Investigation set forth below was conducted to identify subscribers to telephones to which calls were made from Texas during the period December 15-17, 1967.

Telephone Number 12-27 Sabinas, Coahuila, Mexico December 16, 1967

On June 28, 1968, a confidential source abroad advised that it had been determined that the above number belongs to Mr. BENITO VELEZ MADRID, 63 years of age, who lives with his wife, MARIA RODRIGUEZ de VELEZ, at Avenida Juarez Norte 722 in Sabinas, Coahuila, They have three sons living in the United States. One is BENITO VELEZ RODRIGUEZ who lives at Carrizo Springs, Texas; the others, FRANCISCO VELEZ RODRIGUEZ and MARIO VELEZ RODRIGUEZ live in San Antonio, Texas at 2107 West Commercial Street. Also residing at this latter address is GUSTAVO GUTIERREZ, a son-in-law of BENITO VELEZ.

The source said that the Chief of Police in Nueva Rosita, Coahuila, Mr. XICOTENCATL FLORES, and the Chief of Police in Sabinas, Coahuila, Mr. RAMIRO CARDENAS, both stated that BENITO VELEZ and his family are very well regarded business people in the area. None of them have criminal records. The communities of Sabinas and Nueva Rosita are neighboring towns and, according to these police officials, the VELEZ family is well known in both communities.

On June 28, 1968, the confidential source abroad stated that the above number is listed to PERFECTO LARA ZAMORA and his son, JOSE de JESUS LARA GALVAN. They live at Number 2550, Colonia Zaragoza, Nueva Rosita, Coahuila, It was determined that the son, JOSE de JESUS LARA was married in May of 1968 to VIRGINIA VARA VARGAS who lived at 539 F.T. Clarke in Uvalde, Texas.

Both Police Chief FLORES of Nueva Rosita and Chief CARDENAS of Sabinas, Coahuila, advised the source that neither PERFECTO LARA ZAMORA or any of his relatives have any criminal record in those communities.

Telephone Number 42-70-56 Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico December 15 and 16, 1967

On June 13, 1968, a second confidential source abroad, advised that the above number is listed to RAMIRO IBARRA WARTINEZ whose address is Martin de Zavala Sur 224 in Monterrey, Nuevo Leon. It was determined by the source that IBARRA works in San Antonio, Texas in a clothing store called "Sugarman's" and, while staying in San Antonio, lives at 115 South Alazan Street. IBARRA visits Monterrey very infrequently and, when he does come to Monterrey, usually only stays over the week end. The source advised that other residents of this neighborhood stated that IBARRA is a tailor in the clothing store in San Antonio.

Telephone Number 46-85-15 Mexico, D.F. December 17, 1967

On July 18, 1968, a third confidential source abroad advised that the above number is listed to the Carniceria America, Cipris 11-2 in Mexico City. On June 24, 1968, JESUS GUEVARA VALDEZ, Manager of this concern, stated that the firm buys meat in very large

quantities from the border area of Texas, as well as in Mexico. He said that often they receive unsolicited telephone calls from a buyer in a travel status who advises them concerning livestock available for sale. He stated that his employer, GUSTAVO HERNANDEZ ZARATE, handles all long distance calls pertaining to the purchase of livestock and that he, GUEVARA, knew nothing about a call received at this number on December 17, 1967. He said Mr. HERNANDEZ was out of town at that time.

On July 11, 1968, GUEVARA stated that HERNANDEZ had been told that an inquiry was made concerning the call received on December 17, 1967, and stated he did not know what it was about. Periodic efforts by the source to contact HERNANDEZ at this address have been unsuccessful.

On October 4, 1968, the third source advised that another attempt had been made on that date to contact GUSTAVO HERNANDEZ at the Carniceria America but that HERNANDEZ was again out of the city, traveling on business.

At 9:00 AM on 10/17/68, Inspector CARL DOEY, RCMP, Toronto, Ontario, Canada, was contacted and informed that Misters DWYER, BEASLEY and CARLISLE were scheduled to arrive at the Toronto International Airport at 1:57 PM, 10/17/68. At the same time, Inspector DOEY was informed of the respective positions of these men.

Inspector DOEY indicated that he had already received instructions from Ottawa as to the impending arrival of these men in Toronto and the purpose of their trip, but that their specific arrival time had not previously been furnished to him. He added that he was assigning Corporal JOHN DUNLOP of the RCMP, who participated in the original investigation of RAY's activities in Toronto, to "look after" these representatives of the State of Tennessee.

At 2:08 PM, 10/17/68, Misters DWYER, BEASLEY and CARLISLE were met at the ramp of the Toronto International Airport by SA JAMES P. MC MARON of the Buffalo office and Corporal DUNLOP of the RCMP as they alighted from their plane. Their passage through Canadian immigration and customs was facilitated by Corporal DUNLOP and they were thereafter driven to Headquarters of the RCMP in Toronto in an RGME car by Corporal DUNLOP. During the brief discussion at the airport, DWYER, BEASLEY and CARLISLE expressed their appreciation for the cooperation of the FMI, pointing out that they "don't know what they would have done if it were not for the Bureau."

at that same time; it was pointed out to these gentlemen that the possibility of arranging all of the interviews which they indicated they desired while in Toronto would be extremely unlikely in the one full day which they have allocated for their stay in Toronto particularly since at least two of the interviews, those of the two landladies at the residences in Toronto at which RAY had stayed required the services of a Chinese and Polish interpreter. Despite this, they insisted they were sommitted to adhere to their original schedule and that they would have to accomplish as much as they could during the time they had allocated for Toronto.

Arrangements were made with Corporal BUNLOP for him to notify the Buffalo Office just as soon as the men from Tennessee "firmed up" their plans for departure from Toronto for Montreal.


