions are being given by this teletype to restrict identification through check of office indices, police department and credit Bureau records and not to interview Short. The handwriting in these letters will be examined by our laboratory. Bureau indices negative re Short. Identification record of one Leon William Short being forwarded to Los Angeles and Sacramento under separate cover., which list numerous arrests from 2-3-68 to 9-29-68.

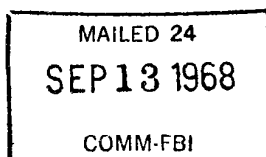

SUBJECT: MURKIN

This is the case involving the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

On September 1, 1968, William Bradford Huie, author, whose books included "Three Lives for Mississippi," dealing with the murder of three Civil Rights workers in June of 1964, was contacted by our Birmingham Agents at his home in Hartselle, Alabama, upon his request. Huie requested that the interview be kept in confidence for reasons depicted in the information furnished.

Huie stated that while James Earl Ray was incarcerated in London, England, he (Huie) entered into a contract with Ray to write the true account of Ray's activities and background concerning the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. This contract is also of interest to Ray's attorney, Arthur Hanes, inasmuch as the cost of the trial, including attorney fees, is dependent upon the commercial success of the contract. Huie has advised that to date he has invested approximately \$20,000 in this venture. Huie further relates he is in constant contact with subject Ray through Attorney Hanes in the form of written questions and answers by Ray, which includes names of cities, states, places, maps and individuals contacted by Ray, as well as activities from the date of his escape from prison to his apprehension in England.

Huie stated that to date he has been refused personal contact with Ray by Judge W. Preston Battle, the judge who will handle the trial, state of Tennessee. He stated that he is highly desirous in obtaining current non-publicized photographs of Ray which would be the character type rather than the mug shots.

Huie stated he would be most willing to divulge all information he has received to date to the Bureau on a confidential basis, as well as all information he may receive in the future on a current basis, provided the requests could be met.

Rosen to DeLoach memorandum

RE: MURKIN

Mr. Huie advised that the Bureau is not attempting to influence, interfere, or suggest action taken by state officials or courts.

We are running out information in Huie's possession developed through sources, regarding previously unknown activities of Ray between the time of his escape in April, 1967, and his apprehension on June 8, 1968. The Department has been alerted to Huie's contemplated "Look" story on Ray and has under consideration the question of obtaining a search warrant or subpoena duces tecum for his notes and/or calling Huie before a Federal Grand Jury. If Department declines to take any action on this information, we will furnish the information to the appropriate local authorities. This is being followed closely with the Department.

ACTION:

It is recommended that the request of Huie not be honored, and that Birmingham be instructed that under no circumstances should they "bargain" with him. It is further recommended that this new information be provided to the Department and authority be requested to furnish this information to appropriate local authorities. Attached for approval is a letter to the Department incorporating therein the results of contact with Huie as set forth in this memorandum, and requesting Department's decision on a matter previously discussed with them.
