PERNELL EZZELL was interviewed at the Shreveport, Louisiana, Resident Agency. At the outset of the interview EZZELL was advised of his rights but declined to sign a waiver of same. EZZELL declined to furnish a signed statement but voluntarily furnished the following information:

EZZELL denied that he had received or was ever in possession of a great amount of money as a result of his participation in the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING and the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. He further denied stating to anyone he was on the payroll of the OSI and CIA.

EZZELL said he definately did not participate in any manner, nor did he have any knowledge of or information concerning the murders of MARTIN LUTHER KING and Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

EZZELL admitted that he was glad KING was dead as he felt KING was a troblemaker, but emphasized that he did not have anything to do with killing him.

EZZELL said he could not remember making any statements to anyone regarding any of the above. He admitted that he may have made them when he was in a drunken condition, but could not recall making any such statements. He said he often has black-out periods which occur when he is drinking and he has been known to appear sober even when he is in a drunken state.

EZZELL said FRANK WETZEL is the Shop Foreman for his former employer at Perdue Radio and Television Company, Orlando, Florida. He and Wetzel have been out drinking together on a few occasions, usually after closing shop or on a payday night. WETZEL has been trying to get him into trouble with his wife. EZZELL said WETZEL thinks he is a ladies man and has in the past tried to take his wife out. His wife has told him that WETZEL has called her several times and in addition to trying to make a date would tell her of his running around with other women. EZZELL believed WETZEL tells his (EZZELL's) wife what he tells WETZEL in confidence. He was sure WETZEL told her about

his being responsible for another girl's pregnancy at the time he married his wife.

EZZELL stated he has never confronted WETZEL with any of the above, but WETZEL has told him that he called him one night when he was drunk and cursed him out. EZZELL said he could not remember this call.

EZZELL advised that he has a serious drinking problem, but he did not consider himself an alcoholic. He said he was treated in the Veterans Administration Hospital, Fayetteville, North Carolina, for drunkeness shortly after his release from the Air Force in 1953. He further advised he had been a patient at Cherry Hospital, Goldsboro, North Carolina, for about 2 months during the past year. While at this hospital he underwent a number of psychiatric tests. He did not know the results of the tests.

EZZELL stated that he has had this serious drinking problem since his marriage in November 1967. He indicated he was forced to marry his wife as a result of her pregnancy prior to their wedding. He said, since his marriage he has been under constant pressure from his wife and in addition has serious financial problems.

EZZELL advised that because of his heavy drinking and the resulting "black-outs" he is not able to fix exactly his whereabouts on specific dates during the past year. However, he remembered the night of MARTIN LUTHER KING's death and said he was drunk at the time. He was registered at the Motel South, Orlando, Florida. With him at the time was a girl friend, whom he identified as VIOLET ALLRED, a nurse, who operates the Clear Lake Manor Nursing Home, Orlando, Florida. He said she is about 38 years of age. He recalled hearing of KING's death on the T.V. on the night it happened.

EZZELL said he did not remember where he was the night Senator KENNEDY was shot.

EZZELL could not account for his whereabouts on the night of June 5, 1968 and said he could not recall where he was at all during the month of June as he again was on a drunk.

EZZELL remembers flying from Orlando, Florida,

to Los Angeles twice in recent months. The last was about August 4, 1968 when he flew via Delta Airlines. He stayed in Los Angeles four days and left driving a rented car after an unsuccessful effort in finding a job. On his way to Shreveport he stopped briefly at Phoenix, Albuquerque, and Hope, Arkansas. He claimed he pawned his 357 magnum revolver with a police officer in Hope, Arkansas, for \$45 on August 23, 1968. The gun was purchased for his second job as a security guard with Associated Security Company, Orlando, Florida. He claims he has never used the gun in commission of a crime.

EZZELL believed the previous trip to Los Angeles was made in June 1968 when he flew via Delta Airlines from Orlando, Florida. He was looking for a job on the occasion also. He stayed only two days and remembers returning from California via an unrecalled airline and that he stopped at Las Vegas, Denver, New Orleans and Miami. He does not remember if he stayed in any of these cities for any length of time. After reaching Miami he rented a car and drove to Orlando.

jobs in Orlando and that he financed his trips with the money earned from working these two jobs, along with using his credit cards.

EZZELL recalled after driving from Miami he did not go home, but to a motel with Miss ALLRED. The following day he drove back to Miami and then returned to Orlando by bus. He thinks he rented the car at Miami from either Hertz or Avis-Rent-A-Car.

EZZELL stated he has not worked any where since August 4, 1968, and that he presently had in his possession \$36.00 which was left over from the sale of his gun.

EZZELL claimed he pawned a .38 Colt "Cobra" in Los Angeles on the last trip at an unrecalled pawn shop and that he presently has no weapon.

