Earl Dowdy "Detroit News" city desk advised he received anonymous telephone call from a female who stated that James Earl Ray did not murder Martin Luther King, Jr., but that one Clifford Greeves is the person who killed Martin Luther King, Jr. According to the anonymous caller, Greeves bears a very strong resemblance to Ray and Greeves resides at 11057 Margate Hall Drive, Bridgeton, Missouri, and is employed by the Pepsi Cola Company at St. Louis, Missouri. Dowdy stated the caller sounded rational and she refused to disclose her identity.

Gaines, home address, 2006 Arena Place, Nashville, Tennessee, telephonically contacted the Bureau 7:10 a. m., 1/28/69, and stated he is presently located at 1056 College Street, Apartment 10, Memphis, Tennessee, and he is engaged in investigating the death of Martin Luther King. Gaines stated that he was a Negro but in his investigation he had concluded that no white man had killed King. He states he had taken a number of pictures and had other evidence that would bear out his conclusions.

Gaines stated he is presently employed by the Mahalia Jackson Chicken System, headquarters 705 South Parkway, East Memphis, that store is located at 691 South Parkway, East Memphis. He currently drives a Ford Mustang automobile.

It is noted that when Gaines first contacted the Bureau operator he made a threat that he would kill the president; however, upon talking to the Bureau Supervisor, specified he stated he only made this threat so that he would get to talk to someone.

Upon receipt notify local Secret Service of Gaines threat against the president. Secret Service Headquarters at Washington has been notified. Contact Gaines immediately and obtain full details of any information he may have concerning the shooting of Martin Luther King and advise Bureau results.

I interviewed Morton, an inmate of this institution on Tuesday, December 31, 1968 (p.m.). Morton's interview consisted of information concerning the killing of Martin Luther King by suspect (Missouri Penitentiary Escapee, Ray). Morton states to me that he has received his information from numerous conversations he has had with an unnamed inmate of this institution. This inmate X was a friend of Ray's in Jefferson City Penitentiary, as good a friend as Ray had. (As my informant understands Ray did not have many close friends). This inmate X was supposed to have been separated from Ray in the Missouri Penitentiary yard several times by a Custodial Lieutenant by the name of Holt who is now employed at the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth as Custodial Officer. As inmate X stated, Ray had an escape record and so did he from Illinois and the institution watched them. My informant stated that Ray stated to inmate X he was figuring on trying to escape and inmate X agreed to go with him. Their plan was to saw the bars in I Building basement and some way go through to a water main or sewer outside the walls and during the process of making arrangement, inmate X wanted to know what they were going to do after they got out, where they were going to get money and hole up. Ray didn't tell him at first and later on he told inmate X that they wouldn't have to worry about a thing especially money as they would have a world of money and would be taken care of. Then I understand Ray told inmate X that he was going to kill Martin Luther King and everything was taken care of. Upon learning this, inmate X stated he did not want anything to do with this and then backed out escaping with Ray. Although Ray did not use the method that they were going to use. Inmate X is fairly certain he knows how he escaped. My informant stated that the bars in the basement of I Building are supposed to be cut and water or sewer line is supposed to run along the outside wall, also, a circle band saw blade was supposed to be stolen and that was what was used to saw the bars of basement of I Building. Ray's brother came to visit him just about a week before he escaped. These were just some points to check to see how much truth in the story. My informant stated he would talk to a FBI Agent but doesn't want to be drawn into the deal but will talk to an agent under the pretext of something to do with his federal time, legal action in court or anything to throw off suspicion and wants any information that might point to inmate X to show up from in-

vestigation on the outside as he stated inmate X said the reason he has not said anything before now, was because he was afraid of getting his throat cut. My informant stated he is afraid of something happening to him if information indicated my informant put inmate X on the spot. After talking to informant at some length he doesn't appear to be a psycho but he has some previous time.

Referenced communication incorporated an interview with one Wilbur O. Morton who is incarcerated at the Kansas State Penitentiary. Morton advised that a person who he refuses to identify allegedly has information concerning James Earl Ray and the killing of Martin Luther King, Jr.

When the Agents "bluntly" asked Morton what he wanted for information which he possesses, he indicated that he desired the Agents' intercede with the local Judge on the local charge against him. Morton was then advised that his proposal would be brought to the Agents' supervisor's attention and if additional facts were desired, Morton would be recontacted.

It is incumbent upon you to insure that Morton fully understands that the FBI cannot be a bargaining agent between him and any tribunal nor can the FBI act as an intermediary between Morton and any other individual in such a matter as this. The Bureau should not be put in a position for any individual to be able to state at a later date that such a proposal was taken under consideration by the Bureau.

You should keep the Bureau fully advised of contacts made with Warden Crouse regarding his further interviews with inmate Morton.

The Agents advised that they would bring this information to their supervisor's ATTENTION.

The purpose of this communication is to instruct Kansas City to insure that the Bureau is not to be put in a position of being a bargaining agent and to leave no doubt in Morton's mind that we cannot intercede in the sentence that he is serving.

69 in connection with a local armed robbery charge, volunteered on 1/14/68 he was previously confined in Missouri State Penitentiary Jefferson City, Missouri, at the same time an inmate -- he declined to name -- was a guest of the State of Missouri. The unidentified inmate, according to MORTON, was very friendly with JAMES EARL RAY, accused killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING. During time MORTON and the unidentified convict were in MSP, MORTON was able to learn from this convict that RAY had planned an escape for some time and confided to the convict that RAY had made arrangements for lots of money after the escape and inferred he would get it in return for killing KING. MORTON acknowledged he had no first hand information concerning the threats of RAY or his plan for escape. He was hesitant to identify his convict friend in MSP claiming he feared for his life if an Agent approached the convict with the allegation MORTON had put the "con" on the spot.