EZZELL could not recall any other details concerning his first trip to Los Angeles, he said he was drinking heavy on these trips and could not remember anything much about them. He could not remember the names of motels where he stayed. He claimed he has no friends in Los Angeles and

that he made none while there on these trips.

EZZELL stated he is not now and never has been a member of any "hate" type organization such as the Ku Klux Klan.

EZZELL stated he would be leaving Shreveport, Louisiana, this evening by bus and could be reached through his mother Mrs. ACRIE EZZELL, Route 4, Clinton, North Carolina.

Further, said order of July 30, 1968 contained the following paragraph:

"All persons or entities subject to this Order who feel aggrieved by anything herein contained are hereby admonished that any such grievances or complaints should be judicially presented."

That there appeared in the Commercial Appeal, a newspaper of general circulation in Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee, under date of Wednesday morning, October 16, 1968, an article under the heading: "Lecture By FBI Agent Angers Ray's Attorney", the one in which George Bonebrake, an FBI fingerprint specialist, is quoted. A copy of said item is attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and made a part of this petition.

That under date of Wednesday, October 16, 1968, there appeared in the Memphis Press Scimitar, a newspaper of general circulation in Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee, an item entitled: "Hanes Denounces Court Group as 'Hypocrites'", in which said George Bonebrake is again quoted. A copy of said item is likewise attached hereto as "Exhibit B" and made a part of this petition.

That there appeared in the Commercial Appeal under date of Thursday, October 17, 1968, under the heading: "Hanes Resumes Verbal Onslaught", an item which again quoted the said George Bonebrake. A copy of said item is attached hereto as "Exhibit C" and made a part of this petition.

That your petitioners believe that the said George Bonebrake is a resident citizen of Washington, D. C., and is not amenable at this time to the processes of this Court, but that your petitioners respectfully recommend to the Court that should their

prayer for the issuance of a <u>Scire Facias</u> for a show cause order as hereinafter set out be granted by this Honorable Court against the said George Bonebrake, that a copy of this petition be mailed to the Honorable Ramsey Clark, the Attorney General of the United States, Department of Justice, by whom your petitioners believe said George Bonebrake is employed, requesting the said George Bonebrake to submit himself voluntarily to the jurisdiction of this Court so that a fair and proper hearing may be held. That, in the event said voluntary submission is not forthcoming, your petitioners recommend that this Court issue said processes at such time that said George Bonebrake shall come into and be within the jurisdiction of this Court.

That your petitioners believe the respondent herein named, George Bonebrake, had actual knowledge of the aforesaid orders, decrees and injunctions issued by this Court.

Petitioners aver, therefore, that there is strong cause to believe that respondent, George Bonebrake, is in contempt of the orders and injunctions of this Court by reason of the aforesaid articles and acts as alleged and that he should be cited to appear and show cause, if any he has, why he should not be held in contempt of this Court.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, PETITIONERS PRAYS

- 1. That proper process issue demanding George Bonebrake to appear before this Honorable Court and show cause, if any he has, why he should not be adjudged in contempt of this Court and its orders and, upon the hearing of said cause, the Court enter such other orders as may be proper in the premises.
- 2. For such other and further relief as the Court may feel right and proper under the circumstances.

# Two-Month 'Missing Link' Reported In Ray Activity

CHICAGO, Oct. 23. — (AP) — James Earl Ray, charged with the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., worked in a north suburban restaurant for two months in early 1967, the Chicago Tribune said Wednesday in a copyrighted article.

The articles, in Thursday morning editions, said that Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Klingeman, owners of the Indian Trail Restaurant in suburban Winnetka, hired Ray as a dishwasher shortly after his escape April 3, 1967, from the Missouri State Prison in Jefferson City.

They found their employe, who gave the name of John L. Rayns, so efficient that they raised his salary from \$103 to \$117.50 a week, Mrs. Klingeman told the Tribune.

However, she said that Ray seemed preoccupied, received several phone calls a week, and—the day before he quit—received a strange, unidentified visitor at the back door.

The Klingemans were unaware that John L. Rayns was really James Earl Ray until mid-August, when a writer, (William Bradford Huie) commissioned by Ray to write his life story, contacted them.

They then informed the FBI. Recalling Ray's record as her employe, Mrs. Klingeman said: "I'm sure there's good in him. I've hired at least 1,000 employes over the last 35 years and thought myself a good judge of people."

The day after the mysterious visitor appeared at the back door, Ray failed to come to work. One day later, the Klingemans got a letter from "Rayns," postmarked Quincy, Ill., asking that they forward his back pay to a Winnetka post office box.

He said that he was taking a job on a ship.

Later, the FBI located Ray's brother, Jerome, 32, working as a groundskeeper at a country club near the restaurant.

On October 24, 1968, W. Preston Battle, Judge of the Criminal Court, Shelby County, Tennessee, signed a petition requiring that George Bonebrake, a latent fingerprint examiner of this Bureau, appear before the Court December 6, 1968, to show cause why he should not be held in contempt of the Court. In accordance with your telephonic request of October 25, 1968, pertinent facts concerning this matter are set out below.

Mr. Bonebrake conducted an advanced latent fingerprint police school during the five-day period September 9 through 13, 1968, at Wichita, Kansas. This school was sponsored by the Wichita Police Department and seventeen officers from the Wichita Police Department and eight departments in the immediate area attended. This was a closed school for law enforcement officers and representatives of the press and public were not permitted. Mr. Bonebrake has advised that on one occasion during the class, at the instigation of the sponsored police department, members of the press were briefly invited during a recess period to take photographs and to collect data for a local press story on this school. One member of the class who seemed friendly with the reporter mentioned that Mr. Bonebrake had been the fingerprint expert who had given testimony in London. The reporter commented to Mr. Bonebrake that he thought he recalled Bonebrake's name. No further questions were asked and no other information was volunteered by Mr. Bonebrake.

Mr. Bonebrake presented expert testimony on June 27, 1968, in London, England, in connection with the extradition of James Earl Ray. He testified that three latent fingerprints developed in this case, the fingerprints of James Earl Ray taken by the Los Angeles Police Department, fingerprints of James Earl Ray taken by the Missouri State Penitentiary, and fingerprints of the subject of the extradition hearing taken by Scotland Yard, were fingerprints of one and the same individual. Such testimony thus became public source information and has since been quoted extensively in news media throughout the world.

#### DETAILS:

This is the case involving the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

U. S. Attorney Thomas L. Robinson, Memphis, contacted our Memphis Office and advised a Mr. Brown from the Department of Justice contacted him and informed him he received information from a newspaper source in Washington, D. C. that Judge W Preston Battle, Criminal Court, Memphis, Tennessee, had cited or planned to cite an FBI employee who commented on the Martin Luther King assassination case. Mr. Brown indicated to Robinson that something may be sent to the Attorney General regarding this matter.

SAC, Memphis, referred Robinson to Mr. Don Owens, former FBI Agent, who is one of seven attorneys who are acting on behalf of Judge Battle in preparing various petitions to determine if Judge Battle's court order regarding restrictions of publicity and comments about this case have been violated.

Mr. Owens informed us that his committee met to determine, among other things, if the comments by Latent Fingerprint Examiner, George Bonebrake, at a police school in Wichita, Kansas, were in violation of the Judge's court order It is to be noted that a recent article appeared in a Memphis newspaper citing a story printed by the Wichita, Kansas, "Beacon" newspaper covering a police school that Bonebrake conducted in Wichita in early September, 1968. During this class, members attempted to query Bonebrake as to details of his fingerprint testimony and Bonebrake gave no facts other than that which had already been covered in the press concerning his London testimony. No members of the press were present at this police class. The committee is presenting Judge Battle with a petition concerning their firdings relative to the comments of Bonebrake, which states that Bonebrake may be in violation of the Judge's court order and the petition points out the court does not have jurisdiction in Washington, D.C. which is given as alleged residence of Bonebrake.

Mr. Owens advised that although the petition is prepared it may never be filed, and to him there does not appear to be any problem in that statements attributed to Bonebrake appear to be those to which he already testified publicly in Lendon.

This matter has been brought to the attention of the Bureau previously and administrative action was taken against Bonebrake. Mr. Phil M. Canale, Jr., State Attorney General, Shelby County, Memphis, Tennessee, advised he is aware of this entire matter, is not concerned in the least and is of the opinion this will not affect his handling of the prosecution.

Mr. Phil M. Canale, Jr., State Attorney General, Shelby County, Memphis, Tennessee, who is handling the State's prosecution of James Earl Ray, has contacted our Memphis Office and requested that all physical evidence pertaining to the James Earl Ray case now in possession of the Bureau be forwarded to his office.

On September 16, 1968, Mr. D. Mobert Owen of your Division authorized turning over to Memphis authorities the 1966 Mustang automobile, and Memphis authorities took possession of this car on September 24, 1968. This discussion with Mr. Owen was confirmed by letter dated September 19, 1968.

Mr. Owen on October 24, 1968, advised Special Agent Richard E. Long he had discussed with Mr. Canale the turning over of all evidence to him and as a result thereof, we should comply with the current request of Mr. Canale. We are, therefore, turning over to Mr. Canale all evidence in this case presently in the Bureau's possession. In accordance with Mr. Owen's request, an Agent of our Memphis Office will obtain the remaining evidence from our Laboratory and turn it over to Mr. Canale as this will minimize the testimony required for the chain of evidence.