When bluntly asked what MORTON wanted for the information he possessed, he agreed he was interested in a trade, and would reveal the name of the convict who reportedly had first hand information of these pertinent developments if Agent would approach the local judge in Wichita who is about to hear MORTON's charge of Armed Robbery, and arrange to have these charges dismissed. He explained this would preclude his having to return to the pen and thus decrease his chances of being harmed for furnishing information about his buddy.

MORTON was informed his proposal would be reported to Agent's supervisor and if additional facts were desired, he would be contacted.

Reverend James Bevel, an official of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, appeared on a television program in Philadelphia on January 19, 1969, and stated he has evidence that James Earl Ray did not kill Martin Luther King, Jr. He refused to divulge the evidence to the television interviewer, but said he had offered to defend Ray in court although he was not a licensed attorney.

Reverend James Bevel was interviewed at his residence in Philadelphia on January 21, 1969. He stated he was extremely busy as he had appointments through 11 p. m. He stated that he had proof of the innocence of James Earl Ray and since the FBI was the prosecutor and he was involved with the defense, he felt he should not furnish the information. It was pointed out to him that the FBI did not prosecute anyone but always made every effort to obtain all facts available in matters of investigative interest to this Bureau. He stated he sent a telegram to Ray on Saturday, January 18, 1969, and as yet had received no answer. He stated he plans to call Percy Foreman, attorney for Ray, and offer his services. He stated he would contact our Agents and advise if Mr. Foreman has accepted his offer. Reverend James Bevel stated if Mr. Foreman does not accept his offer, he plans to drop the entire matter as he feels he has no moral obligation toward James Earl Ray to produce his evidence of Ray's innocence if his offer of help is refused.

Article appearing the "The Washington Post" on 1-29-69, in part states that the head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) Reverend Ralph David Abernathy inferred that a conspiracy exists in the Martin Luther King, Jr. assassination. According to the information coming from the press conference, Abernathy claims that Negro leaders in Memphis believe that persons other than James Earl Ray were aware of the plan to kill Martin Luther King, Jr. The article further states that Abernathy said the information was second-hand and he could not vouch for its validity.

We are instructing Atlanta (Headquarters of SCLC) to interview Abernathy for details of information and to completely resolve. We previously interviewed Abernathy in Memphis, Tennessee, in April of 1968, and at that time he did not indicate that a conspiracy existed.

Reverend JAMES BEVEL was interviewed for ten minutes at his residence. He stated he was extremely busy as he had appointments through 11:00 p.m. that day. While the interview was in progress, a woman asked BEVEL if he could speak to a member of the press. BEVEL told her to tell the person on the telephone he was tied up until 11:00 p.m.

BEVEL stated he had proof of the innocence of JAMES EARL RAY in connection with the murder of his good friend Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING. BEVEL referred to KING as one of his closest and dearest friends. BEVEL stated that since the FBI was connected with the prosecution and he was involved with the defense, he felt he should not furnish this information.

It was pointed out to BEVEL that the FBI is an investigative agency and does not prosecute anyone. It was also pointed out to BEVEL that the FBI is as interested in proving a person's innocence as proving a person's guilt. BEVEL was advised the FBI was interested in obtaining and proving all facts possible during any investigation.

BEVEL stated he sent a telegram to RAY on Saturday, January 18, 1969, and as of the date of the interview, he had received no answer to his telegram. BEVEL stated in connection with this he planned to call PERCY FOREMAN, Attorney for RAY on the night of January 21, 1969, and offer his services in connection with RAY's defense.

BEVEL stated he would telephone the contacting agents on January 22, 1969, and advise if FOREMAN accepted his offer. BEVEL stated if FOREMAN does not accept his offer to aid the defense, he, BEVEL, plans to drop the entire matter as he feels he has no moral obligation towards RAY to produce his evidence of RAY's innocence if his offer of help is refused.

It was pointed out to BEVEL that if he had evidence of RAY's innocence, it should be brought to the attention of the court. BEVEL again stated he would do so only if he was allowed to be part of RAY's defense.

BEVEL stated that at the time MARTIN LUTHER KING

On January 22, 1969, Special Agent Edward M. Cole telephonically attempted to contact Reverend Bevel at approximately 2:30 p.m. The person answering stated Reverend Bevel would not return until 5:00 or 6:00 p.m.

On January 21, 1969, a source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised he with others spoke with Bevel concerning Bevel's statement on the innocence of James Earl Ray. This group, including the informant, are considered "militants" by Bevel. During the discussion with Bevel it was pointed out to Bevel that the general feeling of the militants is that Ray was guilty of shooting Reverend King and that Bevel should furnish what evidence he has or keep quiet. ~~E~~

Bevel told this group he has no evidence but that he feels the "system" is killing a man worth nothing while this man actually killed a greater man. Bevel stated that if he is allowed to defend Ray he, Bevel, will bring out everything that the "system" did to cause the death of King. Bevel also stated he feels this is a method to rejuvenate Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) in Philadelphia, as SCLC has fallen off to almost nothing in Philadelphia. In connection with this, Bevel stated he is to receive a check by Western Union from SCLC, Atlanta, for \$500. ~~E~~
